



ICIS FOOTBALL LEAGUE (DIVISION THREE)
WEALDSTONE v. CAMBERLEY TOWN
SATURDAY 17TH AUGUST 1996, KICK OFF 3.00 PM

Welcome to the White Lion Ground for our opening league match of the 1996/97 season. We hope that this season will be even better for us than the last one and that promotion will be our reward come next May. Our visitors for the first of the 32 league fixtures we shall be playing this season are Camberley Town. To their players, officials and supporters we extend a warm welcome, hope you enjoy your visit to Edgware and have a safe journey home later on. We also welcome the three match officials, namely our referee Mr. A.S. Valentino and his linesmen (oops! sorry), assistant referees Messrs Yeo

and Kinseley. Enjoy the game gentlemen.

Well after all the speculation towards the end of last season we now know what the ICIS League (Division Three) set-up will be for the current campaign. We will be without Horsham, Leighton Town and Windsor & Eton (all promoted to Division Two), plus Cove and Harefield United who have resigned. With no clubs relegated from Division Two and none promoted from the feeder leagues, our division was down to just 16 clubs until Braintree Town were allowed to join us from the Southern League. Like us twelve months earlier, they were becoming increasingly more isolated from the rest of the clubs in their division and were finding the long distances travelled to away games a drain on their resources. Their request to move across the Pyramid was finally approved by the FA and at the ICIS League AGM, Braintree Town were accepted into Division Three. We have had some rare old battles with them in the past and look forward to meeting up with them again this season. Having 'voluntarily' relegated themselves two divisions one wonders whether they have managed to retain the players that achieved fifth place in the Beazer Homes League (First Division South) last season.

With only 17 clubs chasing after the three promotion places it should make for an interesting campaign. Who will be the 'lucky 3' I wonder! Gordon, Leo, Frank and the players know that a lot of hard work lies ahead if we are to achieve what we all want, namely promotion, at the end of the season. One thing is for sure, we will have to show a big improvement on last season's home form. A look at the league table elsewhere in this programme shows that we picked up just two points from our home games against the clubs who, apart from us, finished in the top seven positions. This surely cost us a top three place! Who will be our main rivals then? Obviously the clubs who finished just below us, Harlow Town, Northwood and Epsom & Ewell. I believe Wingate & Finchley and Braintree Town (if they still have last season's squad) will also figure prominently. There could of course be others and this afternoon's visitors will be hoping to be one of them. So it's not going to be easy but with your continued support we must have a

very good chance.

No doubt Camberley Town will be hoping to put a spanner in our works this afternoon. They played a major part in denying us promotion last season when they held us to a goalless draw here at the White Lion Ground in March. Hopefully we will find the back of their net this afternoon, whilst once again preventing them from finding ours. We wish them well for the rest of the season, apart from when we visit them in January!

The draws for two of the cup competitions we shall be entering this season, the FA Cup and FA Vase, have presented us with mixed fortunes. Our task in the FA Cup looks very formidable indeed whereas in the FA Vase it looks somewhat easier, although no game is that easy. We begin the FA Cup trail with a visit to Shoreham who finished third in the Sussex County League (Division One) last season. Their record read P38 W25 D8 L5 F91 A37 Pts83. This will be the first ever meeting between our two clubs. Whoever wins this tie then visits either Dartford or Horsham in the next round. Dartford, newly promoted to the Southern League, were runners-up in the Kent League last season, Furness taking the championship on goal difference. The Darts suffered only one defeat in their 38 league matches last season. Horsham, of course, won the ICIS League (Division Three) and beat us twice on their way to the title. The reward for the winners of this tie will be a trip to either Walton & Hersham, Wick (Sussex County League) or Herne Bay (Kent League). Incidentally, we could be meeting Horsham in the Guardian Insurance Cup also. They have been drawn away to Cheshunt in the Preliminary Round whilst we meet Kingsbury Town here in ten days time.

In the FA Vase we have been favoured with the possibility of two home ties as we set off on the long road to Wembley's twin towers. We begin in the First Qualifying

### MANAGER'S REPORT

Good afternoon everyone and welcome to our first league encounter of the senson against Camberley Town.

I am sure all our supporters have noticed the contrast of our 'low key' approach during pre-season compared with the hype and high expectancy of twelve months ago which, in the end, only served to help us 'SHOOT OURSELVES IN THE FOOT.' Goals galore, excellent performances, good results and plenty of promise mean nothing pre-season and by the end of last season that's exactly what we had achieved... NOTHING!

