NON-LEAGUE NEWS

The non-league F.A. competitions reached the semi-final stages last Saturday. In the second leg of F.A. Vase semi-finals Forest Green of the Hellenic League lost 1-0 at home to Blue Star but go through on aggregate by 4-2. Their Wembley opponents will be Rainworth of the Notts Football Alliance who defeated Barton Rovers 2-1 before a 5,071 crowd after a goalless draw in the first leg. In the first legs of the F.A. Trophy Enfield held their host Northwich Victoria to a goalless draw and must fancy their chances of reaching the final in the second leg at Southbury Road. The remaining Isthmian side, Wycombe Wanderers, were leading Altrincham at Moss Lane with a late goal by Ken Wilson. The Alliance side hit back in the last minute through John Rogers to keep their hopes alive. In the Alliance Premier League A.P. Leamington's hopes of avoiding relegation for the second time were dashed when they lost at Worcester City last week. It is now mathematically impossible for the club to escape from the bottom position - so far in their 38 games they have conceded 100 goals. The other two relegation positions are being contested between Barnet, Dartford, Kettering and Gravesend.

An amendment to the rules in 1955-56 compelled all clubs to take part in the competition — up to that time clubs had the option of entering. Yeovil Town have been the most successful club winning the trophy on four occasions, appearing as finalists on no less than seven times. No club has yet scored a hat trick of wins although Plymouth Argyle won three times in the first four years. Headington United (Oxford United) are the only other club to have won the cup two years running: in 1952-53 over 10,000 people saw each game.

The present Cup, known as the Worcester Vase, is valued at £6,500 was originally a "bowls" trophy and was purchased in 1953 for one hundred guineas (£105). Wimbledon achieved the "double" of league championship and league cup in 1975/76 when they beat Yeovil Town in the final. The current holders, Bedford Town, were knocked out by Aylesbury United in the 3rd Round whilst last year's finalists Bognor Regis Town now play in the Isthmian League. Over the last ten years of the competition the southern based clubs have a slight edge on their northerly rivals having lifted the cup on six occasions.

PRESENTATION

The Southern League Challenge Cup will be presented to the winning team, together with tokens for the players, by the chairman of the Southern League Mr D. J. Setterfield. In the event of the aggregate scores being level at the end of 90 minutes a further period of 30 minutes will be played. Should the scoreline still be level a third match will be played with the choice of ground being made on the toss of a coin.

THE CLUB

Founded in 1889 it was not until 1935 that the club turned professional when they joined the Birmingham Combination. Four years later they had their first taste of Southern League football in the West Section of a restricted war-time competition. It was not until season 1955-56 that the club won their first trophy in the competition — the Southern League Cup — and finished in seventh place in the league. Between 1948-51 they reached the first round proper of the F.A. Cup on three occasions being defeated by a Football League club each time.

In season 1964-65 the club moved to their present Horton Road Stadium and achieved their record attendance against Wimbledon in 1966 when 7,500 packed into the 10,000 capacity ground. In 1979 the club was boosted by an extensive sponsorship programme set up with Westbury Homes — one of the top ten house builders in the country, who are based in nearby Cheltenham. The company has a large sports complex which is used by the team for training.

Last season the "City" reached the semi-finals of the Southern League Cup going out to the eventual winners, Bedford Town, by an aggregate score of 3-2. The first round proper of the F.A. Trophy was reached for the first time whilst in the league they finished in 13th position scoring the most number of goals in the league (82) with Dave Lewis finishing the league's highest goalscorer with 27.

Last season Bobby Campbell was appointed full-time manager and this season under the management of Dave Stallworthy and a full-time staff of three the club operates in a most professional manner with the ultimate aim of bringing League Football to Gloucester. Bobby Campbell has recently left the club and the team's centre-half John Layton has taken over the reins.

THE PLAYERS

In goal for the "City" is 20 year old NICKY CORNWELL who is in his first season with the club. Full-back BOBBY BROWN (32), has had wide experience with Weymouth, Bath City and Minehead and is also in his first season, whilst LINDSAY PARSONS (34), had many years as a full-time professional with both Bristol Rovers and Torquay United, leaving Taunton Town for Gloucester midway through last season. Centre-half JOHN LAYTON (30) was previously with Hereford United, has just recovered from a broken leg and is now player-manager in succession to Bobby Campbell. The club captain, DAVE BRUTON, completes the City defence, aged 29 he is in his first term, having previously played at Bristol City, Swansea City and Newport County (who paid £20,000 for him). JOHN EVANS (30) has been at Horton Road for the past six years and made 49 appearances last season - an attacker who can also play in midfield. ASHLEY GRIFFITHS is the club's most recent signing whilst TERRY PATERSON (26) has been with the club for five years and has seen service with Redditch and Cheltenham. Second leading goalscorer for the past two seasons he is married with two children. IAN DOYLE is aged 23 and was signed from Bristol City midway through last season, MARTIN WHEELER (25) previously played for Bristol Rovers, his home team, and was signed in November from Bath City for a four figure fee. MIKE BURFORD was born in Gloucester and joined from Hereford United 21/2 years ago. DAVE LEWIS is aged 30 and is married with two children. The Club's leading goalscorer last season he made over 400 appearances for Cheltenham and is now in his second term at Gloucester.

THE CITY

A bustling manufacturing centre with a population of over 100,000 Gloucester was once the Roman fortified town of Glevum, for centuries the guardian of the routes into Wales. The opening of a canal in 1827 between Gloucester and Sharpness made the city an important inland port. The cathedral was built in c1350 to commemorate Edward Ill's victory at Crechy in 1344 and its stained glass east window is the largest in the country after York Minster, measuring 72 ft by 38 ft.


