'In the summer of 2006 I came to Wealdstone as Gordon's 1st team Coach, &, as always in my footballing career, Dad came with me. Even in the last 3 weeks of his life in his Carehome the door to his room had his picture on it complete with his Stones scarf & the self same scarf adorned one of the pictures in his room. Dad loved his football & he loved genuine people - which is why I know he felt so at home & happy amongst you all. So, from my perspective, I'd like to thank you from the bottom of my heart for making my Dad (& me) feel so at home here for so many years. A special club with special people. ## STATEMENT FROM RORY FITZGERALD (Intrim Chairman)

**F**ollowing the statement issued on 15th January about the changes to the Executive Board, we want to provide some further details on the future running of the club.

Firstly, there are some inaccuracies within the statement issued by Peter Marsden, we would like to document that the board did invite Peter to attend the emergency board meeting last night, however, Peter declined that invitation. David Hawkins was also invited, however, David chose not to acknowledge or respond to our invitation.

As previously detailed, the decision to replace Peter Marsden as chairman wasn't taken lightly, the decision was taken in the best interests of the Football Club. The executive board have given every opportunity for Peter to work alongside his co-directors and embrace activity within the business. Unfortunately, in the two and half years as chairman, Peter has not only failed to maintain a working relationship with current members of the board and members of previous boards.

The level of investment from Peter Marsden stretches to hundreds of thousand pounds and the club will have generated cumulative losses of close to £750'000.00 across the three financial years ending 31 May 2019.

Peter's contribution both financially and as a director has been a huge boost to the club however a change of leadership was needed to both return the club to a more sustainable footing and to formulate a clear plan on how to progress the club both on and off the pitch.

As announced, I have stepped-up to become Chairman initially on a temporary basis with Mark Randall appointed as my Vice-Chairman. The Board is likely to need further strengthening and re-shaping and announcements will be made as and when they are confirmed.

We are confident we will find the balance between ambition and sustainability; our initial priority is to ensure the club is sufficiently well funded to the end of this season and the Board commit to delivering this outcome. It's imperative that any club lives within its means and Wealdstone FC is no exception. Because of this, in recent weeks we have reduced the current playing budget and believe that any changes can be made around the fringes of the team rather than the spine. If we can meet the goals and have the opportunity to strengthen then we will, however we have a fantastic group of players and management team that should be able to improve our current league standing.

### **Taking the Club Forward**

We believe that Wealdstone Football Club should be the club that the best talent in the area (and beyond) aspires to join. We want

every team playing under the Wealdstone name to feel like an integral part of the club. We want to be a club, not just a first team.

We are evaluating the formation of an under 23's side for next season to establish if this will help from a footballing perspective and how this can co-exist with our well established Under 18's side. We are also discussing the appointment of a director of football to help us build a footballing structure which can attract and develop players and provide a further source of talent for the first team, as well as helping grow Wealdstone Ladies.

We want to continue to invest in our facilities however this investment must be proportionate given the length of the lease we have at the current site.

We want to continue to develop our commercial partnerships and make the club a valued and respected part of the community.

We will continue to speak to people who might be willing to invest in the club or support our progress in whatever way they can. I'm in the process of speaking to potential investors and is anticipated that we will have new commercial relationships which we will be looking to announce in the near future.

We want to maintain our competitive budget like most clubs at our level, we need to use that budget wisely and attract the right profile of player.

We want to improve communications from the Board to help ensure that supporters remain engaged and it feels like we're all pulling in the same direction.

The Board believe that it should be viewed as an honour and a privilege to be a Director of Wealdstone FC and everything we do should be in service of this great club, with its proud history and some of the best fans in non-league football.

Each Board member will have a clear areas of responsibility, we are working on terms of reference for the board, the "Wealdstone Constitution" and an initial five year plan which again will be communicated once the new board have agreed our goals for the next five years.

Rest assured that this Board has ambitions to grow the club and progress to the next level, however this will take time and in football not every club can achieve its goals. What is important is that we don't lose the ambition and energy to keep trying.