By comparison I am much happier twelve months later despite being on the end of two four goal hammerings and a 1-0 defeat. Since the poor early performance against Abingdon Town we have worked hard on our defensive duties when the opposition have got the ball. It's not perfect by any means but with only 32 league games this season it's the main area we must work on to ensure we do not lose too many games. Although I am sure everyone enjoyed scoring two 10's, two 9's and two 7's last season, I would personally be much happier gaining points in a consistent and realistic manner by keeping things tight at the back. I will also be expecting more disciplined and professional performances so that results such as Windsor (home), Aveley (home), Northwood (home) and Harlow (away) will not occur this season. Sixteen goals conceded in those four games can only be described as disgraceful! We can always have one off day... but not FOUR

Team spirit will also go a long way to improve performances and I feel we have already seen a big improvement in this department. I'm sure our new signings will be talked about in more depth elsewhere in this programme but I would like to welcome Darren Bonfield, John Massey, David Ross, Bryan Hammatt, "Nicko" ??? and Stewart Jones. I hope they have a long and successful stay with us. Two of last season's squad, Steve Fraser (back injury) and Tony Knight (knee) should both be training soon and fighting for places. Steve has missed our pre-season games while Tony was injured during his one and only friendly against North Greenford. May I also take this opportunity to wish our physio, Alan Wharton, a speedy recovery following his recent operation!

As most of you know, we started last season with a totally new squad but with 11 of last years players having re-signed it has been so much easier for the new lads to settle in and the banter is developing well in the dressing room. Despite the fact the Edgware clubhouse has been closed on our training evenings it's been good to see a group of players going to the Change of Heart pub together (where we have been looked after very well) instead of shooting off home. That was a major problem last season because our training facilities didn't have a bar which encourages that togetherness and I know that didn't do anything to help our cause last season. On the subject of training we have managed to hire some new facilities with a good astroturf area, decent lights and a clubhouse. I'm sure this will make a big difference both on and off the park.

All in all we must go into the season in a positive and confident mood in order to gain the promotion spot we missed out on last season. Everyone learnt a great deal from last years campaign and we know this will not be easy, but once again we are talked about as one of the favourites along with Braintree, Harlow and Northwood, but there's bound to be someone out of the pack who will surprise everyone, possibly Wingate & Finchley? Finishing fourth last season doesn't mean anything and this was highlighted in a recent article in the Northwood v Chelsea programme. In the five years that Division Three has existed, Horsham (1992), Leighton (1993), Harlow (1994), Northwood (1995) and Wealdstone (1996) have finished the season just one place adrift of promotion. None of the first four managed to make it the following season so we have to put that record straight this year!!!

Personally I will not make any predictions but Leo, Frank and myself feel we have a better and more disciplined squad than at this stage last season. It's one that we hope will show much more character and determination when things go against us. I mentioned the defeats against Northwood, Windsor and Aveley earlier in my notes and these highlighted the games where we lost our discipline and went chasing a result. We must be patient and continue to do the right things in a tight disciplined manner and believe we have enough ability to get back into the game. Patience is a virtue - let's see if we've got it. I want teams to know they will need to work hard to beat us this season and if they do, it will be very close. Last season we were good with the ball and very bad without it. That must change... with hard work, desire and determination we intend to fight all the way to achieve it

Enjoy the game and, hopefully, the season.



### TODAY'S MASCOTS

Today's mascots are JAMES BYRNE aged 8 and BOBBY SETHI aged 9. James attends Whitefriam School in Harrow whilst Bobby attends Longfield Middle School in North Harrow. Both boys are members of the Wealdstone Juniors Football Club's Sunday morning "Mini-Longue" scheme. We hope that both James and Bobby enjoy their afternoon with us.

### PYRAMID PATTER

CHELMSFORD CITY have finally applied for planning permission for their proposed new stadium. The Essex club have one year of a lease left on their existing New Writtle Street Stadium, which is owned by Essex County Cricket Club. The cricket club need the site for extra car parking and a new cricket school. If City cannot get a new stadium built in time for the 1997/98 season they face an uncertain future, with ground sharing the only option. Sound familiar ?? City's plans include a retail park, a new tennis school and a 6,000 capacity stadium built to Nationwide League standards.

