TOMMY MAC SAYS



Today I would like to plead with our fans and comment on this disease which is ruining the greatest game in the world, summed up in one word — **Hooliganism**.

Firstly I would like to reminisce to the days when good old rivalry between the football fans of this country was the 'in thing' and the height of this rivalry was on Derby days between local teams.

I have seen it on many occasions: the crowds walking to the matches with their scarves, and the rosettes on many a proud chest, jokes flying back and forth between supporters mainly on what his team was going to do to the other's team, with each side giving as good as the other. It was said in Sheffield that the Derby was the topic for weeks in the steel works, shops, etc., before the game and after, with the winning team's supporters making hay while the sun shone, thinking that next time they may be the ones beaten. In the North, round the mining areas, it has been said (to quote): 'When the football teams are doing well the output of coal was usually greater.'

Yes, I think we have got to get back to those days for the good of football. Today we have the so-called 'football supporters', mainly the young people, who gather in gangs to make their way to the match and on the way frightening people, fighting and destroying property. This disease is spreading over the country and keeping supporters away from the matches, which means the clubs lose revenue they need to improve the grounds, etc.

This nation, which consists of England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales, is a football nation, and football is in our blood. That is why, in my opinion, it is our national sport and we would be lost without it.

So I plead with you hooligan fans (who may be reading these notes), not for the good old days but for today and the tomorrows of football. If you would just stop for a moment and think, it was your parents who made this game what it is today for you, their children, to enjoy. What, I ask, are you going to leave your children? It won't be much if things carry on as they are at present and the clubs are forced to bring in security and safety measures such as pens for spectators, identity passes to get into grounds, and so on.

Yes, what are your children going to say? That's right first time: 'Our parents must have been a right lot of **hooligans**.'

How we stop this disease I don't know. The only thing I can suggest is that we all begin by looking at ourselves and following this quote: 'Always imitate the behaviour of the winner when you lose.'

So I ask you, please, please, stop this disease and begin today, here at Aldershot, by being an example to all the visiting supporters with your behaviour, and make your ground a fit place for people to come and enjoy football.

Today we welcome Wealdstone Town and their supporters in this First Round proper of the F.A. Cup — which ends at every footballer's dream place, Wembley. It is Wembley that the players have in their minds when they go on to the field to do battle, because that is what it will be, they say — the Cup brings the best out of the teams. If that is so, then every supporter should see a good game today.

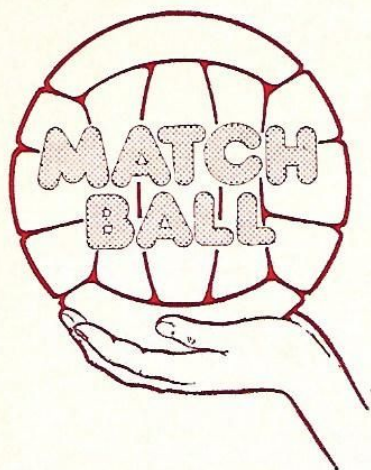

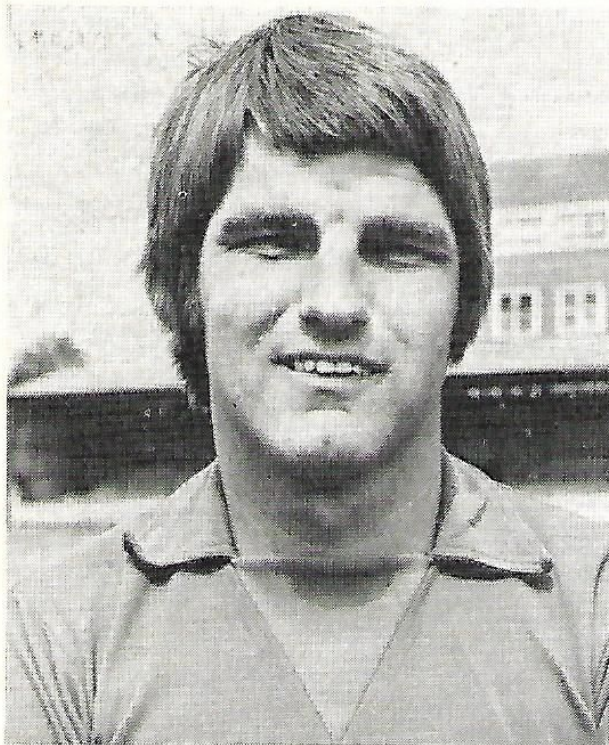

Facing Southern League opposition in the First Round of the F.A. Cup is of special interest to Aldershot as this was the first competition the Club applied to join successfully in 1926. Wealdstone have not had such a long association with the Southern League, having turned professional in 1971-72 and entering the First Division North that season.

Before this Wealdstone had been members of the Athenian League and in 1966-67 reached the final of the now defunct Amateur Cup and defeated Hendon at Wembley.

In 1972-73 they were transferred to the Southern Section of the Southern League's First Division and the following term won promotion to the Premier Division. They are currently enjoying an unbeaten run of success in League and Cup matches and are making an historic first appearance in Round One.

Last Saturday their leading scorer George Duck scored his 17th goal of the season and the term before last he broke the club's post-war record with 64 goals. Altogether he has scored more than 150 for them. Signed from Southend United when Wealdstone turned professional, he was formerly on the books of Millwall. Off the field he is a schools football teacher.

