



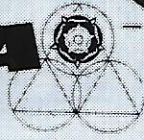

SPONSORSHIP: A DREAM FULFILLED . . .

ON behalf of chairman David Morritt and his Board of Directors, and everyone connected with Wealdstone Football Club, we are delighted to greet you, our Supporters, to the start of yet another season in which we look forward to going forward together to great things . . .

A lot has happened during the close season, the most important of which, of course, is the fact that the Alliance Premier League is no more, and we hail the opening day in the newly-formed GOLA LEAGUE and everyone involved at our level of football must be absolutely thrilled that sponsorship has arrived in such a massive way for our League.

To GOLA SPORTS LTD goes our thanks for sponsoring the League which henceforth bears its name. Gola's sponsorship, worth more than £250,000 over a three year period, is intended to benefit not only the clubs themselves, but the whole grass roots of football. We are particularly keen that it will encourage and foster participation among youngsters.

And now, a little information about the League's benefactors:

Gola, the largest British sportswear brand, was purchased in 1983 by William Lamb & Co. (Footwear) Ltd. who previously manufactured and supplied much of Gola's product range.

Lamb's themselves are the largest manufacturer of sports footwear in the UK and plan to make Gola one of the UK brand leaders again.

Product development and aggressive marketing has seen Gola sales increase from 400,000 units per year to a projected 1 million units this year; and the new management forecasts further significant sales increases over the subsequent two years.

Sponsorship of the Gola League will be the major plank in the company's 1984-5 marketing and promotional strategy.

Gola will make a financial commitment in the 1984/5 season as follows:-

- a) A payment to the League of £22,000 for distribution to member clubs on the first day of the 1984/5 season.
- b) Prize money to be awarded to the first three teams in the Gola league (£3,000, £2,000, £1,000)
- c) A monthly Gola Goal promotion to encourage more positive football, a greater number of goals and wider awareness of the Gola League. Total prize money available for the 1984/5 season is £20,000. The Gola Goal competition will run in the months of September 1984 to April 1985. A monthly jackpot of £2,500 will be available to be distributed between all clubs scoring 4 goals at home or 3 goals away in League games in the calendar month. Any club achieving 4 or 3 more than once in the month wins the appropriate number of shares in the jackpot. Prize money not won in any month will be carried over and added to the next month.
- d) Gola goal awards of £125 to the club with the highest scoring team and £125 to the club with the highest scoring player in League games during the following periods August 18th - October 31st, November 1st - December 31st, January 1st - February 28th, March 1st - May 4th.
- e) A budget will be set aside to allow the use of Gola merchandise as prizes by supporters clubs. This will be specially useful in events aimed at schools, scout associations and junior clubs. Advice and assistance in the setting up of such events will be available if required. These events could take place pre-match, ½ time or even in the close-season.

Gola have shifted their marketing effort from advertising into PR to ensure the widest possible promotion of the League and Gola name.

During the season, in conjunction with their PR advisers, J.G. Publicity Ltd. of Sheffield, Gola will assist with the setting up of seminars for commercial managers and Supporters Club secretaries, and the establishment of local sponsors for clubs.

In the second season, there will be a natural increase in cash available as Gola's promotional budget grows. The successful activity from 1984/5 will be continued.

Gola are committed to 'positive football' and additional areas of support for club success will be explored.

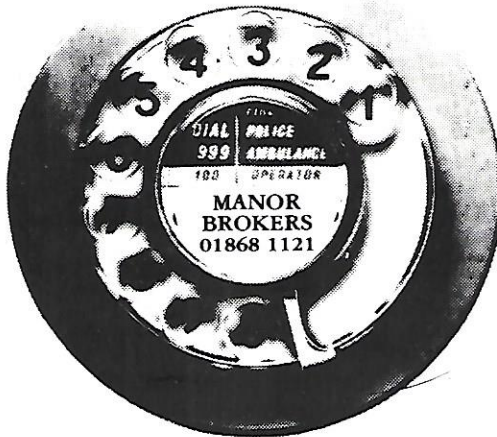

"The Pebbles Club" (Small Stones) (Wealdstone Football Clubs Junior Members School Scheme)

THIS year we are starting a "Pebbles Club" and as the name suggests, "A Small Stone" we are going to adopt this name for our Schools Scheme.

What is the School Scheme all about? Firstly we are inviting schools in the area to take part in a complimentary ticket scheme that will enable about 50 children from selected schools free admission into all **"Gola" league** games for this coming season.

Each selected school will provide a list of 50 pupils. This list will be registered at the Club.

Each child will be issued with a pass for the season for **"Gola League" games**, together with a lapel badge.

On attendance at the game each child will receive a draw voucher that will be handed back to the Club at the end of the season. This draw voucher will enable the child to participate in a grand draw at the end of the season. Prizes will range from BMX Bicycles to T.V. games and various other prizes.

On production of their pass, the child may be allowed to pay for an adult and for every adult paid for, the child will be issued with a further draw voucher free.

