Our reserves will once again be playing in the Suburban League and this season will be managed by Ken Gee and Al Harper who replace Charlie Townsend and Derek Williams who have both left the club. We take this opportunity to thank them for their service and wish them well in the future.

We will not be running a youth side this season but we will be placing the emphasis on Youth in the Reserve team.