Every decision we make will be aimed at giving the club the best chance of being both successful in the short-term but also existing in a meaningful form for future generations.

There will inevitable be decisions that supporters do not fully agree with or understand, and it won't always be possible to share the full context behind some decisions more widely, it is also not possible to make decisions that please everyone.

## Out with the old, in with the new... 2019 has proved a turning point.

**F**ive points from the three games in 2019 isn't a bad return when you consider the sex hebdomades horribillis at the end of 2018. It's Latin, look it up! The win at Slough has already been written about but the last two games, both drawn, could quite easily have seen a full six points on the board.

Our win at Concord this season was said by the management as the best performance under their tenure at the Vale, but weirdly there was little optimism leading up to the game at Biggleswade, certainly in the pub that I was at pre-match. Of those surveyed, all twelve of us, not one thought we'd win. That's quite a critique of the optimism levels of where the club is at the moment.

Against Dartford, we, to quote Kevin Keegan, murdered them. The woodwork was smacked on three occasions, there were a couple off the line and at least two sitters missed, but it needed a calmly taken ninety-second minute equaliser from Eion McKeown to get a share of the points. Dartford knew that they had got away with it.

Whilst the football was important on the day, as it should be, it paled into insignificance to the saying goodbye to two of our own from the terraces. The minute silence was, as expected, immaculately observed, but there were concerns and fears that the "banging out" for Simon Ricketts would be a damp squib as we were kicking towards the Gun Turret End, and the seats, in the second forty-five and not the noise friendly Bulla. There was nothing to be worried about as the "banging out" was beautifully and brilliantly observed, with the slamming of seats, stamping of feet and even the improvised use of kitchen implements (brilliant idea, Mim) that made the traditional send off for those in the print industry quite special.

Concord is never a favourite destination for Wealdstone fans. In fact, many have an unofficial boycott (my excuse was that my tax return seemed a better option) in that they just don't travel. There is even a group that arrange a weekend away when it is Concord away, but this being Trophy weekend, nothing was arranged. Despite this, just shy

of a hundred did make the trip, which is low for us in terms of what we normally take to away matches, but decent for a trip to estuary Essex.

The game saw the caravaners take an early lead and, with a depleted squad that only included three on the bench, many thought that it would be another day of misery on Canvey Island. As the game wore on, Stones grew into the game and David Pratt scored his first goal in six weeks to level before the half time whistle. In the second half Stones were in the ascendancy and like London buses, having scored once, David Pratt netted again with only eight minutes to go. A second win this season on

the island beckoned but Canvey pulled level two minutes later as Stones had to settle

for a point. A point that most would have taken at the start of the game especially with the aforementioned three substitutes on the bench. A club like Wealdstone should never have three on the bench for the game, whatever the reasons. Not with our budget, which is still the second highest we have ever had. As supporters we are not privy to matters of finance, but it seems perfectly logically that, whilst football doesn't work on balanced budgets, you do need to keep to budgets and control costs.

