Chelmsford City were founded in 1900 and recently were taken over by a newly formed company Chelmsford City F.C. (1980) Limited. Their ground, one of the biggest in non-league football has a capacity of 18,000 with covered accommodation for 12,500. The chairman of the club is Mr Bryan Reeve who is an architect and they are managed by Colin Harpen the ex Ipswich player who has been with them for some eighteen months. Having had only a moderate time last season Colin has signed four new players for this coming campaign. The side has a mixture of experience and youth, including one of our past favourites Bobby Moss, who no doubt will have that extra incentive to do well tonight. In goal is the ever reliable Kim Yates a local lad who progressed through the reserves, as did full back Mark Lloyd. Also in defence is

Peter McRobert a signing from Ashford Town, he will help tighten up the defence. The recently married John Devine rejoins them from Billericay and Leon Mitchell after service with Hillingdon is another signing.

The experienced Len Tomkins had a spell with Crystal Palace as a youngster. Up front with Bobby Moss should be Merick Harriott a skilful player who has been with Hillingdon and Folkestone and Frank Bishop whose father-in-law happens to be Jimmy Greaves. Frank was signed three seasons ago from Tonbridge. Also in the team are Dean Bishop, Frank's brother and Colin Johnson.

Chelmsford have played two serious pre-season games, they lost 2-0 at Maidstone, where they missed two penalties and had a goal disallowed for offside and then conceded the two goals in the last five minutes. Last Tuesday they lost 2-1 at Harlow.
