Leamington 'keeper is 26 year old Alan Dulleston who signed for us three seasons ago from West Midlands club Bilston F.C., and has proved to be one of the best 'keepers in the Alliance. He married in July last year.

On the left and right at the back are Paul Montgomery and Paul Cooper, 21 year old 'Monty' was signed from Atherstone Town and is a single man who lives in nearby Tamworth.

Paul Cooper, 'Coop', was signed last season from fellow Alliance League club Nuneaton Boro', after having League experience with Grimsby Town. He is 23 years old and also single — but only until October.

The two central defenders are Tom Kilkelly and Alan Jones. Tom signed two seasons ago on his return from South Africa, where he played for Durban City. He has League experience in England, playing for Leicester City and Nottingham Town. A married man who still lives in Leicester and whose wife expects their first child in October.

Non-League News

In the F.A. Vase Final at Wembley last Saturday a crowd of over 12,000 saw Whickham beat West Midlands League Willenhall after extra time. Willenhall took the lead first however with two goals in the opening ten minutes from Don Smith and Paul Stringer. Alan Scott replied for Whickham shortly afterwards and then disaster struck Willenhall when their goalkeeper Steve Newton was injured and had to leave the field. Striker Gary Matthews replaced him but after being beaten by Ron Williamson in the second half he went back into the attack with defender Martin Woodall going in goal. With the scores level at full time the match went into extra time and Whickham's persistent attacks led to the unfortunate Bob Peck putting through his own goal and the F.A. Vase going to their Wearside opponents.

Former Wealdstone players George Duck and Bobby Moss found themselves on the same pitch again last Saturday but on opposing sides. The fixture was the Essex Senior Cup Final which took place at Roots Hall last Saturday between Dagenham and Chelmsford City. A crowd of over 1,000 saw the Daggers take the lead through a penalty but City equalised in the dying seconds of the match and forced a replay to take place on Bank Holiday Monday at Leytonstone and Ilford's ground. Duck's move from Dagenham, who play their last match in the Isthmian League at Sutton today, is still very much in the balance with Hitchin and Harrow Borough amongst the interested clubs, with Harrow the favourites to sign him.

Bobby Moss is currently playing in mid-field for the Southern League side who look likely to finish in a disappointingly low position in the league.

Hillingdon Borough are to make yet another attempt to bring greyhound racing to their Leas Stadium. An application has been made to the GLC for the necessary licence which was refused last time after complaints from residents. If this latest application is turned down the Southern League side say that they will consider a plan to bring speedway racing to Hillingdon which needs no special licence.
