

INTRODUCING MAIDSTONE . . .

Maidstone have won the Alliance League once, in 1984, after having been runners-up the year before, and this should have led to Football League admission, but despite an excellent case, it was not to be.

With automatic promotion to the Fourth Division now available, it just remains for Maidstone United

to repeat that success and win the Conference next season.

During the record breaking seventies and eighties, the club, last season, achieved another first, when having beaten Cambridge United at the Stadium in the first ever Sunday F.A. Cup tie there, they were drawn away to First Division Watford, the first time that the club had played a competitive match on a First Division ground.

In the F.A. Trophy too, it was record breaking time, as the club reached the quarter-final stage for the first time, before going out to Burton Albion in a replay and finishing third in the Conference after a pre-

viously disastrous season, meant that Bill Williams had restored pride and passion.

Last November, Bill Williams relinquished team management duties to concentrate on the ever expanding work of administering the club and stadium and John Still came from Leytonstone/Ilford as team manager. His duties are solely in team matters and this new development, means that Maidstone United now have a very formidable all round management structure to take them into the future.

MARK BEENEY: Joined the club in July 1987 from Gillingham having been on loan for the latter half of the previous season. No other clubs. Has played local representative soccer.

DAVID JACOUES: Full back, formerly with Leystone and Ilford, and Dartford.

MARK HILL: Spares Manager. Came to Maidstone in July 1984 from Wycombe Wanderers having also played for Queens Park Rangers and Brentford. Has played for London Schools, Middlesex Schools and the F.A. XI.

TONY PAMPHLETT: Carpenter. Joined Maidstone from Dartford in the summer of 1986 for a four figure fee. His other club was Cray Wanderers. Has played for Kent Schoolboys.

ALAN RISK: Insurance Broker. Signed from Dagenham for £4000 in August 1987. He has previously played for Gravesend and Northfleet, Coventry City and Orient. Has represented the F.A. and been a member of the England Mid Level squad.

PAUL GOYETTE: Window fitter. Signed from Dagenham in January 1988 for a fee of £6000. His previous clubs are West Ham United and Tilbury. Has played for the Army Services XI and the

MIGEL DONN: Picture Framer. Signed for Maidstone in the summer of 1983 from Orient, his only other club has been Gillingham. Has played representative football at Youth level in Kent.

JASON WHEELER: Financial Executive. Signed for the club in July 1987 after graduating through the Youth and Reserve Teams. Has also played for Canterbury City. His representative honours have been at local and County Youth level.

JOHN DOCKER: Eurobond broker. Joined Maidstone from Dagenham in January 1988 for a fee of £2000. His previous clubs have been Barnet and Enfield.

STEVE BUTLER: Clerk. Joined Maidstone from Brentford in June 1986 after a loan spell the previous season. His previous club was Wokingham. He has played representative football for the Army and

TONY ROGERS: Bricklayer. Joined Maidstone in March 1987 from Barking for £2500. He has also played for Basildon United, Leytonstone/Ilford, Tilbury and Dartford. Has played representative football for the Vauxhall-Opel League.

MARK GALL: Joined Maidstone in January 1988 and has made a big impact. At the time of writing, he leads the GMVC April goalscorers with 7.

JESSE ROAST: Roofer. Joined Maidstone from Barking in January 1987. His other clubs have been Brighton and Hove Albion, Dagenham and Walthamstow Avenue. Has played for Essex Schools and London Schools.

I don't know how many people know that Aaron Gransby has been moved off the sports coverage and put onto the newsales of the Harrow Observer. This means that now only one person will run the whole sports department. Remember, it was Aaron Gransby who broke the Morritt attempt to purchase Watford; it was Gransby who has increased the size of match reports and general coverage of Wealdstone. I don't know about the internal politics of the Observer, but I can only think it is one of two reasons. Firstly, the editor wants to reduce sports coverage, or secondly, this move is due to official jealousy – a common problem in this country where fools like Eddie "the Eagle" Edwards are hailed as heroes, but those people who actually achieve something are knocked off their pedestal. For whatever reason, it is a negative and retrograde step, the coverage of Wealdstone F.C. will suffer. Aaron has the contacts within the club and a new person would need time to build up the repartee. Timing of this move is significant, it has occured at the end of the football season. Many people, only purchase the Observer for coverage of Wealdstone. We are hardly going to notice any reduction in coverage during the close season. Wealdstone does deserve more column inches than any other local club. This season's average attendance will finish around 750, nearly four times larger than any other local club and more than all the other local clubs put together. I know many people who don't go to Lower Mead regularly anymore, but purchase the Observer to read about Wealdstone. Surely coverage cannot and should not be reduced, as what other activity – apart from shopping at Debenhams – attracts so many people on a Saturday afternoon in Harrow?