GREAT MILLS have ended a long term relationship with the Western Football League. This season the league will operate under the less attractive title of the SCREWFIX DIRECT League after a new sponsorship arrangement was signed. F.A. Vase semi-finalists MANGOTSFIELD UNITED will once again be one of the strong favourites for the title, and the Cossham Street outfit are known to be desperate to join the Doctor Martens League. Dr Martens, of course, took over sponsorship of the Beazer Homes League from the start of this season. Other contenders for the Screwfix title will be TAUNTON TOWN and TIVERTON TOWN as ever, whilst the two promoted clubs CHARD TOWN and BRIDGWATER TOWN are both ambitious. Bridgwater, in particular, have a large and vocal fan base. Dark horses could be my old club PAULTON ROVERS, who have put together a useful squad for the new season combining experience and youth.

Not such good news a few miles down the road from Paulton, where Conference outfit BATH CITY recently went into voluntary Administration. The Conference outfit, rocked by the departure of tennants BRISTOL ROVERS, have struggled financially over the past few seasons despite the luxury of the exiles cash and their move to share Bristol F.C.'s rugby ground was the final straw. City have already lost manager Tony Ricketts and most of the first team squad and are expected to field a side of local players, including several from western League clubs. Twerton Park has had its criticism over the past few seasons but it is still a magnificent stadium by non-league standards and it would be a great pity if the club ended up losing the famous old ground. Surrounded by houses and offering great views into Bath from its far open terrace, Twerton is one of the few remaining examples of a traditional British football ground. It remains to be seen whether the council of the English Heritage City, who allow only cosmetic changes to any other building in the area, will be as vigilant in preserving the character of their City's football ground.

ROMFORD have finally got a home of their own after performing a DAGENHAM & REDBRIDGE style takeover on near neighbours COLLIER ROW. The new club will be known as COLLIER ROW & ROMFORD for one season, before reverting to just ROMFORD after one season. The leis outfit will be one of the best supported sides in the lower divisions with a loyal fan base, most of whom have remained with the club since the seventies, despite its years of inactivity.

Icis Premier outfit PURFLEET have signed Steve Moseley from neighbours CHELMSFORD CITY. The central defender was previously with DAGENHAM & REDBRIDGE and is intended to tighten things up at the back for the Thurrock Hotel outfit. At the other end of the pitch the lucrative strike force of Steve Portway and Paul Cobb should again strike fear into opposing defences. Portway, in particular, deserves immense credit for fighting his way back to this level of football following his appalling eye injury whilst playing for GLOUCESTER CITY.

Martin St Hilaire has returned to local rivals ENFIELD after a season in Somerset with YEOVIL TOWN. After suffering the agonies of missing promotion by a single goal, manager George Borg will be hoping that 1996/97 proves to be the season that the Southbury Road outfit finally get things right on and off the field. Meanwhile, back at Yeovil Graham Roberts has cashed in on BATH CITY'S misfortune by snapping up both Joey Gill and Rob Cousins from the Conference outfit. With both Yeovil and Dagenham & Redbridge sure to field strong sides, plus an expected challenge from DULWICH HAMLET, Enfield will certainly not have things all their own way this season.

Midfielder Andy Hessenthaler's recent move from WATFORD to GILLINGHAM was good news for DAGENHAM & REDBRIDGE. The Victoria Road club had negotiated a percentage of any future transfer fee when Hessenthaler moved to Vicarage Road and will now receive a useful bounty to soften the blow of relegation from the Conference.

Elsewhere in Essex another famous name has returned to the Senior ranks with the election of ILFORD to the Essex Senior League and with it the granting of Senior status by the Essex County F.A. Ilford were founder members of the Icis League back in 1905 and they have a medium term ambition to return Isthmian League soccer to the town. Ilford, of course, were one of the many casualties of the all consuming monster that currently is Dagenham & Redbridge. With the aforementioned merging of Collier Row and Romford, plus the failed attempt by Braintree Town to take over Chelmsford City a couple of seasons back you wonder just what is in the air in the Essex region. So far, however, no one has shown any signs of wanting to take over AVELEY. Pity!!

Local rivals RAYNERS LANE have had to concede defeat in their battle to retain senior status and this year have returned to the Middlesex League. The Lucas Avenue club have tried in vain to have floodlights installed to keep their Hellenic League place but the usual shortsightedness of local residents has seen them lose the battle. We wish them luck in their new league and hope that at some time in the future they can bounce back.

