INTRODUCING KIDDERMINSTER HARRIERS . . .

KIDDERMINSTER HARRIERS were formed in 1886 and until 1939 played in the Birmingham League in which they finished runners-up twice (1925 and 1935) and champions a similar number of times (1938 and 1939) when they also carried off the League Cup. The Club's planned move to the Southern League was disrupted by the War and did not finally take place until 1948.

The installation of floodlights in 1951 brought the distinction of the first F.A. Cup Tie under lights but financial problems saw a return to the Birmingham League until 1972 when they rejoined the Southern League. Promotion to the Premier Division culminated in 1983 with promotion to the Alliance Premier League in which they have finished 10th, 8th and 3rd. Last season, their centenary, fittingly brought an appearance in the Welsh Cup final where they narrowly lost in a replay to Wrexham. They are now to appear in their first Trophy Final match.

JIM ARNOLD: Vastly experienced goalkeeper who appeared in two Trophy Finals for Stafford Rangers before going full-time with Blackburn, Everton and Port Vale.

JOHN BARTON: full back and assistant Manager in his 3rd year at the Club. He cost Everton £30,000 from Worcester City and then moved to Derby.

KEVIN COLLINS: Made his Kidderminster debut on New Year's Day after his transfer from Alvechurch. Formerly with Shrewsbury and Boldmere St. Michaels.

CLIVE BOXALL: Joined Harriers a year ago from Cheltenham for whom he had two spells. Also with A.P. Leamington.

COLIN BRAZIER: Recent signing from Walsall where he played over 160 games. He also played for Birmingham, Wolves and Lincoln, and in the States.

MALCOLM HAZLEWOOD: Signed this season from Dudley Town. Two appearances in Halesowen's midfield at Wembley in Vase Finals.

GRAHAM MACKENZIE: Captain and midfield general who came from A.P. Leamington 3 years ago. Formerly with Wycombe and Cheltenham and a Middlesex Wanderer.

KIM CASEY: 73 goals in competitive matches last season, he completed his "century" for Kidderminster in 95 matches. 3 semi-pro caps, also played for Sutton Coldfield, Leamington and Gloucester.

PAUL DAVIES: Fourth season at Kidderminster, after experience with Cardiff and Dutch Club, S.C. Hercules. England semi-pro debut last year before serious injury.

MICK TUOHY: Started with Redditch and moved to Southend, playing regularly in the League. Transferred to Worcester City before coming to Kiddy in March 1984.

ADRIAN O'DOWD: League experience with Aston Villa and Oxford and then played for Banbury, Alvechurch and Moor Green.

JON PEARSON: Close season signing from Leicester City where he spent 3 years.

CHRIS JONES: Defender who has played over 200 games since signing from Stourbridge.

GRAHAM ALLNER: Manager who took over in 1983 and was also in charge at Leamington. Playing career included Walsall, AP Leamington and Worcester.
