

#### Nuneaton Borough A.F.C. 1979-80—Pen Pictures

Nuneaton has boasted a professional football club for many years, and for the most of this century the club has been based at Manor Park. Nuneaton Town played in numerous competitions between the wars, even spending two years in the Southern League in the early twenties. At the end of season 1936-37, however, the Town club succumbed to a financial crisis and collapsed.

Within six weeks local enthusiasts had formed a new club, which they called Nuneaton Borough, and entered the Central Amateur League. After just one year in this competition they graduated successively to the Birmingham Combination and the Birmingham League, before joining the Southern League in 1958. During their twenty odd years in the latter competition they spent most of their time in the Premier Division.

Nuneaton Borough have never won the Southern League Championship, but have been runners-up twice, pipped during the last week on both occasions, in 1966-67 and 1974-75.

Over the past five years Nuneaton have probably been the most consistent supporters of the principle of the Alliance and the pyramid system in soccer of all the clubs competing in the Southern League, so that it is with real pride that they take their place as founder-members of the A.P.L.

In the F.A. Cup Nuneaton Borough have twice reached the third round proper, in 1949-50 and in 1966-67. They have reached the first round proper or better in seven of the past eight seasons. In local and Midland competitions they have won a host of honours. Their record attendance is 22, 114 (v. Rotherham Utd., Jan. 1967). PLAYERS

Paul Wilding (Goalkeeper). Tall keeper, well over six feet in height who had early experience with Wolves and has recently returned to this country after spells in Hong Kong and Australia.

Bob Stockley (Full-back). Strong and resourceful defender who has seen service with Wimbledon and Atherstone. He is the Club Captain.

Tom Fallon (Centre-half). Yet another of the group of local youngsters who made a number of promising first team appearances last season.

Roy Cross (Central defender). Former skipper of Port Vale who came out of League soccer to begin a new career as a teacher. Now in his fifth season with the club.

Tim Smithers (Midfield or left-wing). Brought up in Coventry and joined the club from local soccer. Hard working player with the ability to snatch vital goals.

Cliff Campbell (Centre-forward). Tall striker, a £2,000 purchase from Banbury in August, 1978. He was the club's leading scorer last season.

Ian Crawley (Centre-forward). Another local youngster; a powerful front-runner with the ability to upset defences.

Alan Hoult (Striker). Local player who joined the club in the close season following service with Leicester City, Hull City, and Bristol Rovers.


