We Shall Come Good Again . . .

Not a lot has been going right for us in the last couple of weeks, with the result that we haven't had a win in the last four matches, and are out of the F.A. Cup and the London Challenge Cup. Unfortunately we have developed this tendency again to give away simple goals, and have not been knocking them in up front to crown what is often excellent approach work. It remains to be seen whether manager Sid Prosser can lift up the boys today after the recent setbacks and complete our first double of the season, for we won at Salisbury on the opening day. What is particularly frustrating, of course, is that the teams that have beaten us have not been better sides by any means, but have merely accepted what chances are going—and that is what football is all about. Even at White Hart Lane on Monday against a strong Spurs side the score did little justice, and the outcome could all have been so very different.

Some 200 of them went to Ramsgate last Saturday to the envy of Ramsgate's Directors, and the way that wonderful hard core was urging the team on against Spurs even when we were 4-0 down was magnificent. We can only hope that their tremendous enthusiasm is again soon rewarded, for they're a grand lot and deserve something to shout about.

Doubtless, I shall be expected to say something in this column about our team, and I find it difficult! Yet we owe allegiance to you, our Supporters, so here goes . . . The Club has had a lot of queries of why, in their opinion, we did not play our best team against Spurs. Unfortunately the likable Chic Brodie has not enjoyed the best of form since joining us and is struggling to find his confidence and many of you, judging from the calls we have had, wondered why he was selected for the important Monday match. And also why the hard-running Alick Brown was not even substitute. Having no reserve side every squad member must be kept match fit and doubtless this is the reason for certain team changes. However, this is pure speculation on my part, and it must be emphasised that Mr. Prosser has complete freedom in these matters, Wealdstone having never been a club which interferes with the Manager. No official at Wealdstone, from secretary Ken Wiltshire down, knows the team for any match until it appears on the dressing room notice board some 30 minutes before a match. Wealdstone does, of course (like every Club in the land) have hundreds of team selectors, namely everyone who attends our games!