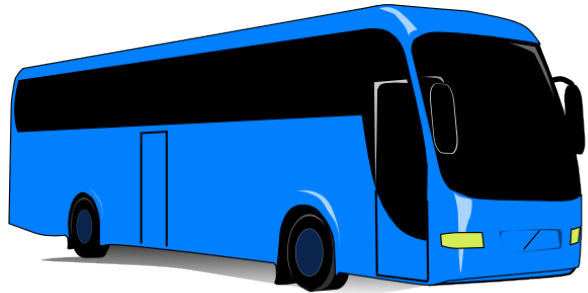

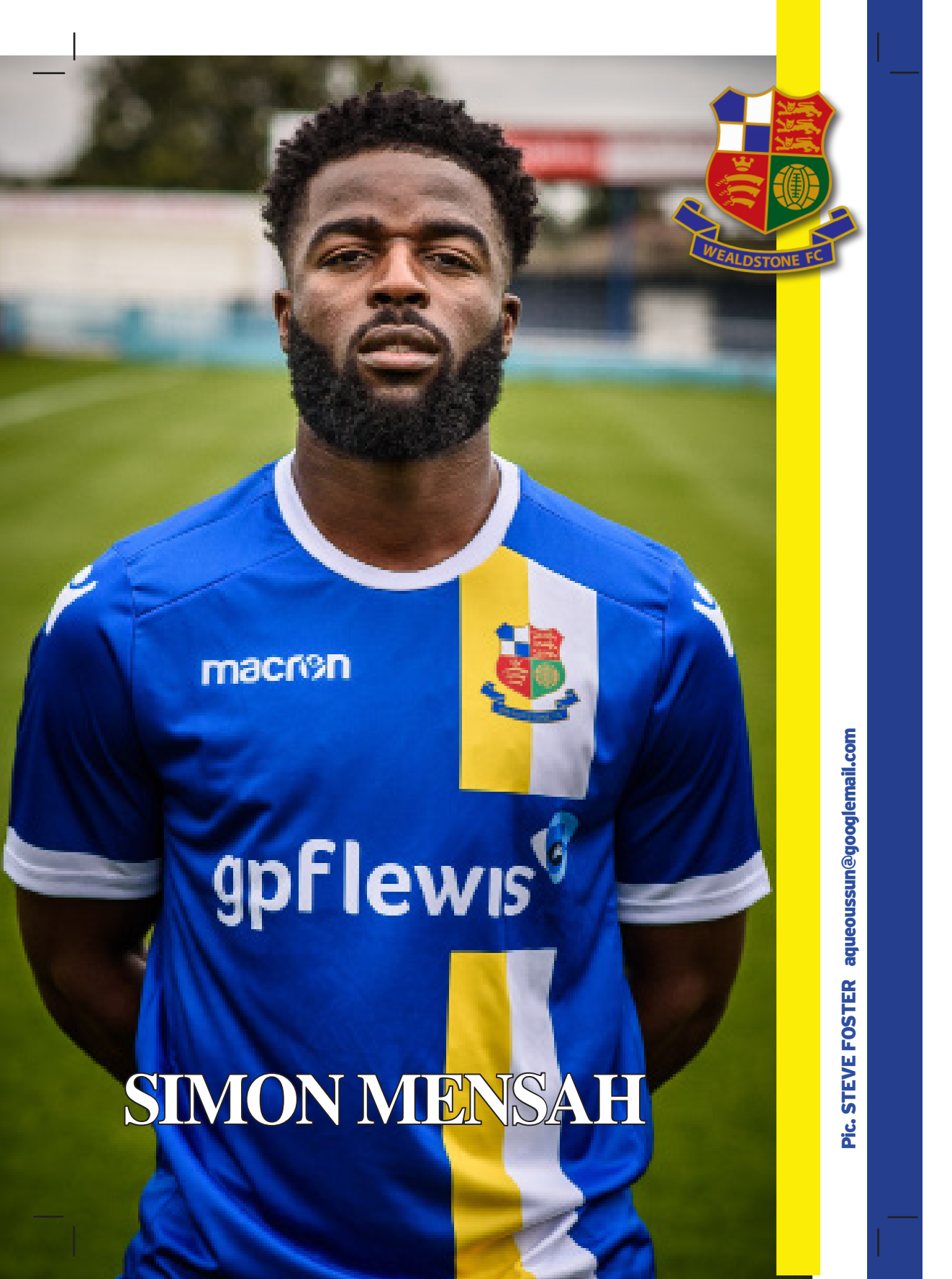

## FIRST HALF

The game began quietly before the home side got quickly into rhythm and scored after 11 minutes courtesy of striker Alex Wall.

A cross swung in from the left hand side by Tyrone Sterling made it simple for Wall to glance his header past Stones 'keeper Jonathan North.

It only took Wealdstone six minutes to respond with a chance of their own. Reece Mitchell passed to Godfrey Poku on the right hand side who crossed – the ball found Colchester loanee Eoin McKeown free at the near post but McKeown could not guide his header towards goal.

