

Today is the Day our Dream Comes True

This is a very proud day in the life of Wealdstone F.C. as we joyfully set the seal on 75 years of existence by making our debut in the Premier Division of the Southern League. When we turned professional and left the ranks of the Isthmian League three seasons ago, we dreamed of the time when we would gain promotion and take what we always regarded as our rightful place among the 'Big Boys' of the Southern League. Thanks to the magnificent performances of our squad last season (and who will ever forget that magnificent run-in to the Championship when we swept all before us) that day is now with us. What makes it even more pleasurable is the fact that every single player who got us to the Premier Division is still with us, and it is doubtful whether in those 75 years, we have ever had a better team spirit. We are blessed with a squad which has not got one single 'difficult' player among them and they richly deserve to prosper.

We could have had a much easier baptism in the Premier than Weymouth will assuredly provide, but we are delighted to make the acquaintance of their Directors, Players and Supporters, and we know they will find the hospitality of Lower Mead Stadium well up to the standard they have become accustomed to.

We do thank our excellent Supporters for turning up in such numbers to see our practice games against Walthamstow Avenue and Hendon—especially as an hour before the Hendon game the rain came down in buckets and never ceased. It was a highly successful approach to the season, with a 1–0 win over the Avenue, and a 3–0 victory over near neighbours and arch-rivals Hendon on Saturday. Newcomer Terry Evans, with his three goals in two games is soon on target and his understanding with his twin Derek is a delight to watch.

The team proved against Hendon that they are quickly running into the rhythm which proved so compelling in the Southern Section last season and there were times when Hendon must have felt that they had blundered into a hornets' nest. I know our really dyed-in-the-wool Supporters really relished licking Hendon, for we had one or two old scores to settle! We must sympathise, though, with our former Isthmian colleagues for losing several players to Ilford, and one or two of their officials were wishing they had taken the plunge with us and turned professional.

Elsewhere in this programme you will find pen pictures of our Dorset visitors, and you will quickly see that they are a team to be reckoned with. Some shrewd close season signings have been made while they again have the dynamic Alan Beer up front who, like our own George Duck, knows a thing or two about getting goals! Luckily, the groin injury our skipper John McCormick received against Hendon was more painful than serious, and John, like the rest of the team, is rarin' to get to grips with the Premier Division!

I know he won't thank me for it, but it must be said that manager Eddie Presland certainly resumed on the field where he left off last season. As a newcomer to Lower Mead told me: "I can't see how he can drop himself—and what a delight to see such controlled kicking". It must be

Move to 'Go It Alone' Rejected

An extraordinary general meeting of the Southern League on Sunday rejected a proposal that in future, only one club should be allowed to apply for Football League status—thus avoiding the position which now applies, namely that several clubs apply and split the vote. Although the voting was 21-17 in favour of the proposal, it was not sufficient to give the necessary two thirds majority.

The idea was that the club finishing highest in the Premier table should apply, for it was recognised that some clubs have no wish for League football. One of the prime instigators of the proposal was Jimmy Hill, who spoke feelingly at the League's annual dinner in June that Premier clubs ruined their own chances of breaking the 'old pals' act' when five or six applied for the League.

For the record, Wealdstone supported the proposition, for we at Lower Mead Stadium certainly DO eventually want League status.

Which raises an interesting point our chairman, David Martle, has been discussing with me. We, which is the Executive Committee, certainly have ambitious plans and are not content to remain in the Southern League longer than we have to. But what do our Supporters want? We should be interested to hear of your reactions and whether or not you feel we should set our sights on higher things. Put simply, do we want to be a big fish in a small pond, or vice versa? You will all have ideas on what you want for the 'Stones, so we would like to know them. Our chairman, being the type he is, believes it all only worth while if we aim for the stars, and personally is not content to now sit back just because we are in the Premier Division.

Barry Smith. Goalkeeper. Aged 22. Came from Walsall after a spell with Sunderland and Colchester. Played over 40 games for Colchester. When not playing football likes to sketch various Dorset landscapes. Works as store Manager.

Brian Lawrence. Full-back. Joined from Bournemouth. In his second season, having played 70 games last season. Can play in either of the full-back positions, and had quite a following of League scouts watching him last season.

Chris Foote. Defender and Midfield. A new signing from Cambridge Utd. Quiet man of the team. Played in the Cambridge promotion team, season 1972-73.

Tony Hobson. Defender. In his 17th season with the club, is one of the most consistent centre backs in the S.L. Has played over 700 games for Weymouth, and has been the backbone of the team throughout this period.

Ralph Miller. Centre Back. Plays alongside Tony Hebson and is the strong man of the team. Never knows when he is beaten, and in his fourth year with the Club. He has a weight room at home, which keeps him in peak condition throughout the year.

Steve Arnold. Defender-Midfield. Another new signing, joining from Rochdale after spells with Crewe and Liverpool. At one stage of his career Liverpool paid £15,000 to Crewe for his services.

Rodney Adams. Front Runner. In his sixth season with the Club, a very big favourite with the Weymouth fans, and one of the fastest front runners in the S.L. Is known as the team's "quiz king".

Derek Courtney. Front runner. A local player, has come up through the youth teams and has scored some incredible goals in vital games, one of them being after 10 seconds against Maidstone last season. Aged 20.

Brian Owen. Centre-forward. Joined at the end of last season from Hereford, was part of Hereford's cup team, who also played with them in the S.L. Another of the game's "grafters" who is also a very capable finisher.

John Brown. Forward. Joined towards the end of last season, when he was transferred from Yeovil at a bargain price. Very good ball player and also very good in the air.

Alan Beer. Forward. A Welshman in his third season with the Club, and top scorer for two seasons. Has also been "Player of the Year". Scorer of over 20 goals last season, could have been more but for a shoulder injury which kept him out of the game for some weeks. Weymouth turned down a double figure fee for the player.

Graham Williams. Defender. Player-Manager. There is not a lot he has not achieved in football as a player, having represented his country (Wales) during most of his career. Is now hoping to make his mark as a Manager in the game. His whole life is centred round football, and hopes for success with Weymouth to further his career on the management side.