### HIGH PLACING FOR OUR PROGRAMME by ROY COUCH

The Wirral Programme Club survey of last season's non-League programmes resulted in ours being placed 22nd nationally out of entries from 1216 clubs. Our near neighbours Northwood were adjudged to have produced the best programme nationally and were awarded 185 points. In second place were Langney Sports (Sussex County League) with 182 points, and in joint third place were Hoddesdon Town (South Midlands League) and North Shields Athletic (Wearside League), each with 173 points. Our total of 147 points was three better than 27th placed Kettering Town who had the best programme in the GM Vauxhall Conference.

In the ICIS League we came 5th overall behind Northwood, Sutton United (165 points), Aldershot Town (164) and Thame United (150). In Division Three it was asking a lot for anyone to dislodge the professionally produced Northwood programme from the number one spot. The previous three seasons had seen their programme placed first in Division Three each time, and nationally they had finished second, first and second. A wonderful record and we congratulate them on such excellence. Taking all this into account it was most satisfying from my point of view for our programme to be placed second in Division Three, seventeen points ahead of Wingate & Finchley in third place.

It should be noted that the programmes were surveyed, not as many assume voted upon. Marks were awarded to each programme as follows (the maximum are given for each section):- Cover 15 (design 10, match details 5), Page Size 10, Team Layout and position within the programme 10, Results 10, League Tables 10, Price 15, Printing and paper quality 20, Frequency of Issue 20, Value for money 20 (this takes into account the ratio of adverts to content, the clubs league etc.), Contents 105 (other than those listed) taking into account their relevance to the club, its league, environs etc., the size of print used, the spacing between lines, the size of the margins, and if the contents are original or reproduced (from League bulletins, newspapers etc.). To gain full marks in the Frequency of Issue section programmes from 10 different matches were required for each team entered (allowances were made if ten home games had not been played by the closing date and the Wirral Programme Club had been informed of this). We duly submitted ten.

Our final placing of 22nd Nationally, 5th overall in the ICIS League and 2nd in Division 3 compare favourably with the previous season in the Beazer Homes League where we finished 56th Nationally out of 1133 clubs, 7th overall in the Beazer Homes League and 3rd behind Witney Town and Weymouth in Division One (South).

### THE PULSE

With Dave Edler

Hopefully this column will prove to be more regular this season. I have now actually moved from Brentwood to Wealdstone, so this should improve my chances of getting to matches, especially in midweek. Acting commitments meant that I missed most of the latter part of last season, Horsham away being the last game I was able to attend, and so I missed our strong run-in. Hopefully we can start this season in the same sort of form and get away to a flying start.

One of the major talking points during the summer has been the reorganisation of the divisions, particularly division three. At one stage it looked almost as if we were about to enter a sort of Scilly Isles soccer, with the same two sides playing each other thirty times a season. However, that at least has been avoided with Braintree Town joining the division and most teams managing to scrape through the new tougher ground gradings. We say goodbye to local rivals Ruislip Manor and Harefield United, and also to Saffron Walden Town, Newbury Town and Cove who have all left the Icis League. It remains to be seen whether the league can now survive in its current format. I would suggest that it cannot and should not.

For some time now, since the league switched to four straight divisions, there has been the anomally of clubs joining the Isthmian set up having to gain four promotions to reach the Conference, wheras those taking the Southern League route need make only two. This is a real problem for any ambitious club, as Aldershot Town are currently finding out, with Division One in particular a really difficult division to get out of. The current situation has provided the league with a golden opportunity to reorganise the lower two divisions back into a regional North and South basis, thus providing a shorter route to the Premier for new clubs. However, I think they should bite the bullet and go a stage further than that by sheding a division althogether. There is too much deadwood at the bottom of the Icis League. Division Three is already effectively two different divisions, with an enormous gap in class between the top half a dozen teams and the rest. The chasm between top and bottom in standards is unmatched in any level of football I have ever seen. I believe there is now a strong case for sending the bottom dozen clubs back into feeder leagues. Their continuing battle for survival cannot be doing them any favours and is certainly unlikely to attract much support, so they would be much better off regrouping in a lower level of football at a more local level to help revive fortunes and hopefully interest.

