# BOB HOLMES of THE EVENING STANDARD writes . . .

REFEREES could face a few tough weeks as the new season gets into its stride.

Last season the Football Association, as part of a clean-up soccer campaign, ordered referees to clamp down on the professional foul.

Now FIFA, the game's world governing body, have told the FA to wind-up their war on the professional foul. The FA have sent out instructions to the referees telling them to forget last season's special instructions but it will probably take them a few weeks to get used to their new battle plan.

Whatever their problems, however, I feel FIFA's decision is the correct one.

Although Alan Robinson, who refereed the recent Charity Shield match at Wembley, says: "I thought last season worked well after the initial three months", there was lots of controversy over the professional foul during the season.

Referees turned a blind eye to some fouls, while players were sent off for the most innocuous of offences. And, in truth, there was never any need for special instructions on serious foul play anyway. The rules of the game already allowed referees to send off players for violent conduct.

#### **Press Release**

The fifth season of the Alliance Premier Football League gets under way on Saturday (20th August) using a

unique points scoring system.

The new system means wins gained on opponents' grounds will continue to be worth three points, whereas wins gained at home will now be worth only two points: Both sides will gain one point in drawn matches. Last season, both 'home' and 'away' wins were rewarded with three points, but it was felt this tended to encourage visiting sides to play negatively for a draw in order to prevent the home club from gaining the two extra points for a win

Attendances in the Alliance held up well last season in comparison with many other leagues (they dropped by just over 4%) and it is felt the extra incentive for attacking play away from home will make Alliance football even more attractive this season. 1,440 goals were scored in league matches last season, 171 more than in the previous season.

Another innovation agreed at the League's Fourth Annual Conference at Blackpool in June means teams

can now use two substitutes instead of one if they so wish.

G.D. (Gordon) Swinton was elected new vice-president of the Alliance at the Conference. Taking his place as vice-chairman is D. (Derek) Nuttall, chairman of Northwich Victoria. Three new members of the Management Committee are Boston United secretary J. (John) Blackwell, Altrincham director E.W. (Ernie) Fryer and Runcorn director W.J. (Bill) King.

#### CLUB NEWS . . .

**ALTRINCHAM:** Altrincham have added striker Leo Skeete and midfield player Paul Cruickshank to their squad during the close season. Skeete, 32, was previously with Runcorn, having joined the Canal Street outfit midway through their 1981/82 Championship season. Cruickshank has moved to Moss Lane from 4th Division Bury, where he made his Football League debut in the 1979/80 season. He had completed over 80 appearances for Bury by last November, when a broken leg kept him out of the side for the rest of the season.

**BOSTON UTD:** A new youth team has been formed by Boston Utd and will be run jointly by new reserve team manager Tony Scrupps and Gilbert Sands, a local youth football administrator. The 'Pilgrims' have completed the signing of two new players this summer. They are 20-year-old Stuart Hibberd — a midfielder who made 50 Football League appearances for Lincoln City before being released at the end of last season — and 23-year-old Stephen Hirst, who can play either in midfield or in the attack and was with Northern Counties (East) side likeston Town last season.

**ENFIELD:** Goalkeeper Dave Mallet (20) and left-back Keith Hayzledene (25) have been added to Enfield's powerful squad during the close season. Both players were previously with Isthmian League side Leytonstone/Ilford and were members of the Essex club's 1981/82 Championship winning side which was named Rothmans Non-league Team of the Season.

Enfield, current A.P.L. Champions, kicked off their pre-season friendlies in style last week, playing the full 'Spurs first team in front of 3,500 spectators at Southbury Road and leading 1-0 at half-time through Noel

Ashford before finally going down 4-1.

MAIDSTONE UTD: Maidstone United have paid Leytonstone/Ilford £2,000 for the services of forward Micky Dingwall (27). Dingwall's only other club has been Barking. Another 'Stones' summer signing is 21-year-old midfielder Nigel Donn, who was with Orient last season. Previously, he was with Gillingham — having joined

them straight from school.

**RUNCORN:** Runcorn have signed England Non-league international John Rogers from Barrow. The former Altrincham striker replaces Leo Skeete, who has moved from Canal Street to play for Altrincham. Another likely departure is winger Steve Joel. Manager John Williams has reluctantly placed him on the transfer list due to the player taking a job entailing regular night work. Although a lower paid day job is available to Joel, the club is unable to make up the difference in money.

SCARBOROUGH: Four new players have signed for Scarborough during the close season: They are 19-yearold Neil Thompson, a defender from Hull City; midfielder Charlie Bell, who has had considerable Football League experience with Middlesbrough and Mansfield Town; midfield player Brendan Phillips from Nuneaton Borough (he holds four England Semi-profesional 'caps' and was formerly with Kettering Town and Boston United); and winger Trenton Wiggan (and England Schoolboy international once with Sheffield United) from Gainsborough Trinity, Boro' have also signed full-back Richard Dawson from York City. Dawson spent the latter part of last season on loan to Scarborough, during which time he made 14 league appearances.

TROWBRIDGE T: An Executive Suite has been opened by Trowbridge Town, Limited to 75 members who will receive lavish hospitality at home matches in return for their £100 membership fee, half the places have already been taken up.

New faces at Frome Road this season will include former Yeovil Town full-back Steve Ritchie, midfielder Danny Bartley (ex-Hereford Utd), central defender Duncan Ross (19) and striker Steve Round (20). Ross and Round both appeared for Walsall in the Football League several times last season.

WEYMOUTH: A mammoth rebuilding task is facing Weymouth manager Stuart Morgan after the departure of no less than seven of last season's F.A. Cup giant-killing team. Goalkeeper Kieron Baker, defender Billy Elliott, midfield player Gary Borthwick and striker Trevor Finnigan have all moved to Yeovil Town (Finnigan as player/manager); full-back Paul Morrell has gone to A.F.C. Bournemouth on a free transfer; striker Mark Baber has rejoined Southern League side Poole Town; and winger Peter Johnson (released with Finnigan last season) has yet to find another club. Morgan's task has been made even tougher, however, by a disastrous pre-season injury to 'keeper Kevin Roberts, who is likely to be out until the New Year with a fractured ankle. Meanwhile, fullback Bryan Lawrence has not been able to take part in pre-season training due to a damaged achiles tendon.

Arrivals at the 'Rec' include former Yeovil Town striker Dave Platt, full-back Phil Sandercock (from Barnet)

and young striker Steve Crabbe from Western League side Bridport.

WORCESTER C: Worcester City have made five close season signings, one of which sees former club captain Barry Lowe return to St. George's Lane after a spell with Nuneaton Borough. Completing the quintet are 'keeper Paul Hayward (from Paget Rangers), full-back Colin Caddick (Walsall), central defender Julian Marshall (ex-Hereford Utd. Bristol City and Walsall) and much travelled striker Bobby Shinton, whose former clubs include Manchester City, Wrexham and Walsall. Meanwhile, the club has placed record signing Jimmy Williams on the transfer list following his failure to turn up for pre-season training.

YEOVIL TOWN: Yeovil Town, who were losing more than £1,000 a week 12 months ago, report a loss of £4,603 last season compared with £55,664 the previous season - largely through slashing £23,000 off the players'

wages and expenses coupled with a major increase in lottery receipts.

In addition to their four signings from Weymouth (see above), Yeovil have signed full-back Nigel Jarvis, central defender Grant Davies and utility player Paul Charles. Jarvis moves to Huish after a spell with Blackburn Rovers and was previously with Plymouth Argyle.
