

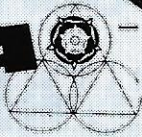

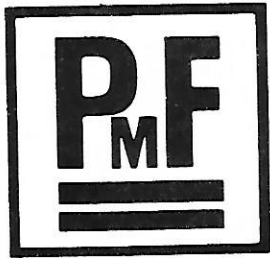

## Gola Clubs say "No" to League Proposals

At a recent meeting of all member clubs in Birmingham, it was decided that the Gola League were unable to accept the proposals by the Football League for the future promotion and relegation between the two leagues.

The basis of the decision is that Gola clubs were of the opinion that, in every instance, the proposals – rather than being an improvement on the present situation – would actually legislate against the possibility of a club gaining promotion to the Football League.

The proposals as set out would not only legislate against current Gola League clubs but would also inhibit the opportunity of a club relegated from the Football League being able to speedily return should it be successful in its first season in the Gola League.

The Gola League still believes that it is in the best interests of football in this country that a system of interchange is established which would remove the annual undignified scramble for votes, allowing successful and ambitious clubs to play their part in the development of senior football as, for example, have Oxford Utd, Shrewsbury, Peterborough and Wimbledon in the past.

A letter has been sent to all First and Second Division clubs' chairmen and secretaries fully explaining the reasons why the Gola League are unable to accept the Associate Members' proposals. It is hoped that further discussions will be held in order that a formula can be agreed to meet the interests of all concerned.

This season's FA Cup has again underlined the stature of the Gola League! Gola clubs have faced Canon League opposition in 28 matches (including replays) this season with the Gola club being at home in only 12 of these games. A summary of the results is as follows: Played 28, Won 9, Drawn 7, Lost 12, Goals for 33, Against 39. We all thrilled at Telford's magnificent performance in reaching the 5th round, and I was delighted to send a telegram to Stan Storton at Goodison Park on behalf of everyone at Wealdstone.

Meanwhile, a hearty welcome back to all our fans after another spell of the Ice Age! And it is with particular pleasure that we greet our old friends from Welling Utd, who are going great guns in the Southern League Premier Division, lying in 5th place but with games in hand and only three points behind the leaders.

They came an unexpected cropper on Tuesday night though, losing 2-1 at Southall in the London Senior Cup on a ground, I understand, which made the result an absolute lottery. I am certain they will give us a tremendous battle today for the right to go into the quarter-finals.

Welling, of course, have an outstanding player well know to us in John Bartley, for whom they paid Maidstone Utd £8,000 just before Christmas. John was originally transferred from Welling to Millwall for a fee of £12,000 after scoring a fantastic total of 400 goals for the Park View Road club. So the wheel has turned full circle.

We go into this vital match without our leading goal scorer Mark Graves, who is still nursing a knock, but are fortunate to have such an able stand-by as Andy Graham, who in his few appearances so far has become a firm favourite. Incidentally, it will be a good idea for supporters now to keep their eyes on future fixtures more or less every day, as it could well be that games will be arranged at short notice and it could be that we shall not have a lot of time to publicise them.

**Barrow** have signed former Crewe Alex., Bury and Mossley defender Benny Phillips from Witton Albion, together with midfielder Andy Wharton (ex-Burnley and Chester) and winger Ronnie Goodlass (Ex-Everton and Fulham). Utility man Nigel Keen has re-signed for the club after a spell in South Africa, whilst David Bradford and John Butler have left the club.

**Maidstone's** Neil Ayrton has moved to Dagenham. A transfer fee has not yet been disclosed. Leaving the club to settle in Western Australia is Matt Stock.

**Worcester City**, former Arsenal and England winger George Armstrong has taken over as manager of Worcester City following the sacking of Bobby Shinton, who has moved to Weymouth as a player. Armstrong spent 17 years at Highbury, playing a record number of games for Arsenal, since when he has been assistant manager at Fulham (during the time when they gained promotion to the Second Division), a player at Trowbridge Town, assistant to Malcolm Allison at Middlesbrough and, prior to his move to Worcester, coach at Queen's Park Rangers. General manager during his spell with Trowbridge Town was Tony Senter, who now occupies a similar position at St. George's Lane.

**Yeovil Town** are interested in signing Fareham Town's 22-year-old striker Kevin Bartlett, who is rated by the Southern League club at £10,000. Huish boss Gerry Gow arranged a friendly in midweek to have a look at Bartlett in action and plans to look at him in action again this week. Defender Nigel Jarvis has left the club.

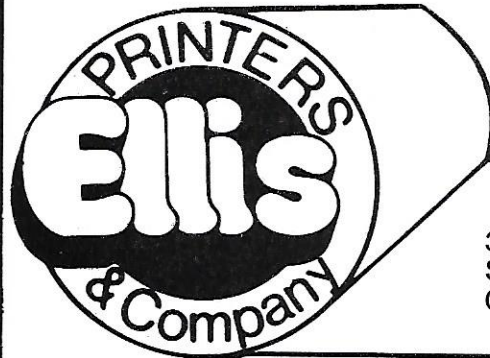

## *Introducing Welling United*

**TERRY JESSOP:** Goalkeeper, aged 28, signed from Hastings United a year ago, and was formerly with Maidstone United.

**COLIN FORD:** Former Gillingham professional, signed 5 years ago at the age of 18, and has now made over 250 appearances for the club.

**ADRIAN LEMOINE:** Defender, signed from Maidstone shortly after the start of the current season. Had previously been a member of the Stones first team squad having progressed through their youth team.

