

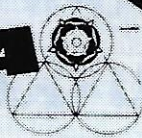

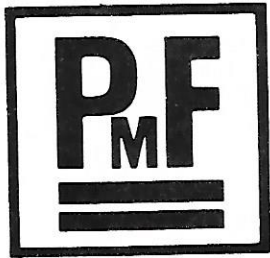

A KEN BATES' BLAST!

THE Gola League came in for a real boost recently from that powerhouse luminary of the Canon League's First Division, Ken Bates. And simultaneously a blast of strident criticism was levelled at the Fourth Division by the controversial chairman of Chelsea, who has gone on record as saying that he could name ten clubs in the Fourth Division who 'would not stand a chance in the Gola League'.

Doubtless sweet music indeed in the ears of the Gola League's Management Committee, and I have no doubt that chairman Jim Thompson and secretary Peter Hunter are happy men indeed, with words like this from such an eminent man in the game with which to go into the New Year.

Not content with that, Mr. Bates, continuing his attack on some Division clubs, went on to say: "Their grounds stink, their facilities are lousy, and their organisation is non-existent". "When you look at Fourth Division sides consistently unsuccessful you wonder if they would be better off having a breather. That would give those sides in the more enterprising areas a chance".

Mr. Bates, addressing a recent Gola League Management Committee lunch, wants automatic promotion and relegation between the Canon and Gola Leagues. He said, in the course of a most interesting speech: "A village team can reach the pinnacle of Non-league football - and the smallest Fourth Division outfit can get into the First Division. But what you cannot do is to bridge the gap. That hypocrisy annoys me".

And so say all of us! Let us hope that the words of Mr. Bates bear fruit in Lancaster Gate and St. Annes-on-Sea sooner, rather than later, and then maybe the oft-talked about 'pyramid' can really and truly have its rightful meaning

How heartening it is to see the early-season improvement in Gola League gates generally fully maintained, and the Holiday period figures made exceptionally fine reading. You won't need too many guesses to discover who topped the Boxing Day figures! Yes, you've guessed it - our old friends Yeovil, holding the rest of the clubs up yet notching up nearly 2,200 for the visit of Weymouth on Boxing Day! It only makes news at Yeovil if the DO NOT achieve a thousand paying spectators, and with a meagre 11 points to show from 22 games or thereabouts THAT can't be bad!!

We of course were thrilled (more so as it was so unexpected having regard to it being the last shopping day before Christmas) to get over 1000 for Altrincham's visit. After Yeovil, Kettering took the honours with 1,358 against Barrow.

You will have noticed Kidderminster's rapid climb up the table in recent weeks, and for the visit of Telford on Boxing Day they notched up 1,370 - their best of the season. Yet there are one or two black spots in this good news fiesta, however, for both Bath City (despite a tremendous run right up the table) and Scarborough show falling gates. Neither clocked up 800 on Boxing Day.

Finally, we are delighted to welcome two old Wealdstone favourites back tonight - Alan Humphries, who was our manager when we took the plunge into semi-pro. soccer and who is now in charge at Hillingdon. Nice also to see Paul Waites again for the mercurial Paul made many friends on the terraces here.

Hillingdon on the Move

HILLINGDON'S home, the noted 'Leas Stadium' will sadly soon be no more. This will be the club's last season on the ground, which has been sold to property developers. Fortunately, Hillingdon have acquired another ground in Uxbridge, but are still trying to negotiate an improved lease from the local Council prior to moving there.

If all goes well, the new ground will be at Hillingdon House Farm (behind Uxbridge Cricket Club), where they will take over the football pitch in the middle of an athletic track.

However, to quote the old cliché there is a long way to go yet and as we are all aware football is anything but predictable – a couple of good wins away from home could put us right back in the hunt again. At least we are not in the position of Yeovil – 1,000 plus home gates or not!!

