MANY a Wedding ring, lovingly slipped over a bride's finer 10, 20, 30, or even 50 years ago, meets a melting but unsentimental end at a Refinery Plant in a West London suburb.

Some are worn, some are new. Tantalisingly, there must be a story, slipping forever out of reach, not only behind the rings, but also connected with other gold and silver oddments that make their last trip—at least in their present form—to the premises of Brazier Metals Ltd., at Rothschild Road, Acton. The fact that Brazier deal with 'waste' gold, silver and platinum, and that the Rothschild name come into their present address is pure coincidence, for Brazier was formed well over a decade ago by the companies Chairman Donald Edward Peake.

'Waste' precious metals come from Jewellers and Companies which use the materials in their various products. These arrive at Brazier in many different shapes and forms, components used in the Electrical Industry in computers and Machinery, rolls of film which can be specially treated to recover quantities of silver, offcuts from Jewellery Manufacturers who cannot use the excess small cuttings which are left after shaping their article, and endless quantities of rings, old watch cases, bracelets, charms, spectacle frames and other oddments which members of the public either bring or send by registered post in exchange for payment.

There are also lots of household items which end up at Braziers for their silver content. Knives, forks and spoons, coffee and tea sets, all end up in the melting pot, even ancient coins.

In 1981 Brazier were asked to melt into bars, a number of silver coins which had reposed under the sea for more than a couple of centuries, they were part of a treasure trove of some 35,000 silver coins which went down with the 'Hollandia' a Dutch East Indiaman, off the Scilly Isles in 1743, when the ship was outward bound on her maiden voyage for the then port of Batavia in the Dutch East Indies.

The compact premises of Brazier Metals flanked on either side by terraced rows of dwellings, stand out impressively in Rothschild Road, their well kept appearance is maintained throughout, sophisticated security systems and furnace equipment are installed along with a well set-up laboratory, to deal with the raw materials which come in, whether it is a gold tie-pin or the sweepings from the floor of some industrial concern, where there maybe gold or silver particles among the dust. Treating and recovering precious metals is a highly technical and skilled business, it may mean treating a bulk material made up of sweepings, so that the minute contents of the precious metal can be separated and salvaged. To treat that material without losing what is really fine dust can be quite a problem.

Material like this is usually accumulated until tonnage builds up and then treating this quantity can prove a very viable proposition for the customer.

Buying articles from the public either through advertising or through personal callers, is a side line at Braziers, but increasingly quite an important one. There are quite a number of purchasers of precious metals, but only a handful of companies like Brazier which can handle the complete Refining process, from purchasing through analysing, to reducing the precious metal to ingots.

The price offered is related strictly to current daily prices and to the metal that can be recovered, sellers can be paid in currency or in Krugerrands, Sovereigns or bullion. The staff at Brazier are always willing to offer advice on hallmarking, weights and prices and the Sales counter at Rothschild Road in Acton operates 5 days a week from 9am to 5pm and on a Saturday morning from 9am to 1pm.

Hopefully we will continue next season with the extra experience gained this campaign to mount a further challenge for honours.

## GAME FOR A LAUGH!!

AS another football season gently ebbs away on its annual tidal wave of depression, with club finances in a parlous state, the number of sending-offs having reached an all time high, and predictions for the future as gloomy as they were twelve months ago, I think, perhaps, it's time to cheer up and consider some of the more light-hearted aspects of our national game.

Take for example our footballing jargon, that wonderfully cliché-riddled art form, which is as bereft of originality as Joe Bugner is of modesty. In pre and after match interviews, one can always amuse oneself by playing "Spot the Cliche". Ripostes like "over the moon, Brian" and "sick as a parrot" are certainly declining in popularity, as are "we take each game as it comes" and "we play for each other", but definitely in fashion at the moment is "... after all that's what football is all about". Unfortunately, however, everyone seems to have conflicting opinions as to what the game is actually all about - 'players', 'entertainment' and 'success' have all been put forward by various footballing personalities.

I am a great believer that statistics in football, and indeed sport in general, are only useful up to a certain point, but try telling that to David Coleman, whose legendary vide-printer analysis has recently provided viewers with some quite staggeringly useless gems. He imparted this epic just a few weeks ago, when the scoreline Workington Town... 3 Worksop... 0 was flashed up on the screen. "That's incredible", stammered Mr. Coleman, his voice filled with genuine incredulity, "Worksop now haven't scored at Workington for six years!". I mean, who honestly gives the slightest.

Football journalism, I can assure you, has become in itself an industry. Thousands clamour each year to succeed in putting their barbed pen to Fleet Street paper, so that they can give fresh impetus to the weekly hammering which the game receives. The spontaneity of radio though, makes journalists far more vulnerable and unsure, to great comic effect. London's commercial station has among its ranks several amusing characters, one of whom seems to get lumbered with a surfeit of 0-0 draws and hence, not surprisingly, reports every score with the phrase "and what a beautiful goal it was". One of his colleagues, who might well have had an unfortunate accident during childhood, because his voice is so unusually high, fails miserably to disguise his support for Charlton Athletic, as he reports on all their home games with a remarkable disregard for their opponents' exploits.

The humour though in Stuart Hall's match reports is not created by his shortcomings. Far from it. His reports are articulate masterpieces, conveying above all atmosphere and mood, highlighting the good rather than dwelling on the poor, and containing many a humorous turn of phrase. Yes I know he appears somewhat eccentric on "It's a Knockout", but I can assure you his eloquent, witty reports are a revelation.

To end, well, let's look forward to next season, (yes it is only 3½ months away). Besides looking out to see whether a Scottish goalkeeper can make a decent save on television, and hoping that Trevor Francis could once run 20 yards without falling over or getting himself injured, I'll be willing the 'Stones to improve on this season's quite splendid showing, which I must admit, exceeded even my wildest dreams. My congratulations go to the players, manager and chairman.
