What a magnificent Christmas we had! It may have gone unnoticed, by the way, that our 4-3 win at Minehead last Saturday was the first double achieved against the Somerset club since they joined the Southern League two years ago. We again played some good football against Gravesend on Boxing Day, and the 2-1 score did not flatter us. In fact, the Kent club scored from their one and only chance. Good to see Chris Kinnear scoring again, and such a good goal it was too! Chris has settled down magnificently in midfield and we are now winning the ball more in this department. Apart from his skill he is also a very brave player, and against Gravesend suffered badly from an injury sustained against Minehead. All our back four men performed splendidly, and again John Henderson set the forwards alight with his pace and ball control. John, by the way, was credited with the second goal on Boxing Day, and not George Duck. The ball had crossed the line when George added the finishing touch.

A word of thanks to that wonderful band of behind-the-goals supporters whose vocal support is so vital to the team.

As you will see, Wednesday's win took us two places up the table to third position, but only two points behind leaders Basingstoke with no fewer than four games in hand. Indeed, some of our followers are already assuming that Premier Division football will be at Lower Mead Stadium next season! We have, of course, 23 matches yet to play and so we are not yet half-way through the programme. So let's keep a sense of perspective, and confine ourselves to the thought that we are in a wonderful position and are excellently placed to make an assault on the championship in the New Year.

Despite the very miserable weather, early kick-off, and no local publicity, we were extremely heartened by the Boxing Day crowed of not far short of 900, and our attendances are by far the highest in Div. 1 South. Happily, the Harrow Observer should be back with us next Thursday, which will be a great help.

Remember, we are at home to Ashford Town on Tuesday, which is New Year's Day and being a public holiday this year, we would like to top the 1,000 mark, especially as the kick-off is at 3 p.m. Yes, 3 p.m. for
