- Using violence of any nature.

Good Evening Ladies and Gentlemen and welcome to our Southern League game against Hemel Hempstead. May I extend this welcome to our visitors, match officials and wish them a safe and pleasant journey home.

Hemel Hempstead started the season in excellent style with a 4-1 home win against Cirencester, so a tough game is on the cards tonight. Hemel are certainly no strangers to us in recent years, as they have been our opponents in the Ryman league for 2 seasons. They could be considered something of a bogey team, as they have won 4 out of 4 games against us, most memorably their 2-0 win to more or less clinch promotion into the reformed Ryman Premier League in 2004. It was a pretty devastating defeat for us, as we were hot on their heels in the promotion charge, but the rest, as they say, is history!

Well its been a summer of intense activity on the playing side. Virtually all of last season's squad have been

released, and may we wish them well for the future. New faces have appeared and already made their mark in pre season. Also from Uxbridge we welcome the Bamford Brothers, Stuart and Gavin, who have proved to be capable defensive adversaries in past encounters. And last but certainly not least, is Chris O'Leary, a strong midfielder who was voted their player of the year for 2 years running. Joining from Banbury United is prolific goalscorer Matt Gooderick, who is seen as a big loss by their supporters. He is joined up front by Dean Papali. an exciting young prospect from Brook House. Another forward expected to feature in the near future is Wayne Cort, who has been re-signed from Brackley. He is currently suffering an ankle injury but expects to be back in the next month or so. Also returning is experienced keeper Lee Carroll who was without doubt, the best of the 5 or 6 keepers to represent us last season. Without wanting to issue the legendary Adam Williams kiss of death, we have looked a lot more organised, physical and committed than last season. Its been a joy to watch the opposition clearly not happy with our physical style, as generally, its been us who's been bullied around during the previous seasons.

I am writing this previous to our opening League game at Mangotsfield, lets hope we started with a win and sent our travelling fans home happy. This game will be covered in the next issue of this programme.

Welcome to Steve Bateman and his Hemel team for our first home game, but I can't believe it's the start of yet another season already.

After the bitter disappointments of the last couple of seasons, we made a conscious

decision to rebuild a squad with more character, a physical presence and the type of player who will have the desire to play for a blue and white shirt. Our move to the Southern League only made the recruitment more difficult, but I am pleased with the efforts of the summer months.

Ten new recruits in Gavin and Stuart Bamford, Stuart Goodall, Matt Gooderick, Chris O'Leary, Billy Sentance, Fergus Moore, Kevin Swift, Dean Papali and Julian Edwards were our reward for the phone calls and numerous meetings throughout June and July. I am also delighted that we also managed to attract Mark Gill to join us as first team coach, to complete our new look 'Stones' for this season.

The result of those early signings, in addition to the lads we kept from last year, has meant a solid pre-season, where we have used virtually the same players from day one and given us the rare opportunity to have a settled squad from the beginning of the summer. An excellent work ethic in training, coupled with seven wins and two draws have been encouraging signs, but the only concern has been the lack of quality opposition in those build up friendlies.

Then, last Saturday, typical of the game we all love, nine undefeated during preseason, we get outplayed and lose our opening league game at Mangotsfield. A dreadful, lack lustre first half performance was

quickly followed by Lee Carroll being sent off early in the second half and we were up against it. Our response was good and we produced our best spell for half an hour, while we were a man short, but it was too little, too late and then unfortunately, we conceded again late on to go down 3-1. Totally our own fault when you consider our poor first half showing, our lack of passing and the fact that all three goals were our own errors.

On reflection, defeat in our opening game may not be that bad, just remember what happened in the last two years and we all know the story of those seasons. Defeat is never easy to take especially when you have a long journey home like Saturday. However, it's another learning curve and it will be interesting to see the response from the players who all know they let themselves and the travelling supporters down by under performing.

Belated congratulations to Steve and Hemel on last years play-off success and the excellent 4-1 result in the opening game of the season on

Saturday Confidence should be sky high in the camp, especially hat trick hero Thomas, the striker tipped to be the next non-league player to follow in the footsteps of Jermaine and sign 'pro'. I hope it happens before tonight!

Well, that will do for an opener. I would just like to wish all our 'new boys' a long and successful stay at the club and ask the supporters to show some patience with the new squad as we go into the unknown of the Southern League. It will take time, but we need some stability with the players this year and we must remember we are in this for the long haul and not looking for a short term stop gap.

Enjoy the game and give the boys plenty of support....they will respond with the hard work and commitment you want to see. I cannot promise the outcome, but I will promise the desire.

