Arthur Paisley (Goalkeeper)

Played in Quarter- and Semi-Finals in the 1966 Amateur Cup year. Tall and agile. Now works for a well-known West London brewery.

John Ashworth (Centre-Half)

Skipper of 1966 Cup-winning team. England International honours. Showed exceptional ability in the air. Refused numerous offers to join professional clubs. Now lives in Harpenden.

Bernie Bremer (Outside Left)

Fast and tenacious. Gained many representative honours. He and Hughie Lindsay were a very dangerous and effective 'partnership'.

Hugh Lindsay (Inside Left)

One of the most talented players of the 1960's. Possessed a 'cannon-ball' shot. Won over 30 England and Great Britain caps. A schoolteacher, he lives in Teddington.

Viv Evans (Outside Left)

Played over 13 years for Wealdstone. One of the best 'uncapped' players he still holds the record of 45 goals by a winger for Wealdstone. Married with three children and lives in Kingsbury. Still a keen 'Stones supporter.

Matt Farrell

A 'regular' of the 1950/60 era who held the club scoring (Centre Forward) record until it was beaten by George Duck. Also works in that West London Brewery and lives in Rayners Lane.

Ron King (Centre Half) Another of the successful 1960's side. A great competitor and now managing Hampton F.C.

Charlie Townsend (Right Half)

Formed the 'engine room' of the side with Hugh Lindsay. 1966 Cup Final winners medal. Played over 30 games for England and Great Britain. Current reserve team manager of Wealdstone F.C.

George Mowle (Right Back)

A very consistent defender of the 1960's. Always did the 'simple thing' and did it well. Lives in Kenton.

Roger Good (Left Back)

Played in early 1960's. One of the original attacking full backs. Now a very keen squash player. Lives in Rickmansworth.

Dave Richards

(Wing Half)

Another of the successful Wealdstone 1960's side. A very tenacious player who won many representative

honours.

Arthur Peel

(Outside Right)

Fast, determined and skilful. England International honours. Local school teacher, he now lives in South

Harrow.

Roy Gibbons

(Wing Half)

A Wealdstone player of the 1950's who turned in consistent performances. Has a very dry sense of humour.


