

GARY'S THOUGHTS ON FOOTBALL – 'Football is unlucky in that a minority of people use it as a platform for violence. Overall I think the standard of football is better. Individuals have more skill, pace and stamina. Players are more complete now and this has been harnessed to the needs of the team rather than the individual making football more enjoyable.


GARY'S THOUGHTS ON WEALDSTONE - I have never played in front of better supporters, both for noise and perhaps more importantly for the banter. Although I am the sort of player who switches off from the crowd once I get onto the pitch. The away support is always appreciated, especially at the important games - they seem to make more noise at Altrincham on a Monday night than they do at Wealdstone on a Saturday. People within the club are nice to know, I never got involved socially with anyone at previous clubs. What makes us such a good team is that everybody has the same incessant will to win and although this may result in flare-ups between players, it is only when the chips are down that the winners come through. It amazes me how so many people with similar temperament can stick together through nine months of competition.

GENERAL – Although I am a placid person, I enjoy the physical side of football. I hate losing, this sometimes leads to an uncharacteristic loss of temper.

How about a F.A. Cup run this year, lads?

A special hello to our friends from Barrow and to my opposite number from Holker Street, John Murray. I had the pleasure of producing a new enamel official lapel badge for Barrow during the summer, so I hope that any of their supporters who have not picked one up from John yet will call in at the Club Shop today. Barrow have an extremely healthy London branch to their Supporters club so hopefully there will be a good demand for the new badges this afternoon.

It is hoped that the new edition of Pyramid Magazine will be on sale today. Pyramid is coming out monthly this season instead of fortnightly. There is sadly no news regarding Non-League Digest which, it appears, has ceased to be produced. Also on sale today are two excellent publications; firstly "A Guide to Non-League Football" produced by Sutton United covering the Gola, Isthmian, Southern and Northern Premier League grounds with an abundance of useful information for just £1.50. Secondly, there is "The Travelling Supporters Guide to Football League Clubs" which has now been extended to cover the Gola League. This glossy publication retails at £2.75.

Orders can now be placed at the Club Shop for the 1986 Non-League Directory which will be coming out in late September. The annual costs £6-95 as last year, although there is also a hardbacked version available at £9-95. The annual covers over 600 Non-League clubs and is illustrated by over 400 photos. The annual will only be on sale here to those who have placed advance orders so please book to reserve your copy. A £5 deposit is required with all orders.

Supporters who have come to our home pre-season friendlies will have noticed a new look shop with an extra counter and some new additions to our stocks of souvenirs. Thanks must go to Pete Worby and Bob Dugaurd in particular for their efforts in the carpentry department. Our new souvenirs include Wealdstone FC wrist-bands at just 90p per pair, key fobs at 75p and car strip visors at £2.00 each. Other items are in the pipeline including a special commemorative pennant recalling our F.A. Trophy and Gola League Double-winning season.

INTRODUCING BARROW

KEVIN BROCKBANK: Age 25. Goalkeeper. A local boy who first joined the Club as a teenager and who made his first team debut against Worcester City in April 1980. His chances have, in the past, been restricted by first Kevin Thomas and latterly Peter McDonnell, but a run of 11 games at the end of last season established him. He has now made 26 first team appearances.

MICK RICHMOND Age 30. Full back. Mick began his career with his local team Preston North End and appeared in the Central League team. Brian McManus signed him for Barrow in March 1979 for £1,500. He quickly established himself at Holker Street, Player of the Year in 1979-80 and he made 221 appearances for the Club, scoring 7 goals, before leaving during 1984-85. He re-joined the Club in the close season and it is hoped he is as successful as before.

ANDY WRIGHT: Age 21. Fullback. A reserve team regular for several season, Andy made his first team debut last season against Dartford in September and although he did not really establish himself in his total of 9 appearances, he gave glimpses of good things to come.

GLEN SKVINGTON: Age 23. Defender. A local lad who joined the Club initially in August 1979 and, in the initial APL season, he appeared 32 times. The following Summer, he signed for Derby County and he made 46 appearance scoring twice. In 1983, he joined Southend United and made 4 appearances rejoining Barrow in the Spring of 1984. Last season although suffering from injury, he appeared 31 times.

JAMIE FRANKLAND: Centre half. A close season acquisition from Vickers Sports Club. He has also played for Crooklands Casuals – a side based at Dalton, and has shown signs of being a worthy successor to two recent home grown defenders, Ken Gordon and David Large.

ROYSTON TAYLOR: Age 28. Midfield. Blackpool born, Royston began his career with Preston North End. A brief spell followed with Blackburn Rovers. He joined Barrow in August 1979. Until late Autumn 1984, he was a regular member of the first team squad, he made 265 appearances scoring 25 times before moving up the Cumbrian coast to join former Barrow boss Mick Taylor (no relation) at Workington. He returned to the fold during the close season.

TERRY PARK: Age 28. Midfield. A Liverpudlian, Terry began his senior career with Wolverhampton Wanderers, moved on to Stockport County where he appeared 90 times, before moving to Minnesota Kicks. He returned to Edgeley Park for a second spell and made 72 appearances. His last British Club were Bury where he appeared 21 times. He joined the Club in May 1985.

WAYNE ASPINALL: Age 21. Utility. Born in Wigan, Wayne joined his home-town Club and played 7 times in Division 3 before joining Barrow just before the transfer deadline in March 1985. He made 8 first team appearances before the end of the season, scoring once.

NEIL BRAMHALL: Age 21. Striker. Neil began his football career with Blackpool as an apprentice and made 3 first team appearances (all as substitute) before being released and joining Working Reds in the NPL. He quickly settled there and joined us during the close season.

EDDIE KENNEDY: Forward. A former junior from the Wigan area, he was one of Maurice Whittle's first signings and he is reckoned to be an outstanding goal-scoring prospect.

RONNIE GOODLASS: Age 32. Winger. Ron joined Everton in July 1971 and made his first team debut four years later. He made only 35 first team appearances scoring twice before moving to Holland where he spent spells with NAC Breda and FC Den Haag. Since he has played for Fulham (22 times), Scunthorpe United (9 times) and Tranmere Rovers (20 times) before Brian Kidd signed him in February 1985. He played 19 times scoring twice.

ANDY FORBES: Age 23. Fullback. Another player off the local production line, Andy first appeared in the team in an APL Cup tie at Scarborough in September 1980. He has worked hard at his game, and by the end of last season had played 26 times for the first team.

Whatever happens in the coming months we must remember that Harrow has a side it can truly be


Looking back to last season, what a season it was. Come the sunny, Wembley-bound days of May, it made the long, hard slog of the winter seem worthwhile.
