ALAN WALKER — Transferred from Bangor City in March 1980 and has made a big impact, particularly with his aerial ability. Previously with Stockport County.

MARTIN GAVIN — Now in his fourth season with the club, having been signed from Bromsgrove Rovers. Has won the player-of-the-year-award.

GARRY HANEY — A young player who joined the club from Q.P.R. last season. He was brought into the first team towards the end of last season and did tremendously well.

PETER WILKEY — A small, skilful player who was signed from Oswestry Town in 1979. He has also played for Wigan Athletic and Boston United.

DAVE MATHER — The third member of the trio of signings from Bangor City, who signed him from South Liverpool. Immediately made his mark with Telford by scoring regularly. Speedy and powerful.

EDDIE HOGAN — A talented midfield player with delightful ability and skills. Popular with the home supporters, Eddie has previously played for Derby County, Burton Albion and Redditch United.

JOHN ALCOCK — A natural, speedy left-winger who was signed in 1978/79 from Eastwood (Hanley). A favourite with Telford fans, who made him their player-of-the-year last season.

JOHN MARTIN — A powerful local boy who joined West Bromwich Albion straight from school. After over 100 games for Albion's reserves, Brian joined Exeter City before moving to Telford.

ALAN BOURTON — A speedy young forward who joined the club from Tamworth. He has had several games for the first team.

ARCHIE RICHARDS — Has a wealth of experience in defence, mainly at full-back. Archie is in his second spell with the club, having had spells with Stafford Rangers, Kettering Town and Weymouth in between.

JOHN BRANCH — A fast forward who was signed from Hednesford last season.

JIMMY WILLIAMS — A talented forward who scored regularly for Worcester City before being signed by Walsall for a reported fee of £7,000. Joined Telford from Walsall at the beginning of this season despite competition from Football League clubs.

MICK BRENNAN — A skilful midfield player who was signed at the beginning of this season from Redditch United.