I suppose the major downside has been the long injury list that we have suffered during pre season which has hindered the preparations. Wayne Cort, Luke Woods, Danny Gibbs, Matt Miller, Graham Hall and Ben Alexander but hopefully James Smith is working some magic and many of these will be returning soon.

Hemel Hempstead Town Football Club was founded in 1885 as Apsley F.C and originally played their football in the West Herts League. The Club affiliated to the Herts Football Association in 1887, two years after the County Association was formed.

In 1935 the club changed its name to Hemel Hempstead Town, as well as becoming associate members of the Football Association.

A major step for the Club came in 1952, when they joined the Delphian League and become full members of the Football Association. The Club stayed in that league for eleven years, unfortunately without any success.

In the 1962/63 season the Club joined the newly formed Athenian League and in 1965 they gained promotion to the Premier Division, courtesy of a

runners up place behind Slough Town. After several non-eventful seasons in the Premier Division the Club was relegated in 1969.

In 1972 the Club amalgamated with Hemel Hempstead United from the South Midlands League and changed names to Hemel Hempstead F.C, also moving to it's current ground in Vauxhall Road.

In 1977 the Club joined the expanded Isthmian League, where they had remained ever since (until season 2004/05).

During the 1980's, Hemel Hempstead F.C remained in Division two of the Isthmian League, although never finishing higher than 10th position.

In 1985, the Clubs Centenary Year, 2,500at Vauxhall Road.

In 1992, the Club reached the Final of the Herts Senior Cup where they met Barnet FC. The game was played at Clarence Park, home of St.Albans City, where Hemel Hempstead FC lost 4-1, where superior fitness saw victory achieved with three late goals.

In November 1992, the Club was rocked by fire, which destroyed the clubhouse and changing rooms. The Club was forced to rearrange several matches whilst temporary buildings were erected.

The 1996/97 season proved to be disastrous for the club, with five different 1st Team Managers being appointed during the season and the Club was in a dire financial situation. Steve Ringrose left following a 9-0 defeat against Leatherhead and Mark Pearson and Andy McMahon followed him within a matter of weeks. Brian Jackson took temporary control in January and Colin Jones (formally of Berkhamsted Town Reserves) took over control in February 1997. Colin brought in a number of young players, but could not prevent the Club being relegated to the Third Division.

During the summer of 1997, new ownership was voted in, headed by local publican David Boggins. Cash was immediately injected into the club to improve the ground and clubhouse. A new manager also took the helm in the shape of Mick Vipond and he brought in his coach from their successful Leverstock Green team, Danny Johnson.

In their first season in charge, Hemel Hempstead FC were crowned Champions of Division 3, promotion at the first attempt. Vipond was voted manager of the season, after conceding only 28 league goals all season.

had turned things around, guiding the club to 4th place, narrowly missing out on promotion.

For the start of the 1998/99 season the name of

the Club changed to Hemel Hempstead Town FC. Work was carried out to improve the ground and the old clubhouse was re-opened along with new changing rooms. During December the club parted company with Vipond and Johnson and they were immediately replaced by ex Watford star Neil Price, along with Roy Butler as his coach. Within 4 months the Price/Butler partnership

Price and Butlers first full season in charge ended with HHTFC winning the Ryman League Division Two Championship, gaining the Clubs highest ever league finish. Only to be knocked back in the close season, by the Ryman League as the ground did not meet the grading criteria for promotion.

The completion of two new stands during the summer of 2000 and the building of a new clubhouse, during the following season, saw the Club gain a B grade for the ground.

Unfortunately, HHTFC could not match the efforts on the pitch, finishing in 6th position.

Neil Price and Roy Butler parted company with the Club in the close season and was replaced by ex Barnet goalkeeper Gary Phillips and Kevin Mudd as his assistant.

Phillips and Mudd started from scratch bringing in virtually a whole new squad of players, but thing on the pitch went from bad to worse. With many losses and not much to cheer, saw Phillips resign the post after a 6-1 defeat at Chertsey. Chairman David Boggins quickly installed ex HHTFC player Tony Kelly as player manager and he immediately brought in some new faces. On the pitch Tony started to turn the football round, pulling off the bottom to finish a respectable mid table.

Tony's first full season in charge 2002/03 was as members of the newly formed Ryman League Division One North and again just missing out on promotion to the Ryman Premier league, by finishing 4th.

Season 2003/04 was very up and down with all teams results unpredictable. HHTFC was looking forward to the F.A pyramid restructuring at the end of the season and Kelly guiding the Club to 6th place in the league, guaranteed the Club Premier Division football the following season. This has been the Clubs highest ever position within the football pyramid.

The 2003/04 season went down to the last game with HHTFC playing Arlesey Town, both vying for that crucial sixth spot Arlesey needing a draw to secure the place and HHTFC needing the win. Hemel Hempstead Town FC won the game 1-0.