Only a minute later, Concord scorer Wall saw his free kick to the left of the penalty box fizz past the far post.

Wealdstone then dominated proceedings for ten minutes and got their reward in the 31st minute. Stones full-back Ramarni Medford-Smith on the left played the ball square into Crawley Town loanee Tarryn Allarakhia who skipped past a Concord player and stormed into the box.

McKeown then took the ball off Allarakhia in the box, quickly cut onto his right foot and shot at Concord goalkeeper Sam Beasant – Beasant saved McKeown's shot but the rebound fell to David Pratt to tuck home his first goal since November.



## SECOND HALF

The second half began similarly to the first but the game sprung into life in the 57th minute when Wall got himself in front of a Connor Stevens clearance and put the Concord scorer through on goal.

Wall sprinted into the box and shot left footed across goal but the finish went wide of North's far post.

McKeown answered with a chance of his own six minutes later as he charged into the box from the left and saw his curling effort saved by Beasant.

The game lacked key chances from both sides in the second half but Wealdstone held their shape well off the ball.

Jeffrey Monakana came off the bench in the 69th minute and made an impact on the left hand side with his pace.

Monakana's impact was crucial in the 82nd minute when he picked up a loose ball from the left hand side and crossed near post finding Pratt for his second.

The Stones looked like they would take all three points away from home but Wall fired in from point-blank range at the back post just two minutes later after latching onto Danny Green's cross from the right hand side.

Concord finished the game stronger and were searching for their first potential winner of the New Year but Wealdstone held on for the draw.

### It's a clap trap, baby

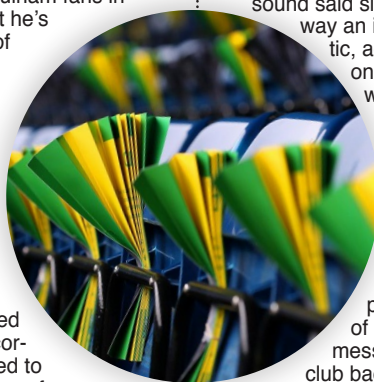
This is where emotion is likely to take me over, so I apologise in advance. Because... agh! These cardboard "fans", known to the

experience; or yours is a club which has decided to buy in to the opposite view, making your decision to shun clappers one which somehow marks you out as more in tune with your fans as more authentic, more old-school, more earthy and real. Not for you this appalling, sterile nonsense.

Crystal Palace, in their advertising of tickets for the visit of Fulham in February, have even added the legend "no clappers allowed" to their promotion of that game, such is the eagles' desire to be seen as down with their self-styled 'ultras'. Last season, Aston Villa also derided Fulham for their clappers ahead of last season's Championship play-off final.

There's a sense that, like half and half scarves, clappers represent the front line in the ongoing battle to defend whatever authentic football support should actually look (and sound) like in 2019. Of course, I'd argue that any search for said authenticity should begin and end at Grosvenor Vale, but that's by the by.

**H**ungerford Town Football Club has come a long way since its formation in 1886. The club first played on Hungerford Marsh field but soon moved to the present ground at Bulpit Lane.

Initially playing at Intermediate level (Newbury & District League and also the Swindon & District League), Senior status was consolidated in the ranks of the Hellenic League in 1958 and in 1961 the club won the Hellenic League Benevolent Cup. After a period of team rebuilding in the 1960's Hungerford won the Division One League and Cup double in the 1970/71 season.

The 1970's were memorable times as the club reached 3 Berks & Bucks Senior Cup Finals in four years losing to Chesham Utd in 1976 and to Slough Town in 1977 (though only after a replay at Elm Park, Reading). The 1977/1978 season, Hungerford's last in the Hellenic League, saw them finish third in the league and win the League Cup. The club also produced a fairy tale run in the FA Vase eventually losing out to Barton Rovers in a semi final replay. These achievements enabled the club to gain election to the Isthmian League in 1978. In addition to the action on the field, the current clubhouse was opened in 1974 and new changing rooms and floodlights were added in 1975.

