



News & Views

The visit of Wealdstone to Layer Hoad today will give fans an opportunity to judge for themselves the comparative standard of football in the Fourth and in the Alliance.

Last season 14 of the Alliance's 22 clubs reached the first round of the F.A.Cup, seven of them reached the second round and two progressed to the third round. Wealdstone went out, losing 2-0 to Swindon in the first round. But they made the League side fight all the way, home advantage helping to tilt the scales in the Wiltshire club's favour.

This campaign the Alliance again had 14 clubs in the first round. One of them Worcester beat Aldershot. Maidstone triumphed over Exeter and Telford trounced Stockport to reached round two. Altrincham, Bangor and Wealdstone progressed by beating fellow Alliance clubs. Barnet and Dagenham departed after taking league opposition to a replay.

The Alliance has of course, been pressing for some time for their top club to automatically replace the bottom club in Division Four. But that move still looks as far away as ever, yet the fact remains that some of the non-league teams have facilities which are better than those at certain league enclosures. And looking back it must be admitted that it was Cup exploits that got Colchester into the league in

1950 after some years earlier receiving no votes at all when they tried to gain admission to the old Third Division South.


In the 1977-78 season Wealdstone reached the Third Round of the Cup losing 4-0 to Queen's Park Rangers at Loftus Road. For a number of years now 'The Stones' have been one of the leading nonleague clubs. In their time they have been frontrunners in the Spartan, Athenian, Isthmian and Southern Leagues in addition to the Alliance but their chances of attaining League status, situated as they are in the London area, would appear to be remote.

Nevertheless the U's will have to be at their best because in the past non-league sides have caused all sorts of problems. Bideford, unheard of, and unfancied, came to Layer Road and drew. Though the replay was won the long trip to Devonshire proved expensive. Dover, Leatherhead and Yeovil have all caused Cup upsets to Colchester at various times so Wealdstone will certainly not be regarded as push-

Last season Wealdstone finished third in the Alliance with Mark Graves netting 23 goals including two hat-tricks.

Division IV News

A glance at the top and then at the bottom of the Fourth Division provides a most illuminating contrast between those that have and those that need.

Table toppers York City, attracting gates of more than 4,000, down in the dumps Chester City getting just 975 at one recent game. The Bootham Crescent side having used only 13 players in their promotion quest, while the Sealand Road outfit have permed from 24 so far, and have not yet fielded the same side in two successive games.

York of course, are reaping the benefits of some shrewd team building by Manager Dennis Smith over the past couple of seasons, Indeed during the summer his only new signing was Crewe veteran Sean Haselgrove. All the rest of the team are the men whose late run last season almost won one of the promotion spots. This time round the signs are that they will do even better. Certainly they are the best drilled outfit that the U's have met so far.

The only question marks against them must be their small playing staff - only 14 - if they encouter many injuries. Also the fact that one or two of

their players are targets for clubs in higher divisions. It remains to be seen if they can hang on to a promising young player like John Byrne. Another problem for the York Management must also be to maintain the progress of recent times. With no reserve side to fall back on any replacements will have to come from outside the club and money for buying, despite the improved gates, is not too plentiful.

Still these are minor worries compared with those at Chester. Here despite land sales in the not too distant past, and the sale this season of John Thomas to Lincoln, the coffers are empty. Manager John Sainty was sacked before he had the chance to get the ship on an even keel.

Caretaker Manager Trevor Storton is faced with a mammoth task restoring pride and confidence to a mend and make-do side. There are only a handful of experienced players on the books. So far nine teenagers have figured in matches, four noncontract players, and two men on loan. In recent games a 20 year-old car -worker Chris Camden has been drafted in from local soccer to lead the attack.




of the play we were unable to penetrate their defence and we eventually finished up nil nil.



Flashback

When was the last time a Pop Group played live at Layer Road at a match? That was a tricky little question, and it was a couple of days before the answer suddenly dawned.

The date 10th April, 1970. The occasion, Claude Orrin's Testimonial Match. Colchester United versus Millwall. The Profile — where are they now? — a then fashionable pop group entertained before the kick—off.

Claude Orrin — alas no longer with us, — became Secretary at Layer Road in 1946 and called it a day shortly before the above mentioned testimonial game.

A Chartered Accountant, Claude was Hon. Secretary for the first year of his reign with the U's, he soon got so involved that from 1947 onwards for over 20 years Colchester United was his life.


He always said 3rd June 1950 was the most exciting day of his football life. The day the U.s were elected into the Football League.

During the previous season while the club were in the Southern League, Claude spent all his leisure time visiting the various League clubs pushing the claims of Colchester for a place in the sun. He recalled that on the day of the League A.G.M. he travelled up to Lancaster Gate and was so nervous and excited that he put milk on his plaice and french fries instead of tomato sauce. Then to top it all he actually walked out of the restaurant without paying his bill. After the meeting the Colchester party celebrated, and Claude, who had a weakness for port, inbibed rather more than usual, and ended up on a train to Southend instead of Colchester.

During his time as Secretary he worked with six Managers, Ted Fenton, Jimmy Allen, Jack Butler, Benny Fenton, Neil Franklin and Dick Graham. Each one in turn paid tribute to the way Claude handled the day to day running of the Club, for Claude could sort out the most complex of problems without a glance in the League rulebook. He was Colchester's 'Mr Football'.

Besides Managers, no less than 26 Directors served on the Board, over 200 players appeared for the Club, and through it all he reigned supreme and respected as the power behind the throne.

When Claude retired he had a youngster waiting in the wings to assume his mantle. His assistant David Havell took over and became the youngest Secretary in the Football League.



Keep Fit With Arena

HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

With Christmas approaching it is perhaps appropriate that we think of the heart. Christmas is a time of romance, of thinking of home and family but also of eating and drinking too much and of inactivity. Not only emotionally but also physically, our hearts rule our heads!

There is a great deal of talk at the moment about Aerobics (indeed at the Arena we have Sue Franklins workouts most days, although Sue is careful to point out that hers are not intensive aerobic exercises which most people would find impossible to do!). Simply, however, aerobic activity is any form of exercise designed to make the heart beat faster and therefore, become stronger (but excluding watching pretty girls or chunky men!).

Take your pulse:-

The first thing you need to know, therefore, is how to take your pulse. You should check this before you start exercise and after you have completed you workout. Take your pulse (in your neck or wrist) for 10 seconds, multiply by six to obtain your true heart rate.

Work rate: -

It is generally accepted that exercise to 70% of your maximum capacity is ideal (assuming that you are basically fit and do not have heart problems).

To complete this you should use the following formula:-

220 - (your age) x 0.7 = exercise rate For example if you are 39 years old,

 $(220 - 39) \times 0.7 = 127$ beats/minute.

Reverting to your oringinal 10 second check this means 21 beats/10 seconds! As you become fitter and your heart stronger you will need to work harder to attain this heart rate.

How long and often?

You need to exercise at the above level for at least ten minutes and ideally longer. It obviously depends on your objective, but ten minutes, four times each week will have a marked effect on your heart strength. Twice a week will help your general fitness but not your heart. So make ten minutes available four or five times a week plus enough time to warm up and cool down (say 15-18 minutes overall). When?

This is entirely a matter of choice, within limits. Apart from the normal rules of not working out immediately following a heavy meal or in abnormal heat, choose a time of the day, stick to it! It is also worth making the effort to feel comfortable and look the part. Get a partner to work out with, wear good shoes and smart training or jogging clothes.

What to do?

Running, jogging, cycling