If the child misbehaves his/her membership will be withdrawn and the appropriate school informed.

Complimentary passes can only be used for **Gola League Games Only** but a draw ticket will be issued free on all cup games.

We regret, however, that there is no admittance to a grandstand seat unless accompanied by an Adult.

From time to time organised trips to special games for Pebbles Members only will be operating subject to demand.

No admittance to games without the Badge and the Pass. Passes are non-transferable.

In order to pay for this scheme I am hoping to raise money from donations and small sponsorships. If you would like to donate a small sum or know of sponsor, please contact me in the Office. Your name will be acknowledged in the Clubs programme.

INTRODUCING DARTFORD . . .

JOHN STILL (Manager) – Had a varied career as a centre-half with Orient, Charlton Athletic, Dagenham, Bishops Stortford (where he gained one F.A. Amateur Cup-Winners Medal and two Runners-up Medals), Ilford and Leytonstone. A knee injury forced him to retire. John had four seasons as manager with Leytonstone/Ilford: under his guidance the club won the Isthmian League First Division, the Premier Division and were runners-up the season after. Leytonstone/Ilford also won the London Senior Cup twice, the Hitachi Cup and the Essex Senior Cup and were nominated as Rothman's Club of the Year in 1981/82. The trail of success has continued at Dartford with the Darts winning the Southern League Championship in 1983/84 and finishing League Cup Runners-up in the same season – results which enabled John to be nominated MacKenzie Southern League Manager of the Season (as well as Manager of the Month for February).

DAVID MALLET (Goalkeeper) – Highly rated 'keeper who was signed in March 1984 from Enfield for a £1,500 fee. Previously with Leytonstone/Ilford where he was a first team regular and signed for Enfield at the start of 1983/84 season.

DAVID JAQUES (Full Back) – Equally at home at full-back (his preferred position) or midfield David is a fast, strong tackling player. Ever-present last season David was signed in the summer of 1983 from Leytonstone/Ilford.

GEORGE BORG (Defender/Midfield) – Signed in the middle of last season from Wycombe Wanderers with whom he gained an Isthmian League Championship Medal.

MARTIN McCAYNE (Central Defender) – Signed for small fee from Leytonstone/Ilford, July 1984. Martin, member of England Non-League squad, joins Dave Mallett, David Jaques and Paul Powell who were all part of the all-conquering Leytonstone/Ilford side of 1981/82. Very experienced player who holds record for most appearances for Leytonstone/Ilford (over 450).

TONY PAMPHLETT (Central Defender) – Signed in 1981 from Kent League club Cray Wanderers. Established himself as one of the best central defenders outside the Football League and has attracted the attention of Crystal Palace, Charlton and Orient.

FRANCIS COWLEY (Midfield) – Former Chelsea, Derby County and Wimbledon player who was an outstanding player for Tooting & Mitcham from whom he was signed in the summer of 1983. Whilst with Tooting Francis was in the England Semi-Professional squad.

STEVE ROBINSON (Midfield) – Now in his fifth season at Dartford Steve, a former Arsenal Youth Team player, graduated to the First Team via Dartford's Youth Team.

TERRY GLYNN (Forward) – Signed in July 1984 for a small fee from Isthmian Leaguers Wycombe Wanderers for whom he was leading scorer with 24 goals in 38 games. Previously with Leytonstone/Ilford and Enfield.

TERRY SULLIVAN (Forward) – Highly-skilled forward who spent several seasons with Bishops Stortford for whom he scored the only goal in the 1980/81 F.A. Trophy Final. Signed by John Still at the start of last season. Supporters Player of the Year, 1984.

TONY BURMAN (Striker) – Signed six years ago from Queens Park Rangers after service with Charlton Athletic. Is currently Dartford's longest serving player. In his last game last season, at Sutton Coldfield, Tony reached two landmarks – 300 competitive games for Dartford and 100th goal.

PAUL "NICKY" CROWN (Forward) – Another highly-rated goalscorer who was signed in July 1984 from Barking for whom he was leading scorer for the last two seasons.

MARTIN COATES (Midfield) – An immensely popular player and regular goalscorer while at Dulwich Hamlet from whom he was signed in the summer of 1983.

BOB MAKIN (Full Back) – Another experienced defender who set an appearance record for Barking during a long career with the Isthmian club. Has represented the Isthmian League and played for F.A. Representative XIs. Signed from Dagenham in 1983: a knee injury at Chelmsford meant that Bob missed the end of last season.

