It's strange, when all clubs are striving to organise ways to raise money and be more efficient that the Football League clubs lost out on the vote to have one paid Director who would run the club on a business like basis. If it has been reported correctly almost all of the clubs were in favour but the FA and its members were against, but I believe that eventually this will come about, and what Football League clubs do today, non-League clubs will follow tomorrow.

It's also been a frustrating time trying to organise the team for pre season games and at the time of writing this I still haven't had all players together, not even once!! Holidays and illness have been the reason, Steve Perkins has had hepatitis during the summer and at present is not allowed to start training, Dennis Byatt has had a virus and missed training for 10 days and missed 4 games in the process. When we are working on a very small squad these things can play havoc with your preparations. At the time of writing we have signed three new players, Ray Knowles a front player previously with Wimbledon and Tooting & Mitcham, young Paul Waites who was an apprentice from Chelsea and Goalkeeper Ray Goddard an experienced football league player from Wimbledon.

A lot of work has been done behind the scenes and the dressing rooms and adjoining buildings now look very smart, included in this complex is the managers office for which I am very grateful. I would like to say thanks to George Young and all of his helpers who made the changes possible, well done.


