Pre-Match Training Now Necessary

Good afternoon, everybody, and a sincere welcome to the Directors, Players and Supporters of Hastings Utd for this important F.A. Challenge Trophy match. After today's game, only 16 clubs will be left in the competition, and the draw for the third round, which will be on a national basis, will be made at the F.A. Offices at noon on Monday. We shall keep our fingers crossed!

Needless to say, we should be confident today, having already beaten Hastings Utd 2-1 in a league match a few weeks ago. A noted defensive side relying on the odd quick break, they give few goals away, and had an excellent victory in the first round, beating Barnet 1-0 at home. But their confidence has perhaps been dented by losing 2-1 at Trowbridge in the league last Sunday, while we ourselves can look back on a valuable point gained at Waterlooville which has retained for us the best-placed position in the table. But we have a hard succession of away games, and from now on there will certainly be no easy touches.

Like our wonderful Supporters (so many of whom made the trip to Waterlooville on Saturday) our manager Sid Prosser is also conscious that our forwards are temporarily off the goal standard but feels it will come right in the end, just as our defence did after a lean spell some time ago. Although not necessarily a believer in pre-match training, our squad had a work-out on the pitch at 11 a.m. this morning, Mr. Prosser rightly saying that Saturday mornings are the only opportunity he has to get the players out with a ball while the national crisis is on. This is indeed, a problem which particularly effects semi-professional clubs like us. I gather that today's session had particular emphasis on the front runners. Afterwards the players have a light chicken lunch and an hour's relaxation. Although there may be late changes, when this programme went to press the same side as last Saturday had been announced, with Keith Bristowe as substitute.

I hear that Alick Brown had quite an impressive debut for Hillingdon against Kettering last Saturday and we wish him well. For the record the arrangement we have with Hillingdon is that we can recall him immediately we require his services.

Since our last programme appeared, we have publicly announced the election of Mr. David Martle as chairman of the Club's Executive Committee. A chartered accountant by profession Mr. Martle heads several flourishing companies, and with the advantage of youth on his side, is already proving a very enthusiastic and dynamic leader who, happily, is not content to be a mere figurehead, but believes in total commitment. We feel fortunate in securing his interest.

Indicative of the upsurge in interest in the Club is the considerable number of letters I now receive from rank and file supporters, who, incidentally, never cease to amaze me with their knowledge and records. If I happen to be a goal out in somebody's goal average in the league table, it's pounced on in double quick time! Thank you for your interest, which makes the whole thing worth while. So many of you seem to be impressed with our programme, and your comments are appreciated.