The 1978/79 season, Hungerford's first season in the Isthmian League, ended with a twelfth place finish in Division 2 and another Berks & Bucks Senior Cup final visit (the third in 4 years - this time it was the mighty Wycombe Wanderers who narrowly won after a replay).

In the next two seasons the club narrowly missed out on promotion finishing in 3rd place each time, though some consolation was gained in 1979 when the club reached the 1st round proper of the FA Cup for the first and only time, losing 3-1 to Slough Town. The same season the FA Vase semi-final was again reached, only to lose this time to Guisborough Town 5-3 on aggregate. 1980/1981 brought more disappointment with another 3rd place finish but there was some consolation when Hungerford Town was invited to compete in the Anglo Italian Semi-Pro tournament.

1982 brought further success when Hungerford defeated Wycombe Wanderers 1-0 to win the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup. Promotion was again narrowly missed in 1984/85. However this was also a turbulent period for the club as, after 9 successful years as manager, Jim Kelman left the club.

1988/89 saw a return to prominence under joint managers Gary Goodwin and David Dodds who guided the club to sixth place in the table and a third FA Vase Semi Final appearance. This time it was Sudbury Town who denied Hungerford its much deserved trip to Wembley. The 1990-1993 seasons saw the club finish 9th, 9th and 10th under Gary Goodwin and later ex Man Utd player, Wilf Tranter, before a dismal start to the 1992/93 season saw the departure of Tranter at Christmas. Former Hungerford goalkeeper Jimmy Greenwood briefly returned to the club as manager and achieved Division 2 safety though he departed 5 months later to rejoin Thatcham Town.

The club then secured the services of two ex players, Gerald Smith and his assistant Norman Matthews from the Hellenic League club, Kintbury Rangers, and the two together

managed to keep the club ticking over in the Isthmian Division 2 for the next two seasons..

1996/97 brought the club its highest finish for several seasons and a Quarter Final Associate Members Cup appearance though in the following year the club narrowly escaped relegation again. The following year former Swindon Town player Don Rogers was appointed as manager and although the club reached the third qualifying round of the FA Cup, the league form was disappointing - Rogers resigned just after the start of the 1999/2000 season to be replaced briefly by Richard Evans who parted company with the club at the start of the 2000/01 season.

Evans was replaced by Gary Ackling who changed the emphasis of the club to looking for local youth talent and produced a strong mid table finish in the 2001/02 season, with help from assistant and long time player Tim North. Unfortunately for the club, the deadline for ground improvements was not met at the end of the 2001/02 season, and a relegation to the newly restructured Isthmian Division 2 followed.

Despite achieving a respectable fifth place finish in the league on top of a great FA Cup run into the third qualifying round, the decision was taken, for the long term benefits to the club, to rejoin the Hellenic League for the 2003/04 season, they finished the season in a creditable sixth place and winning the Hungerford Cup defeating AFC Newbury 2-0.

After a disappointing start to the next season Ackling resigned in October and was replaced by assistant Tim North. The club ended the 2004/05 season by winning the Hellenic League Supplementary Cup by beating Ardley United 3-2 after extra time.

2005/2006 began with the election of Andrew Fitton as Chairman and following a disappointing below mid table finish to the end of the season Tim North resigned and was replaced by Alan Clark

Two seasons of near misses in the league were made up by cup runs in various competitions.

The 2008/2009 season began with the election of a new chairman, Nigel Warrick a

local businessman who stated he wanted to improve the club both on and off the pitch. He immediately set about a refurbishment program for the club including both bars. On the pitch despite a sticky start in the league and a disappointing early exit in the FA Cup, the club went on a 22 match unbeaten run which took the club to the top of the league and after a period where the lead swapped between ourselves and Shortwood United, a last day draw at Hook Norton enabled the club to clinch the Hellenic League championship on goal difference and promotion to the Southern League. There was disappointment for the team in both the Floodlit Cup final where we lost 2-3 after extra time to Marlow United, and also the FA Vase 5th round where we lost 3-4 also after extra time after leading twice in normal time.