The league could then revert to a format matching the Southern League, with a Premier Division, plus two regionalised First Divisions, each comprising 24 clubs. There would be two up from each division and four down from the Premier. This would be much fairer and would not penalise ambitious clubs who happen to be in the wrong part of the country.

### Answer to Today's Poser

It was in the 1992/93 season when our home games were being played at Watford FC. Our opponents were Margate and we lost 4-1, Dermot Drummy scoring our goal. For the past three seasons we have travelled to Poole Town, Fareham Town and Cove for our first league match of the season.



### THE JB INTERVIEWS...

.... A series in which JOHN BURROWS invites various Wealdstone FC people in the form of Directors, Management (paid and non paid), Players and Supporters, to talk about their background, their views and feelings of the Club, and any other matters (sporting or otherwise) that may come to light!

> No. 1 GORDON BARTLETT - (Team Manager) \* Birthplace - Chiswick \* Married to Jackie; 2 Children - Amanda (9), Craig (6) \* Gordon is a Junior School Teacher (Sports, Geography, I.T.)

It is not really surprising that football has played a major part in Gordon's life, me his father was a founder member of Viking Sports FC and is currently their President. Gordon got involved with football very early on, illustrated by his arrival at Portsmouth FC as an apprentice at the age of 16. Two years later he became a full time professional, but two more years on he had tasted the highs and lows of the game as injury brought his full time professional career to an end, "Anyrate, I don't think I would have been good enough" says Gordon. This self critical remark was made early on in our discussion and this part of his character was to surface again later when we talked about Wealdstone's performance in 1995/96.

The next five years saw Gordon playing in non-league, for both Slough Town and Hayes, where he embarked upon his coaching and management career at youth team level, and at only 25 years of age. At 26 he had achieved a coaching qualification and then

moved into the precarious area of football management.

Gordon's management career path, and many significant achievements, have been well documented in programmes last season! They span periods at Hounslow, Southall and Yeading where various non-league honours were won - the most notable surely were winning the FA Vase and promotion twice in a five year stay at Yeading, where ICIS Premier status was attained, and maintained - it is clear that Gordon holds a great deal of respect for what Yeading FC have achieved in their relatively short history.

I asked Gordon "why the move to Wealdstone?" As far as Wealdstone fans were concerned it was a popular appointment but, on the face of it, a surprising one. Why should a successful ICIS Premier manager step down three Divisions to join a club without their own ground? One has to assume that the package offered was more favourable than that at Yeading, but was that the whole story? Gordon explained "I refused Paul at first, but the offer came at a time when other matters outside of football also had an influence (favourably for Paul!) and the challenge of managing a 'big name' non-league club and leading them back to better times finally won the day."

So how does he feel now, after a season that inevitably held a high level of expectation but, in promotion terms, ended in disappointment? Gordon responded clearly on these matters. He admitted that "I made mistakes with one or two early signings and underestimated the disadvantage of not having your own ground." I suggested to Gordon that, although finishing fourth was disappointing, there was much to applaud last season and that, from November onwards, the side looked stronger and better balanced. He indicated agreement but added that he still required more character throughout the side to achieve the necessary objectives.

I also asked about the off-field relationships. "The Board have been excellent and very supportive, and the back up in other off the field areas is first class" replied Gordon. The work of his assistant and the team coach. Leo and Frank respectively, is clearly highly valued by Gordon - "They have other skills and strengths that I do not have." I then asked, 'What about the fans? Was their expectation too high last August bearing in mind a complete new management/players scenario?' Gordon is very enthusiastic about the great support and recognises that a close rapport between management, players and fans is enjoyable and healthy. However, some of the expectation expressed early on (including a programme contribution by the writer) was a bit over the top "and affected some of the players." Nevertheless, I sense that Gordon knows that this is part and parcel of the deal and that he is more concerned that the support will be maintained with a good standard of behaviour. This latter point seemed to emerge as a key part of

his sporting philosophy - respect for the opposition by both players and fans (at this point Gordon sportingly acknowledged that his behaviour on the bench at times can be a little less than perfect!)

I suggested to Gordon that, with his teaching, WFC management and county coaching commitments, he must have a very understanding wife! He confirmed this - "without Jackie's support I just couldn't do it all." As he went on to point out. ironing and washing do not feature high on his agenda, and Jackie, not surprisingly, often plays the role of unpaid secretary. Other sporting interests (squash, golf, etc) are not pursued as much as he would like and, with a growing family, time in the future "might have to be re-prioritised."