Brian Hall recently asked for comments regarding the possibility of Sunday Football and perhaps this is a good opportunity to express my own feelings on the subject. I have been very much in favour of a Sunday "experiment" for a long while now and I am convinced that combined with adequate pre-match advertising and publicity could add as much as 300-400 to the gate. I am sure that the major reason why we obtained the large gate versus Altrincham was that Watford and Harrow Borough were playing away from home. It was obviously an attractive game and a good 'draw' but we **cannot** compete with a First Division side playing 6 miles away from Wealdstone. I may have got it completely wrong but I would have thought that one or two matches on a Sunday would be a very interesting experiment that could have very worthwhile financial benefits.

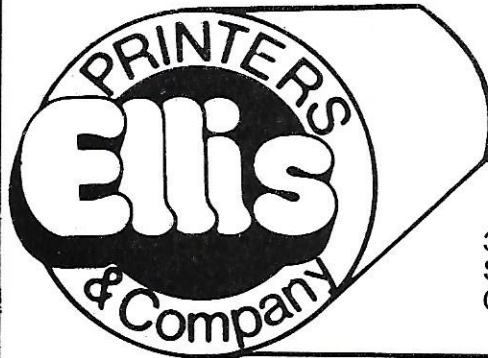

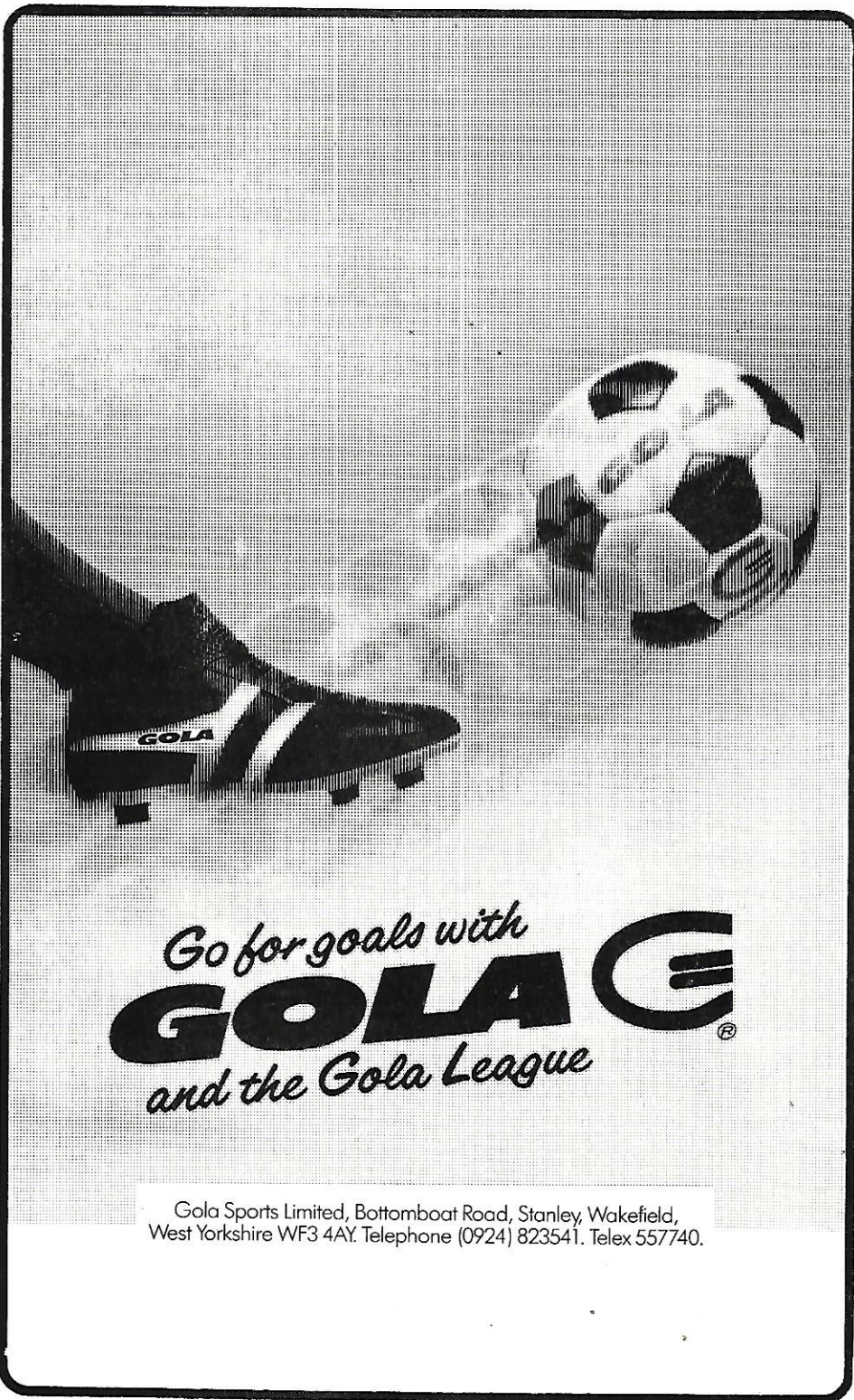

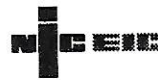

The Price is wrong

I think it was the headline "Fash up for grabs" that brought it home to me. Here was a chap, for whom one manager, you might have heard of, forked out one million pounds four years ago, being discarded by a club struggling to get away from the Second Division's nether regions. Could there ever have been a more striking insult of any manager's eye for talent?

By now the arms were outstretched for the Rothmans Yearbook on the top shelf. Quick scan down the index and there we were . . . record transfers. And look what we've found - the definitive list of ten players involved in million pound deals between English clubs. When you ask yourself what the players are doing now, it becomes a rather disturbing list.

Justin Fashanu - we've already mentioned; Steve Daley - last heard of playing in the ever-declining North American Soccer League; Kevin Reeves - poor chap has packed up because of injury; Ian Wallace - recently transferred to Sunderland for not even a twelfth of the fee Forest paid Coventry for him. Gary Birtles - nearing recovery from a serious back injury which has kept him out since last summer; Clive Allen - in the reserves; some cynics might say that Andy Gray is only in the Everton side because Adrian Heath is injured; "What of Kenny Sanson?" I hear you cry - well he's the exception which proves the rule; Trevor Francis - currently falling over every twenty yards for Sampdoria - but what odds will you give me his hamstrings and groins don't see the season out.

