




This is Sutton's first season in the Capital League and they are currently bottom of the table with us one place above them. They have been involved in several high scoring matches to date, their results are as follows:- (HOME): Wins over Slough and Wokingham (both 3-0), Aldershot (3-2); 1-1 draws against Wealdstone and Wycombe; and defeats against Barnet (0-4), Brentford (0-4), Cambridge (0-3), Colchester (2-4), Leyton Orient (1-2) and Southend (0-7) (AWAY): A win at Wokingham (8-0); a 2-2 draw at Wycombe; and defeats at Aldershot (0-5), Barnet (2-5), Brentford (1-7), Cambridge (1-4 Colchester (1-2), Leyton Orient (0-3), Slough (0-5) and Southend (1-7).
