FRICKLEY - FAMOUS FOR COALS, **GOALS AND BRASS**

WE are delighted to greet the Directors, Players and Supporters of Frickley Athletic for this afternoon's vital quarter-final match in the FA Trophy. We congratulate Frickley on having a splendid season, and apart from today's game being of vital importance, it will surely be one of the hardest of the entire season. Much is at stake, for neither club has yet achieved the dizzy heights of a Trophy semi-final, let alone a place at Wembley!

Brian Hall saw Frickley inexplicably lose at home 3-1 to Maidstone on Tuesday, but came away firmly conviced that the better side had lost – especially when it is remembered that the Yorkshire side missed two penalties!! In fact Brian tells me what a really good side our opponents are, and as their secretary, Mr. Bates informs me they play better away from home (and realising that we ourselves are also perhaps better away!) then today should be a real thriller!

In Gary Hooley, Frickley boasts the League's top goalscorer, with a sensational total of 31 goals so far, including 22 in the league, remembering that Frickley have a lot of league games in hand,

Frickley Athletic is based a South Elmsall, in West Yorkshire, the centre of the largest coalfield in Britain, and in fact three of the team are miners. The area has another claim to fame, for the worldfamous Grimethorpe Colliery Brass Band hails from the area, while the Carlton Main Frickley Colliery Band often tours abroad, and sells a lot of long-playing records.

If today's match ends in a draw, then the replay will be at Frickley on Tuesday, in which case, we shall entertain Yeovil Town here on THURSDAY. If there is a definite result, Yeovil will be our visitors on TUESDAY. And don't forget that we are at home to Weymouth next Saturday.

As many of you will have read, Fred Deanus, the Club's vice-chairman is no longer with us, having asssumed chairmanship of Ruislip Town in the Hellenic League, and as a result, has resigned from our Board of Directors. Fred came to Lower Mead Stadium in 1979 as chairman, and played a huge part in keeping the Club going at that time, when we had serious financial problems, and a year or so later stepped down in favour of David Morritt. We sincerely thank Fred, and his wife Val for their valued support over the last six years, and wish Fred every success at Ruislip.

Which brings me to another point which will interest a lot of our older supporters. A guest here today is none other than former Director and Treasurer Harry Benjamin, a really great character who did a tremendous job for Wealdstone for many years before business circumstances forced his resignation. The very first thing Harry does on a Sunday is to see how Wealdstone got on, and his infectious banter on the team coach is missed to this very day! Oddly enough Harry, who works at Harefield, has recently become involved with Harefield Utd. of the Isthmian League, who are, I understand, hopeful of getting former Stone Terry Dyson to become manager. Terry was recently sacked by Borehamwood and has been helping out another ex-Wealdstone man Eddie Presland at Hendon.

Paul Cotter, a 23-year-old goalkeeper from Hendon, who did so splendidly for us at Maidstone last Saturday, has now been signed by Brian Hall as cover for Bob Iles, who went into hospital on Tuesday night with a hand injury. Bob's recovery might not be complete for today – hence Paul being named in goal.

We are, of course, without Gary Donnellan and Lee Holmes today, both suspended – Gary for his sending off at Barrow, and Lee for amassing too many points!

It's a Fixture Chief's Nightmare!

A lot of our supporters have thought it most odd that, in view of the backlog of our fixtures, we have not had any midweek games this past formight. Well, let me tell you that secretary Peter Braxton has been burning a lot of midnight oil in recent weeks trying desperately to get a midweek fixture but has met with refusals everywhere he has tried. In fact at this time of the season, and especially this year when the bad weather caused such chaos, Peter's job is a nightmare . .

For instance he had finally succeeded in fixing up a Gola League match at Barnet last Tuesday only to hear at the virtual 11th hour that Herts County FA had stepped in and ordered Barnet to play a County cup game. This sort of thing happens quite often, and in recent weeks the Clubs we had been hoping to play were engaged in either County Cup matches, Bob Lord Trophy ties or other league fixtures.

Time to act by Toby Jackson

In a season when both Frickley and Wealdstone will amass a certain pride of achievment, not least for progress in the F.A. Trophy, it is indeed unfortunate that both clubs must also look back on their share of unprecedented crowd problems.

While Chelsea Chairman Ken Bates has alternated between defence and condemnation of his own resident hooligan element, everyone involved with the Non-League game has a clear duty to ensure that this sickness of the modern game is not allowed to spread beyond the Football league into our circles.

Earlier in the season our friends from Frickley had to endure the unwanted presence of an unruly party from Stalybridge Celtic. A mobile faction purposely selected a game of some importance to travel to with the specific intention of violent disruption, and succeeded in their aim.

At Barrow two weeks ago, our loyal supporters numbered in their midst their own moronic minority. Willing adversaries were found in a delightful group of wine-swigging, knife-brandishing louts from the Cumbrian town who embarrassed the majority of hospitable Barrow fams by their presence. This quaint scene was further enhanced by the most inconsistent referee I have seen in 24 years of Non-League soccer whose handling of the game did absolutely nothing to reduce tension on the terraces; and by some unique positioning by the local constabulary reminiscent of Scottish goalkeepers.

If the problem of ho

If the problem of hooliganism cannot be easily solved on crowded Football League terraces, surely it can be stamped out at Non-League level where a family, social atmosphere has always been prevalent. Club funds would not stretch to employment of Ken Bates' suggested trained "Hooligan Squads" to put these thugs behind bars where they belong, nor would our attendances justify such action. Yet these louts stick out more than Andy Gray's elbows – glazed expressions from a mixture of alcohol and an absence of substance between the ears; a vocabulary that seldom stretches beyond four letters; little interest in the game in general – these people do not (or cannot) read any of the Non-League publications and view an impending ruck with more enthusiasm than the progress of the club that has the misfortune of their allegiance.

It is time for Club officials, Supporters Clubs, local police and, on the pitch, referees and players, to adopt a more responsible attitude, and with the belated backing of a lenient judiciary to ensure that the Non-League game stays clear of this cancer of modern society before it kills our source of

pleasure, as it is already killing soccer at Senior and International level

GOLA GATES UP

WITH at least nine clubs still serious contenders, the race for the Gola League championship looks like maintaining excitement right up to the last matches of the season. It is indeed building up to a spectacular finale!

One of the most heartening aspects is that so far Gola League attendances are up by 8% compared with last season. With 70% of the current season completed, the average 'gate' so far this season is 858 – an increase of 60% per match compared with the 1983/84 season.

Thirteen of the 20 clubs in membership of the League both this season and last are showing an increase. The biggest gains are by Yeovil (up 197), Weymouth (179), Kettering (168), Wealdstone (140). Yeovil (1,347), Worcester (1,286) and Kettering (1,185) have the highest average attendances.

Dagenham have re-signed striker John McCombe, their leading scorer last season, while player manager John Ryan, who parted company with Cambridge Utd. last month, has signed for Maidstone. Weymouth striker Shaun Penny has moved to Southern League Forest Green Rovers.
