At Lower Mead on Saturday we completed the double over our Kent opponents Bromley. Hugh Lindsay, Charlie Townsend and Jim Cooley were our scorers. With a rearranged side Eddie Dillsworth played for the Isthmian League at Hitchin, Brian Allen switched to left-half and John Wortley filling one of the wing positions.

Woking Football Club

Though one cannot trace a record of the meeting at which the Woking Football Club was founded—there was no local paper at that time—but it seems clear that the Club were playing football matches around 1887-88; according to some records Woking played Weybridge Saints on January 27th, 1888 and lost by fifteen goals to nil. But the really great days of Woking Football Club came in 1906 with the signing of two great players of star class, Charlie Adams, goalkeeper and A. H. (Daisy) Bell, full-back, both first choice for Surrey. In 1907-8 Woking astonished the Amateur Football world by reaching the last 64 in

the F.A. Cup and playing Bolton Wanderers at Bolton on January 11th, 1908. This played a great part in getting Woking on the map in the Amateur world for in 1911 they were invited to join the Isthmian League.

Like us all and still better things to come, for on April 12th before a crowd of 71,000 people at Wembley Woking won the Amateur Cup by defeating Ilford by three goals to nil and the path to Wembley went like this: Aveley 6—1, Hendon 3—1 (that rings a bell), Hayes 5—1, Finchley 3—2 and Barnet 3—2 at Brentford after a 1—1 draw at Fulham. Woking is a fine club with fine floodlighting and are always pleased to receive you. So to close our season for 1965/66 we could have no better visitors and on behalf of the Wealdstone Football Club, welcome to Officials, Players and Supporters from Woking, nice to have you as our guests his evening, hope you enjoy your short stay and may the best team win.

Our hearty congratulations to Hugh Lindsay on receiving the Soccer Star Magazine Amateur Footballer of the Year Award.
