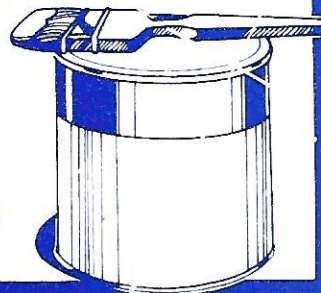

SUPPORTERS CLUB NOTES

Good evening to you all. We extend a warm welcome to the champions of the Midland Division — the players, officials and supporters of Nuneaton Borough. Our visitors finished three points clear of their nearest rivals Alvechurch and thus return to the Alliance after only one years absence. This evening sees the second leg of the Southern League Championship match between the winners of the Southern and Midland divisions. At stake is the Southern League Shield which has been awarded to the winners since the inception of the league in 1894. The runners up of this contest receive a silver cup. With both sides competing in the Alliance next season tonight's match can be viewed as a warm-up for next year.

Our final league match at Addlestone & Weybridge last Bank Holiday Monday was disappointing as we suffered our first away defeat in the league since November last year. However, with leading goalscorer Alan Cordice and his fellow striker Ray Knowles out of action our forward line was below par and although both Robin Wainwright and Paul Waites came close we were unable to reply to Addlestone's second half goal.

Our congratulations goes to Paul Bowgett who was voted Player of the Year by our supporters and received the Jock Law trophy before our game against Ashford Town. Congratulations are also in order to the rest of the championship and league cup winning squad especially to Allen Batsford and his managerial team. During March and April an incredible number of matches were played — 23 in total with only 3 of those resulting in defeats. This gives an indication of the level of fitness and discipline present in the squad which never lost sight of the path back to the Alliance.

Tonight sees the last chance for you to visit the club shop this season — you can pick up some programmes and souvenirs to see you through the close season. Our thanks goes to all those of you who have supported our fundraising activities this season whether in the club shop, tea-hut or coach service. Incidentally our jumble sale last Saturday raised £40, the elements keeping up their three year record of sending us a monsoon bang on time! We are grateful for all the jumble donated and bought back.

To celebrate our return to the Alliance and our winning of the "double" in the Southern League a special souvenir edition of "Long Ball Down the Middle" will be issued at the beginning of next season. Back to this evening and our 75th match of the season — let's end it on a singing and winning note.

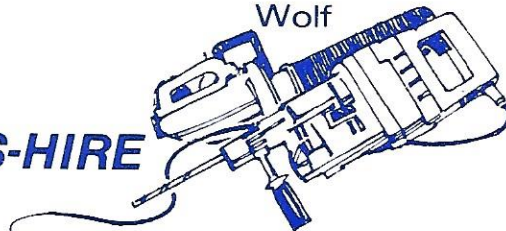

WELCOME TO NUNEATON BOROUGH AFC

There has been a town football club in Nuneaton for the best part of a century and for most of that time it has been based at Manor Park. The early years were tough, however, and more than one club collapsed under financial pressures. The last time this happened was in 1937 when the old Nuneaton Town Club — which had featured briefly in the Southern League in the 1920s — succumbed. Within weeks, however, local enthusiasts had formed a new club which they named Nuneaton Borough and which took its place in the Central Amateur League.

The new club thrived, particularly after the Second World War, and moved successively through the Birmingham Combination and the Birmingham League until, almost a quarter of a century ago, in 1958, they joined the Southern League.

Nuneaton Borough have never won the Southern League, although they were runners up in 1966-67 and 1974-75, being pipped at the post in the last week of the season on both occasions. This evening they will be attempting to put their name on the Championship Shield for the first time.

During the mid 1970s Nuneaton Borough became one of the strongest advocates of the principle of a pyramid system in semi-professional football with a single, national league at its head. Thus it was with real pride that they became founder members of the Alliance Premier League in 1979. After a disappointing season in 1980-81, however, they found themselves back in the Southern League. Their number one target this season was to return to the A.P.L. as quickly as possible, a goal which has now been realised.

Nuneaton Borough have always produced good players, and in recent seasons a veritable flood of players have moved on to full-time football. At the start of the current season no less than seven of their former players were playing full-time soccer, six in the U.K. and one in West Germany.

Over the years Nuneaton have often performed well in Cup competitions. In 1949-50 and 1966-67 they reached the third round proper of the F.A. Cup. Nor is their current record unimpressive — they have reached the first round of the F.A. Cup or better in eight of the last nine seasons.

Nuneaton Borough's ground attendance record is 22,114 set in the third round of the F.A. Cup in 1967 when Rotherham Utd. were their visitors.

PEN PICTURES

ALAN DULLESTON (Goalkeeper). Joined Nuneaton from A.P. Leamington on the eve of the season. A competent and highly-rated player.

BOB STOCKLEY (Right Back). Experienced player who has seen service with a number of clubs, including Wimbledon and Atherstone Town. Played for the England semi-pro team v Holland in 1980. Played under Alan Batsford at Wimbledon.

PHIL SANDERCOCK (Left Back). Joined Nuneaton Borough in the spring of 1981 after having played for Northampton Town. Has fitted in well at Manor Park and is noted for coolness under pressure.

RICHARD DIXEY (Central Defender). Strong player who cost Nuneaton their biggest-ever fee when he joined them from Scarborough last season. Highly rated in most quarters.

JOHN GLOVER (Central Defender). Joined Nuneaton in the summer of 1980 after seeing service with Dulwich and Bedford. Sharp and nimble, he turned down a projected £30,000 move to Colchester in January 1981.

BARRY LOWE (Midfield). One of the most highly rated players in semi-

professional football, he joined the club for a large fee from Worcester City in July 1981. Has also seen service at Stafford and Weymouth.

MIKE McFARLANE (Midfield). Joined Nuneaton from Witney Town in the summer of 1980. He was a member of the Southern League's O.C.S. tournament team in the same year.

GARETH DALE (Striker). Speedy and able, this player has been one of Nuneaton's successes in recent years. Suffered badly with injuries last season and will be hoping for better luck this time around.

ALAN HOULT (Striker). Local man who spent several years with Leicester City. Small sharp and nimble, he was Nuneaton's leading goalscorer last season.

TOMMY ROBSON (Left Wing). Veteran of many Football League matches with Chelsea, Newcastle and Peterborough. Signed in the summer of 1981 to give the team "width" on the left.

BOBBY PARKER (Midfield). Local youngster who has progressed through the Youth and Reserve teams. He forced his way into the first team earlier this season and played 24 times in the Midland Section, scoring a number of vital goals late in the season.

DON NARDIELLO (Striker). Welsh international of Hawaiian ancestry. Played in the Football League for Coventry City and joined Nuneaton late in the season, giving strong support to their promotion campaign.

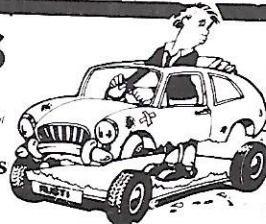

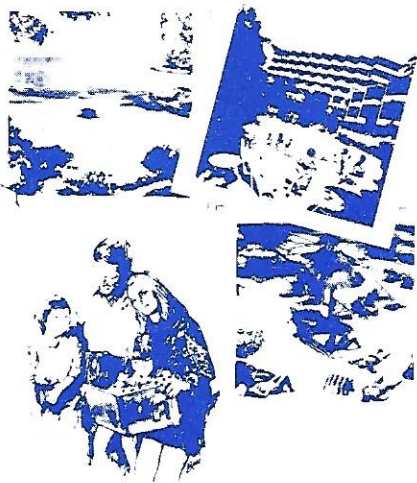