During the close season, details of the restructuring were released with HHTFC being placed in the Southern Premier league.

The 2004/05 season started with Tony Kelly in charge and with this their maiden season in the Southern Premier it would always take time to settle, but by the end of November TK had gone and the man who took over the role was Nicky Ironton who had the task of keeping the tudors afloat in the SP. 3 wins from 12 games in a period where the Tudors defeated Berkhamsted in 2 cups to get to 2 finals was not enough to keep NI in the hot seat and so onto the third and last manager of

the season Byron Walton, who had to pick up a disillusioned Hemel side 10points from safety with 12 games to go. Even with a unbeaten run that stretched for 5 games (4 were wins) it was not enough to stay up and The Tudors bided farewell to the Southern Prem.

2005/06 saw the Tudors made a swift return to the Southern Premier via the play-offs.

At the end of the day, the final decision rested with the Council and we on the Board were very happy indeed when we learnt that Barnet FC and the Football First project had "won". I have been very encouraged by the meetings that I have had with Barnet FC Chairman Tony Kleanthous, as have my fellow directors.

As an old cynic I travelled down to Mangotsfield today cautiously optimistic about our prospects for the season ahead. We definitely look a more competitive outfit and I can't see us conceding the number of goals we did last season. On the negative side, it looks as if goals are going to be hard to come by. I suppose the match proved me right; first half we competed well but failed to create much going forward - we trailed at half time to a 14th minute headed goal. supporters scene - sarin rawal

Good afternoon and welcome to tonight's game against Hemel Hempstead Town. I extend a warm welcome to the players, officials and supporters' of our opponents. I also extend that welcome to the match referee and the assistant referees.

The end of last season seems such a long time ago. Since then, we have had the World Cup, the attempts of the England cricket team to recreate the winning feeling of the Ashes, the controversy of drugs in sports with the revelations of Floyd Landis and Justin Gaitlin and Jensen Button finally winning a grand prix!

The most important news of the summer has been the resolution of the Prince Edward's Playing Field site. As has been well documented, Barnet FC will complete the building of the stadium as well as adding a second smaller stadium. They will move their academy and ladies team there and rent the stadium to Wealdstone. Our own academy teams will be able to train at PEPF too. After more than fifteen years, we will have a ground we can call home.

There are grounds for concern, in particular, what revenue streams the club will have when we move and of course the threat of Barnet's first team moving in. The statement by the Cllr Mote where he stated that part of the lease agreement would be that Barnet's first team would not be able to play at the ground hopefully should alleviate some of the nervousness surrounding the deal.

Once the legal agreements have been resolved by the council and Barnet, hopefully the Board will be in a position to negotiate the best deal for the club. We at the supporters' club have asked the main club if we would be able to meet with Barnet Chairman, Mr Kleanthous and hope to see him soon.

Onto playing matters, I have yet to see us play this season (I made the decision a few years ago never to go to pre-season friendlies) and I was unable to go Mangotsfield as I had to do some final shopping in preparation for the arrival of my first child.

At the AGM, Gordon mentioned the tough training regime that had been put into place for pre season training and this was re-iterated by Matt Gooderick who spoke to a close friend of mine who like Matt supports Oxford United. I believe that we have made some good signings this summer, the likes of the Bamford brothers and Chris O'Leary will add steel to the team and Fergie will always play his heart out for the side. I am proud to say that the Supporters' Club have helped in the acquisition of these players by donating £2500 to Gordon's budget which he was told about pre-season. We will hand over the cheque at the Yate match on September 2nd. I'm glad that we seem (on paper at least) to have a team that will survive with the physical aspects of this league, hopefully the performance of last Saturday's match will be a one-off

On the subject of the match against Mangotsfield, our fans showed great passion and it seems that this seemed to help the team in the second half. However, it seems that some of the fans were quick to lambaste our players. Whilst some will say this is our right (and it is to an extent), we must remember that this is a new team, in a new league and things may take time to gel. Have patience and be constructive in your criticisms, there really is no need to launch into a tirade of abuse.

Onto travel matters, we were asked to look at coach travel for our supporters', however; the club have come up with a great idea to see if fans want to travel with the team as this reduces costs. The pick up point is the Master Brewer which is easily accessible by car and by tube. It is not ideal for supporters' who live on the wrong branch of the Metropolitan line (i.e. the Watford branch) so I would suggest that those who may find it a problem to get to the pick up point ask if other supporters' are able to pick them up from somewhere which would be more suitable. We did ask the club to look into the possibility of another pick up point (possibly in Harrow) but it depends on demand.

Well that's enough from me; enjoy the game and here's to our first league win of the season.