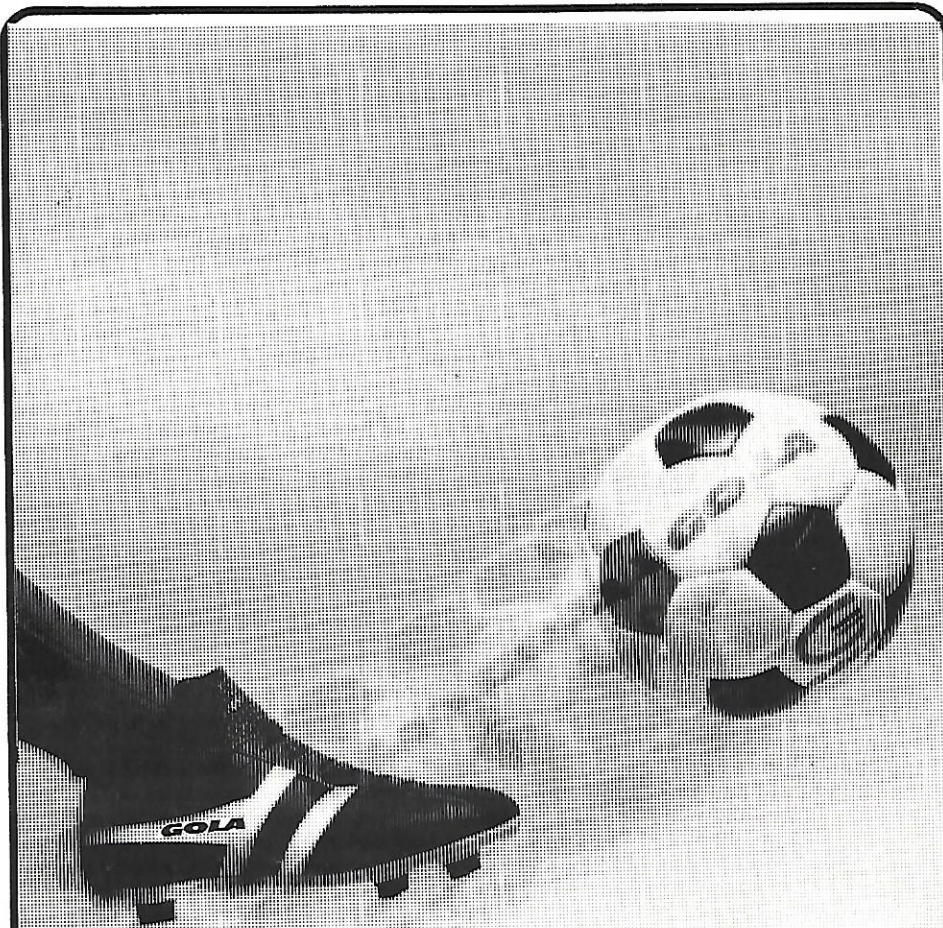

AROUND THE CLUBS

BOSTON UTD Ray O'Brien has been appointed assistant manager. An Eire international, he started his career with Shelbourne and moved to Manchester United before joining Notts County for a £45,000 fee. He spent ten seasons at Meadow Lane - setting a record in the 1979/80 season when he became the first full-back to finish a season as the leading goalscorer.

Other additions to the York Street squad include Ian Ladd, a defender from Southern League Corby Town (and formerly with Notts County, Peterborough United and Stamford) and striker Brian Thomson, who started his career with West Ham United before moving to Mansfield Town (£10,000) and King's Lynn.

DAGENHAM: Following the appointment of Ken Knighton (ex-Sheffield Wednesday coach and Sunderland/Orient manager) as manager after the departure of Ted Hardy, the Daggers have made a number of signings. These include striker Mark Blackhall from Chelmsford City, defender Chris Kinnear and midfielder John Watson from Maidstone United, midfielder Barry Little from Gillingham and striker/midfielder Robert Codner from Leicester City.

NUNEATON BOROUGH: League Runners-up Nuneaton Borough are likely to start the current campaign with virtually the same squad as last season. Utility player Eddie McGoldrick has joined the club from Kettering Town, whilst Bobby Parker has moved to Atherstone United.

Two former players - midfielders Barry Lowe and Ian Hendry - are featuring in the club's pre-season friendlies and could be re-signing for the Manor Park outfit. Paul Culpin (the leading goalscorer in the League last season) and Richard Hill have already returned from summer soccer in Finland.

YEOVIL TOWN: Ian MacFarlane, former assistant to Gordon Milne at Leicester City and manager at Carlisle, has become Yeovil Town's fifth manager in the past twelve months. Striker Dave Platt has rejoined the club from Weymouth - Gary Borthwick making a return in the opposite direction.

A profit of more than £4,000 will be reported at the club's annual meeting, the first time the club has made a profit for 14 years.

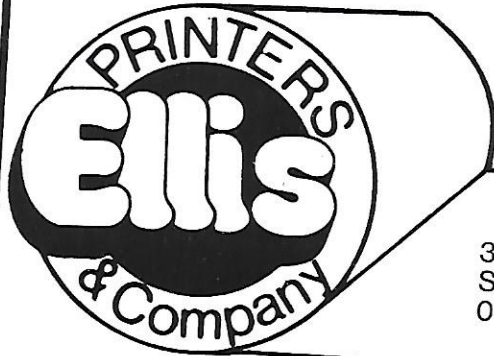