There are a number of other former Football League players in the squad—notably public house keeper centre-back John McCormick, a Scot who was at Crystal Palace and earlier with Aberdeen and Third Lanark. Others with League experience are midfield players Vince O'Kane (once of Charlton Athletic) and Bobby Moss (who was at Leyton Orient before going to

Barnet). Another midfield man, Ray Fulton, came from Orient and is a stonemason by profession.

There are a number of other former Football League players. Striker John Henderson was once on the books of Cardiff City before coming from Bedford, Chris Kinnear, the youngest in the side at 21, hails from West Ham and figures at right back, while Paul Fairclough, the sweeper, has also appeared for Liverpool Reserves.

John Watson, the left-back, won England youth international honours as a teenager when he was associated with Millwall, while striker Adriaan Eglite claims an Amsterdam birthplace and experience with the mighty Ajax.

Car salesman Bill Byrne toured Japan with Middlesex Wanderers a couple of years ago before turning professional with Wealdstone. The club's two goalkeepers are John Morton and Roy Mackenzie, the former having been at Dartford previously and the latter the senior choice before displaced by Morton.

Wealdstone's squad is completed by midfield players John Lewis and Jim Godfrey. Lewis is a close season capture from Romford, while Godfrey was with Barnet.

The club's manager is Eddie Presland, a full-back with Crystal Palace and West Ham in his playing days and an Essex County cricketer in the summer. His coach is probably even better known—Terry Dyson, a member of the Spurs forward line in their League and Cup double season of 1960-61.

An enthusiastic band of followers is likely to accompany them today as well, and has been estimated by a club official as being in the region of 1,000.

Our next visitors are Walsall who were in truth the team who finally saved Aldershot from relegation last season! When the Club was powerless to save itself, Walsall won at Watford and made it possible for us to remain in the Third Division.

The player whose goals brought about this relief was Terry Spinner, who is no stranger to the district. Spinner played his football as a lad in the area and graduated to schoolboy international class. He trained at the Recreation Ground before finally turning professional at Southampton.

Of course, the thanks due to Walsall will end dutifully the moment the match itself kicks off . . .

Apart from Spinner, Walsall have an experienced side which includes several who have been eyed by clubs in higher divisions. One of their most-sought-after players is Alan Buckley, who was with Nottingham Forest before moving to Walsall, where he has played in over 100 League games.

Another one-time Southampton player is right back Roger Fry, while the club's most experienced player is midfield man Nick Atthey, who has around 400 League appearances for his only senior side.

The much-travelled striker George Andrews boasts League experience with Cardiff, Southport and Shrewsbury, and he has topped 100 League goals in his career. He forms a strong striking partnership with Bernie Wright, the burly Merseyside-born player who is back at Walsall after a spell at Everton.

Goalkeeper Mick Kearns is an Eire international, and two newcomers this season from Nottingham Forest are winger Miah Dennehy, who has also played for the Republic of Ireland, and centre-back David Serella.

Older supporters may recall one particular fixture at the Recreation Ground with Walsall some few years ago, when Jack White scored on the final whistle but the goal was discounted and Aldershot had to be content with a 3-1 win instead of one at 4-1 and robbed the player of a hat-trick.

Furthermore, coach bookings will be taken for Wealdstone at the 'Radio Shots' office directly after the match, priced at 90p. We sincerely hope, of course, that Aldershot's name goes into the draw for the Second Round — preferably at the first attempt — but, whatever happens, may the best team win.

GROUND REGULATIONS

ADMISSION AND THE RIGHT TO REMAIN WITHIN THE GROUND IS STRICTLY ON CONDITION THAT THE SPECTATORS SHALL NOT COMMIT ANY OF THE FOLLOWING ACTS:—

1. Failing to comply with directions given by a Steward or Police Officer in uniform.

4. Throwing or discharging missiles.
5. Going on to the playing area or adjoining track.
6. Climbing on any building, wall or fence.

8. Jostling, swaying or otherwise interfering with the comfort of any spectator.
9. Singing obscene or indecent songs or using obscene or indecent language.
10. Making any offensive or insulting gesture.
11. The playing of transistor radios to the annoyance of other spectators.
12. Defacing any notice or advertisement displayed within the Club premises.

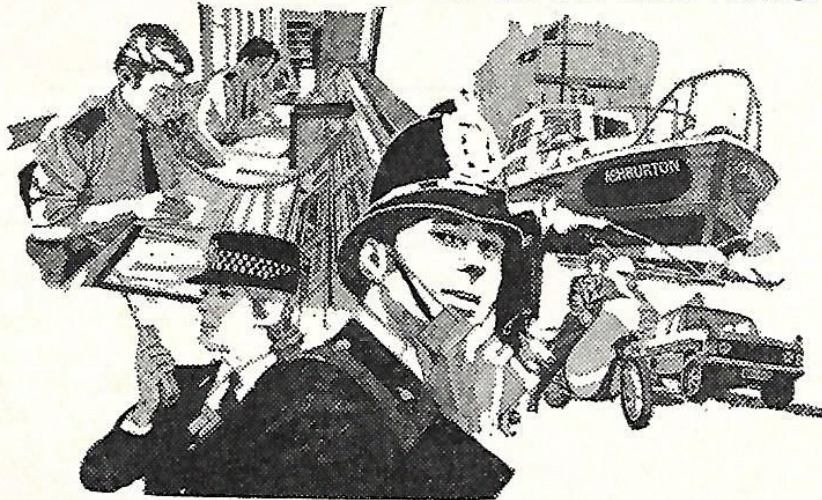

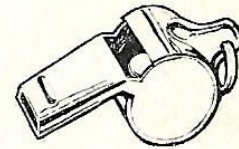