Well, on to the recent matches in the Conference, and Kettering certainly blew it! After defeating Lincoln 2-0 and joining them on 75 points, they were then demolished 3-0 at home by Runcom, and then lost 2-0 at Trophy Finalist's Enfield to end their championship hopes. Full credit to Kettering though. Nobody gave them a chance and it would have been a remarkable achievement had they pipped the two leading contenders. 4135 watched Kettering beat Lincoln, the largest at Rockingham Road in Alliance history. Lincoln were then held 1-1 at home by Maidstone and if you saw the goals on 'Football Focus' last Saturday you will certainly be excused for wondering how one of the goals was allowed to stand. The hand of God resurfacing at Sincil Bank? Lincoln then defeated Stafford 2-1 in front of 4402 and Wycombe in front of 9432(!) to clinch the championship. Barnet won 2-0 at Welling in front of 2517, but they required a similar result against Runcorn last Saturday to have won the league.

At the opposite end of the table, Bath City joined Wealdstone and Dagenham for the drop. They were defeated 2-1 by Runcorn, who have proved to be a most unpopular team at the end of the season! Bath, amazingly then won 2-0 at Macclestield to quell any hopes we had of attaining the 20th position.

Stafford Rangers missed out on 5th position when they lost 3-4 at home to Boston on Monday, and Telford, who defeated Fisher last Friday 2-1, finished 5th, one place behind Runcom.

If you are looking forward to playing Nuneaton and Chelmsford next season, then forget it! Both clubs appear to have been relegated from the Beazer Homes Premier, so do not think it will be easy next season!

Finally, I hope you have enjoyed my articles this season and see you in August. Good Luck and Wishes to Wimbledon in the F.A. Cup, (note Editor, a Liverpool admirer, reluctanly allows this in), Telford Utd in the Trophy, Middlesex in the County Championship and let's hope England have a successful, and more importantly, a trouble free European Championship.

Barring a miracle we are now relagated, no surprise really when you think that we haven't been out of the bottom three all season and only won five games. Next season I expect we will be re-aquainting ourselves with the Southern League and between now and August a lot of hard work will have to be done if we are to compete for top spot, the only spot that can guarantee promotion back. Unlike the last occasion we were in the Southern League, when we demolished most sides, standards have risen and we would be well advised not to underestimate the size of the task that lies ahead. With the Football League α tangible prize for any senior non-league club now, the battle at the top of the Southern Premier' for α place in the Conference will be very fierce indeed and the attitude of Wealdstone Football Club will have to be right. As well as those four clubs Bromsgrove, Cambridge and Burton will have to be watched. We can do it and we know it but the attitude has to be right!

One of the bright spots of the last few weeks has been the form of Tony Lynch. I honestly can't remember seeing a winger like him in non-league football and the quality of some of the crosses he puts in after leaving two defenders tied in knots is outstanding. If you're reading this Lynchy all I can say is stay with Wealdstone, get the attitude right and you'll have a bloody good time next season, even at Corby!

Well, that's it for the season. 'Hughie' has cut me a bit short this week which is probably just as well as I've got nothing else to write about anyway except a few good wishes. To Tommy English – thanks for helping us out mate, to Martin Lacey and Sudhir Rawal – thanks for the 'Elmslie Abuser', to our away supporters – brilliant!, to Joe McKeever – take the foot out of your mouth next season!, to Samson – keep smiling son!, to Alan Clifton – stay positive and thanks, to Jenno – you must be the first manager to relegate two clubs in one season but I know you'll get us back!