**PAUL SUMMERSBY:** Defender, now in his fifth season at Welling, having began in the youth team at the age of 15. Established himself as a first team regular this season following injury to Ian Starkey early in October.

**NIGEL RANSOM:** Team Captain, long serving central defender, having joined Welling as a 15 year old over 11 years ago. Is now approaching his 500th game for the club.

**RAY BURGESS:** Midfielder, in his 13th season with the club having progressed through youth, reserve, and Intermediate football with Welling. Club Captain, recently made his 700th appearance. Aged 28.

**STUART WHITE:** Former Charlton and Gillingham apprentice, now in his 4th season with the club, during which time he has played over 150 games, and scored an average of 10 goals per year from a midfield position.

**JOHN PARRY:** Young midfielder who recently rejoined the club after a spell at Millwall where he was a regular in their Reserve Team. Aged 19.

**TERRY WARREN:** Striker, signed 4 years ago from Aveley, and was formerly with Tilbury. Has been a regular scorer since joining, and has netted 12 so far this season.

**ADRIAN FOLEY:** Versatile player who joined 3 years ago after playing for Maidstone and Sutton united. Is the son of Millwall Ass/Manager Theo.

**GARY ABBOTT:** Another former youth team product, and a player who has filled in on several occasions this season with considerable success. 19 year old striker.

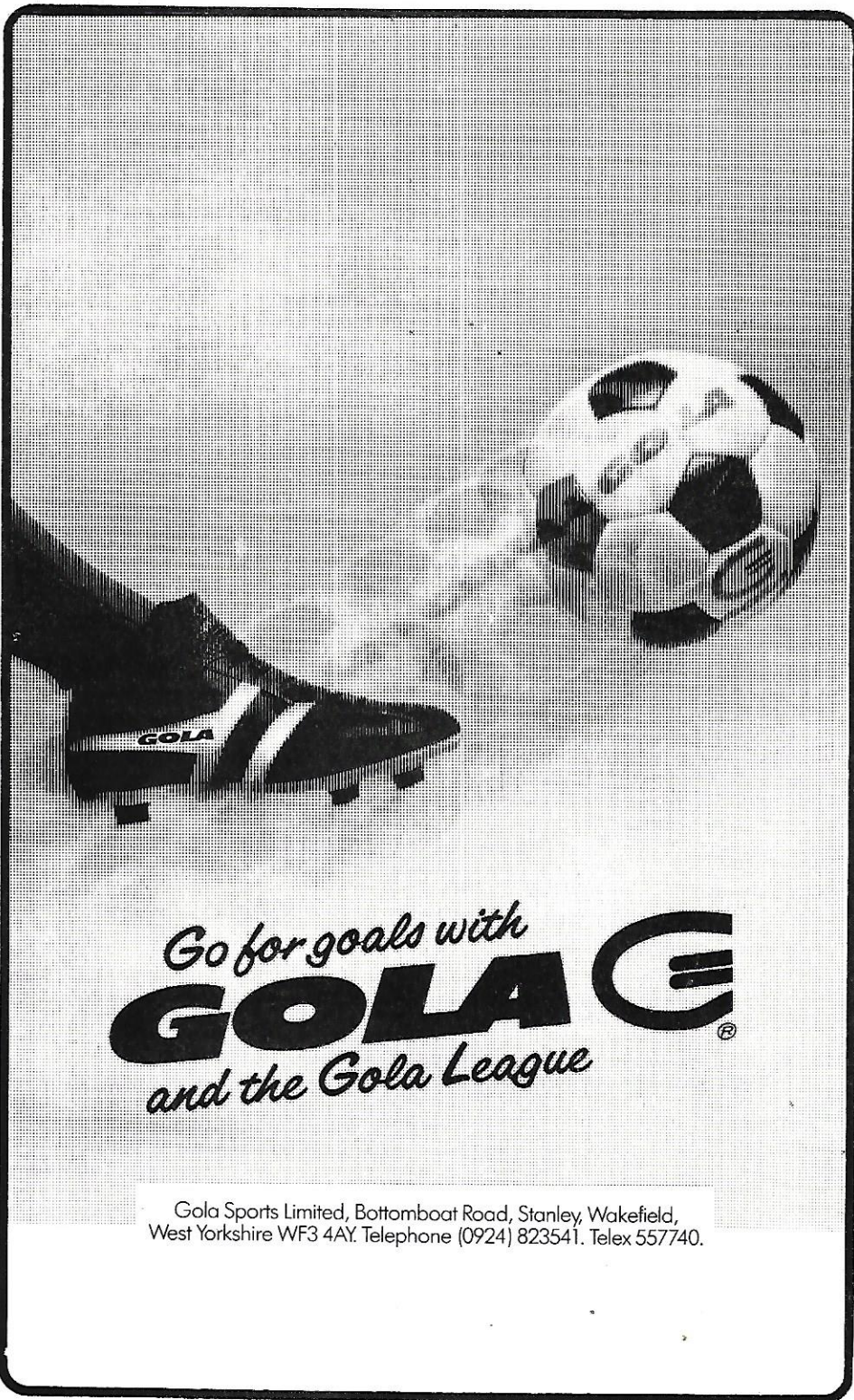

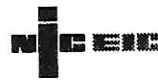

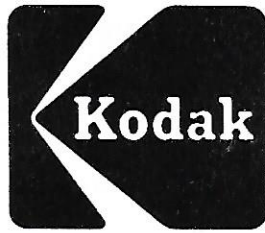