And so on to number ten - Manchester United and England captain Bryan Robson, whose talent is undeniable. And yet his recent accident is perhaps the best illustration of the folly of investing one million pounds in a commodity as fragile, vulnerable and unpredictable as a footballer. Through nobody's fault but his own, the best player in the country has missed six crucial weeks of the season because he failed to realise that he can't run through advertising hoardings.

The catalogue of misfortune is indeed disturbing. You get the feeling that someone, somewhere, is trying to tell us that no footballer is worth one million pounds. It's simply not a sound or rational investment. I mean how many businesses could survive without their most valuable asset for six weeks during one of the busiest times of the year.

Could it also be that for some of the million pound men, the strain of carrying around such a price tag is too much to bear? After all, to live up to such a billing is awfully difficult. People are always expecting you to conjure up the defence-splitting pass, the match-winning goal, or the match-saving tackle. Performances are either very, very good or very, very bad. It's easy to try too hard, subsequently lose form and confidence, and then be sucked inexorably into the whirlpool of failure and eventually oblivion.

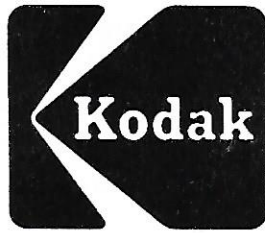
Thankfully, it seems that the days of the million pound transfer, while hardly an anachronism, are certainly less frequent than in the early 1980s. For that we must be grateful, because the bulk of the millions so far have been sinfully mis-spent. The success-rate - or lack of it to date - should serve as warning to those eager to write out seven figure cheques. You don't automatically get value for money.

F.A. PLAN THWARTED

THE F.A. have decided to scrap their proposals to limit full membership of the Association to Clubs in certain leagues, following resistance from County Associations and Leagues up and down the country. We always did think this revolutionary proposal was a non-starter!

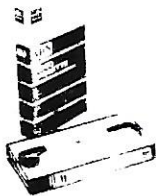
