WELCOME TO ASHFORD TOWN

Ashford Town were founded in 1930 and play at the Essella Park ground which has a capacity of 7,000 with covering for 2,000 and seating for 300. Their record attendance was in 1958 when 6,525 saw them entertain Crystal Palace in the F.A. Cup 1st Round. The sixties saw their best performances in the F.A. Cup — in 1961-2 they lost 3—0 to Q.P.R. and in 1966-7 they lost at Swindon 5—0 in the 2nd Round. In the F.A. Trophy they reached the semi-finals in 1972-73 when they went out to Scarborough by a single goal at Peterborough. Last season they finished in 16th position with John Young being their highest goal scorer. They are managed by Gordon Burden and currently are lying just outside the top ten in the league looking for a final push to qualify for the new Premier Division next year.

PEN PICTURES 1981/82

PETER CARMAN. A brave and experienced Southern League Goalkeeper who makes many fine saves during the course of the season. Now in his 6th season with the Club having signed from Maidstone United.

DES PARTINGTON. Club Captain, sets a fine example to the young players around him. Authorative back four player who thrives upon responsibility, a teacher by profession now in his fifth season with the Club and to date has made 204 1st Team appearances.

JOHN BARROW. Strong in the air, tidy on the ground, enthusiastic player of proven Southern League ability, now in his second season with the Club. Signed from Deal Town and to date has made 105 1st Team appearances.

TIM HOGBEN. Resolute defender, Tim is a product of the Clubs Youth Policy and now in his fourth season with the Club he is a firmly established Southern League player and to date has made 170 1st Team appearances.

ADRIAN CARTER. Slightly built, thrustful, this tenacious midfield player has great potential, signed from Whitstable and now in his second full season with the Club.