2009/2010 saw the team promoted to the Zamaretto League Division One South & West and after an early spell where the team was challenging for a play-off spot, the second part of the season was not so good and the team ended in the bottom third of the league. There was some consolation for the club, when the newly formed Reserve side won the Hellenic League Reserves Division One title and were also runners-up in the Reserves Cup.

2010/2011 began with a new man in charge, Bobby Wilkinson and his coach Michael Gilkes. In the league the club hovered around the play off zone but eventually finishing in 7th place but there was some consolation in the shape of an FA Cup run.

2011/2012 was a landmark year as the club celebrated it's 125th anniversary and despite a great start in the league which saw the side stand at the top until November, we eventually ended up in 5th position. This allowed us to

qualify for the play-offs where we lost 1-2 to Poole Town in the semi-final.

2012/2013 began with disappointing early exits in both the FA Cup and the FA Trophy and indifferent results in the league but a consistent run of results from October took the side to the top of the table where we remained until being overhauled by the eventual champions Poole Town in March and had to make do with the runners-up spot and the dreaded play-offs again. This time there was to be no heartache for the club, as after an excellent semi-final win over Paulton Rovers, we eventually clinched promotion on Bank Holiday Monday beating Merthyr Town 3-1 after extra time. The club also gained more silverware, winning the Basingstoke Senior Cup for the first time beating Fleet Town 3-0

2013/2014 began with the club playing at their highest level ever, the Southern League Premier Division and despite a shaky start the club settled into Premier League life well. The team went on several unbeaten runs including 10 wins on the bounce between March and April which took the club to the edge of the play-off positions, only missing out by a point at the end of the season. The clubs performances were recognised by the Southern League by the winning of 3 team of the month awards during the course of the season. The consolation on missing out on the play-offs was the clubs best ever run in the F.A. Trophy where they reached the last 16 losing to eventual finalists Gosport Borough. The run included wins against the eventual Southern League champions Hemel Hempstead Town (5-0) and runners-up Chesham United (2-0).

In 2014/2015 season the side started slowly and included early exits in the FA Cup and FA Trophy but a strong second half to the season saw the side finish in 4th position and qualified for the Play-Offs. Sadly there was to be no happy ending, losing to eventual winners Truro City (1-0) in the semi-final. There was to be some consolation as the club again won the Basingstoke Senior Cup.

2015/2016 began indifferently with an early FA Cup exit and some inconsistent performances in the League but a change in the second half of the season saw the side make the FA Trophy 2nd round losing to National League side Chester FC (0-4) and better still was the League where we eventually finished in fourth place and qualified

for the play-offs again. The semi-final away to Hitchin Town was dramatic to say the least as the side were 2 down on the hour but came back to win (3-2). The final on a rainy Bank Holiday Monday at home to Leamington FC saw the side trailing at half-time but another great come back saw the team win 2-1 and achieve the target of promotion to the Vanarama National League South.

2016-2017, Hungerford's first in the National League, proved that the team could survive at this level with performances proving better than expected and although at one stage the side was in the play-off positions they eventually finished in 6th position. The team did reach the final of the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup for the first time in 35 years, losing to National League South champions Maidenhead United (0-1).

Last season began with thoughts that the side could improve on their position in the League but before the end of August, long serving manager Bobby Wilkinson resigned along with his entire backroom staff. Senior players Jon Boardman & Ian Herring stepped up to the plate and took on the role as joint managers. Despite getting off to a good start, results were inconsistent, partially due to the worst run of injuries the club had experienced in their modern times. There was further bad news when just after Christmas, chairman Nigel Warrick announced he was taking a back step to concentrate on his business affairs. The club battled on but had to make drastic decisions for the long term benefit of the club, and in February this resulted in Ian Herring being handed sole charge and Jon Boardman and several senior players leaving the club. Results continued to be up and down and it was only a last day victory at East Thurrock United that kept the team in the League.