And so to the 1996/97 season ..... During my interview Gordon presented himself in an interesting and, above all, open manner. He undoubtedly expects Wealdstone to challenge for promotion - I will not expand on this and fall into the trap of over expectation, but simply wish him and the team well in what is a formidable challenge.

### TODAY'S OPPONENTS

- CAMBERLEY TOWN

Camberley Town Football Club was originally formed in 1896 under the name of Camberley & Yorktown Football Club and initially competed in the Ascot & District League, their one and only title in that league coming in 1903/04.

The first honour that Camberley & Yorktown obtained was after only two years of existance. In the 1897/98 season they beat Norwood & Selhurst 2-1 to lift the Surrey Junior Cup. In 1907/08 Camberley & Yorktown reached the final of the Surrey Junior Cup again but this time lost to Kingston. Two seasons later, the 1909/10 season, they came back to beat Sutton 2-1 in the final to lift the Junior Cup for the second time. In the season in between Camberley & Yorktown reached the Surrey Junior Charity Cup where they lost 1-0 to Selhurst Park.

The few years before the First World War were very productive for Camberley in the West Surrey League. In 1912/13 they obtained the runners-up spot before going one better

in 1913/14 by winning the championship.

In 1922/23 the Surrey Senior League was formed and Camberley & Yorktown became one of the founder members, and they competed in this league for 51 years. To add to their new senior status the club moved to Krooner Park. In the early 1930's they won the championship three times in a row, 1930/31, 1931/32 and 1932/33. In the 1931/32 season the Surrey Senior League Charity Cup Final was also reached but they were beaten 2-1 by Beddington Corner. In 1935/36 Camberley reached their first ever Surrey Senior Cup Final in which they lost to the now Premiership team Wimbledon, by 3-1 at Dulwich. In the following season Camberley & Yorktown reached the Surrey Senior League Charity Cup Final again, only to lose 6-1 to Walton on Thames. Their first senior cup success came in the 1937/38 season in the League Charity Cup with a win over Hersham.

The 1951/52 season saw Camberley FC (they had dropped '& Yorktown' in 1946) capture the League Charity Cup again. Chertsey Town were beaten in an exciting see-sawing final by 5-4. In 1954/55 they were once again in the final but this time lost 3-1 to Dorking.

On the 2nd June 1967 Camberley FC merged with Camberley Wanderers to become Camberley Town. In 1973 they were elected to the Spartan League, and in 1975/76 they joined the Athenian League. In 1977/78 Camberley Town joined the Isthmian League and within two years were promoted as runners-up behind near neighbours Farnborough Town, winning 21 of their 34 games. In that same year came Camberley's greatest cup triumph. They reached the final of the Surrey Senior Cup where, as complete outsiders, they beat Leatherhead 4-1. In their first season in the First Division Camberley finished a respectable tenth after being third in November, only to be relegated the following season. Worse was to come the following season, Camberley finished bottom of Division Two, conceding 140 goals, and were demoted back to the Athenian League.

In 1985/86 the Athenian League folded and Camberley were elected back into the Isthmian League. The Southern Combination Cup Final was reached that season and Camberley lost 3-0 to Hampton. 1986/87 saw Camberley's best ever run in the FA Vase, reaching the last eight before losing to Halesowen Town, the eventual winners, 5-1. The following season Camberley reached the final of the Southern Combination Cup again, and

lost again, this time 2-1 to Feltham.

The 1990/91 season was the worst ever in the club's history, 9 points and 143 goals conceded. Paul Devis then took over in the hot seat and led the side to a mid-table position in 1991/92. They started well the following season with the team reaching fourth place but fell away to finish in the bottom three. Paul Holden, coach for the British Army national squad, was appointed as the new manager at the beginning of the 1993/94 season. Under his quidance Camberley achieved 6th and 8th places, their best placings for many years. November 1995 saw the departure of Paul Holden due to an army posting to Gibraltar and the newly appointed Reserve Team Manager, Danny McGranaghan, was promoted to the First Team managers post along with Steve Cotter as Coach. In January 1996 Camberley Town Football Club celebrated their first 100 years of football.

P.S. - I was working for the Football Association during EURO'96 and have many bits






