Last season Merthyr won the Midland Division scoring over 100 goals, and it is a remarkable achievement to be major contenders for the title this season. Welsh Cup Winners in 1987 led to a meeting with Atalanta, Italy and they only went out 2-3 on aggregate. It is a great pleasure to welcome this most ambitious and well supported club.

GARY WAGER - GOALKEEPER Gary is the Club's first choice keeper, ever present this season having recovered from a serious injury last year. Welsh non league International, previous Club Bridgend Town.

DAVID TONG - FULLBACK An experienced defender in his third season at the Club, voted Player of the Year by Martyr Supporters last season, previous Clubs Cambridge United, Blackpool, Shrewsbury Town and Cardiff City.

PETER JONES - FULLBACK Rejoined the Club from Newport County in 1987, having played over 100 League games. Has played for Wales at non league level and is a very reliable and tenacious defender.

ROGER MULLEN - DEFENDER Joined the Club from Basingstoke after serving an apprenticeship at Swansea City, mobile, strong player who can play in most defensive positions.

PHIL EVANS - CENTRAL DEFENDER Signed from Bridgend Town in 1987, has Captained the Welsh non league International side and has Football League experience with Swansea City.

KEVIN ROGERS - MIDFIELD A local boy who joined the Club in 1987 after Football League experience with Aston Villa, Birmingham City and Wrexham. Has played in Europe with both Wrexham and ourselves, and is a current Welsh Non League International.

PAUL GILES - STRIKER An exciting attacking Player who rejoined the Club in January 1988 from Newport County. Has also played League football for Cardiff City and Exeter City and spent two years in Holland playing for Excelsior and SVV.

DAVID WEBLEY - STRIKER In his third year with the Club, has become one of the most prolific goalscorers in non league football. Scoring 60 goals in his first season and following up with 36 goals last season. Already this season has scored over 40 goals and is a current member of the Welsh non league International side.

PHIL GREEN - STRIKER A strong old fashioned, bustling centre forward, rejoined the Club last season after a spell in Saudi Arabia. Has also played in Hong Kong and has football league experience in the Third Division with Newport County.

ANDREW BEATTIE - MIDFIELD Joined the Club in 1987 from Western League Club Mangotsfield, and has proved to be a settling influence on the Team. A current member of the Welsh Non League International squad and was once on Newport County's books, is the present Club Captain.

CERRI WILLIAMS - STRIKER One of the most popular players at the Club, having been an apprentice at Newport County, where he scored on his Football League debut at only 16 years of age. Was a regular member of Newport County's Third Division side and a Welsh Youth and Non League International.

STEVE WILLIAMS - **MIDFIELD** A strong, toughtackling midfielder, has been with the Club for five years, having previously played for Ebbw Vale and Pontllanfraith in the Welsh League.

NIGEL FRENCH - MIDFIELD Joined the Club last season from Swansea City, for whom he made over forty League appearances, is just returning to full fitness after a bout of glandular fever. Can play in midfield or attack.

LYN JONES - MANAGER One of the most successful non league Managers in the Country. Started his football career as a youngster at Arsenal before moving on to Bristol Rovers and Newport County. He then become Player Manager at Bridgend Town and took them to the Southern League Championship and Cup. Has since won the Welsh Cup with Merthyr and the Southern League Midland Division Championship and Merit Cup. A strong believer in attacking and attractive football.

ALAN CLIFTON — CHAIRMAN

Being Chairman of a football club, the tragic events that occurred at Sheffield's Hillsborough Stadium last Saturday had of course significant meaning to me, my fellow Directors and every member and staff of Wealdstone F.C. Stunned disbelief shadowed not only my thoughts, but also everybody who was present here for our home game versus Fareham Town, and our decisive 3-0 win turned from one of celebration to shock and grief as the scenario of events unfolded before our eyes on television.

I am sure that everyone here today also felt horror for the victims, and saddened grief for the families who lost their loved ones. Indeed the tragedy touched Harrow as two young ladies from neighbouring Pinner suffered such a terrible death, watched by their father who hopelessly observed the horrific scenes from another

part of the stadium.

It is not of course my or your position to proportion blame for this tragedy and of course wild speculation contained within the media certainly gives neither television nor some sections of the press any credit during this period of grief. Trial by media sadly in these modern times is becoming increasingly more prevalent, and through irresponsible reporting, can often prejudice the outcome of any enquiry, but more importantly intrudes on the lives of the bereaved.

No-one can say that this season hasn't been an eventful one. We have had the dizzy heights of being top of the table, the deep depths of the nether regions of the table, the hysteria of our Trophy win at Bromley and the capitulation of our defeat in the Middlesex Senior Cup semi-final. There have been the dazzling, skilful performances such as home to Bromsgrove Rovers and the dire straits of the defeat at Redditch. We've had the gritty, gutsy performances such as at Merthyr and the lackadaisical ones such as at Corby. Yet, above all, we would all agree it has been a season of disappointment. One which promised so much, one which saw so much optimism on the terraces early in the season. No-one is

Yet Alvechurch have been a relatively successful side over the last few years. The Southern League Cup and the Championship have all found their way to Lye Meadow in recent years. At least Wealdstone are alive and kicking. The securing of Wealdstone's future is the most important consideration for both the Board of Directors and the supporters. After the past few years, it is so pleasing to see a Board of Directors, admirably led by Alan Clifton, who are not only committed to the Club, but are also football oriented. To the Board's credit, a substantial amount of money has been invested in the team and so the season's outcome has been made more disappointing. The team just haven't gelled, even though they are probably the best collection of individual players in the League. Why they have not gelled we can only speculate. We all have had our own ideas.

Yes the season has been disappointing, but we must not forget the high points that we've had. Who can forget the near pandemonium when Ev LaRonde scored our winner in the FA Trophy at Bromley amongst the 300 travelling Wealdstone supporters, or the gritty, back-to-basics performance at Merthyr Tydfil watched by a passionate, noisy, yet trouble-free crowd in a super-charged atmosphere. Let's be positive and optimistic, but not necessarily naive. At least Stones play, or attempt to play, football in

the manner it was meant to be played. If only they could do it with more passion.

Despite the season not being all it should have been, the support amongst the loyal fans has been excellent. The numbers at home may not have been high, but the support has been noisy and passionate. This, along with the fact that the pitch is better than most we have seen this season, has led to our impressive home record. The support away from home has been exceptional as ever. A side with our away record would simply not take as much as we do away from home - Alvechurch's crowd last week was 200 up on their previous home match.

Anyway, enjoy the Summer - Let's hope Middlesex win all there is in the cricketing world.




