'Stones should have gone in at half-time with a goal advantage, but unfortunately Robin Wainwright was well off target when presented with a chance on the half-hour.

Early in the second half, Cordice eluded his markers but again the vital shot was off target. Although the referee had been in a somewhat benevolent mood throughout, the tough tackling of the visitors eventually earned his disapproval and Lunn received a yellow card for a notably dangerous tackle on Colin Johnson.

Despite the absence of goals, interest remained throughout, and brought a point well and truly earned. 



Ron Pountney (Forward). Signed from the West Midlands club Bilston in January 1975. He was voted "Player of the Year" for season 1978/79. He is a tenacious midfield player who is keen to join the attack. Born Bilston. Height 5ft 6in, weight 9st 13lb.

Mike Stead (Full Back). Signed from Tottenham Hotspur in September 1978, initially on loan. Born at West Ham and as a schoolboy played in the Newham district team. He joined Spurs as an Apprentice in July 1973 and was a member of the Tottenham Hotspur F.A. Youth Cup winning team in Season 1973/74. He was upgraded to a full-time professional in November 1974 and made his Football League debut away to Stoke City in February 1976.
