A Duel Between North and South!

The lure of the Cup is with us again today, and it is with particular pleasure that we extend a very warm welcome to our visitors from the far-flung North-East coast, South Shields, making their first ever visit to Lower Mead Stadium. South Shields have been a big name in Non-League football for a long time, and are currently lying sixth in the Northern Premier League, with 39 points from 33 games, having scored an astonishing 70 goals in the process, conceding 41. Not only that, but they come with a reputation as redoubtable cup fighters, as I am sure we shall see in this, the third round proper of the F.A. Challenge Trophy. Today's winners will have reached the quarter-finals, and only once in the four-years-old history of the competition has a Southern club been successful in the Wembley final. We know that South Shields will return to Co. Durham tonight appreciative of the welcome they will have received from our sporting Supporters, and of our hospitality.

I did, in fact, see South Shields play (and lose 1-0) South Liverpool at Liverpool last Saturday and returned highly impressed with centre-back John Peverell, the former Darlington player. Keep an eye on him today! But they come here in good heart, having beaten Buxton 1-0 at home on Sunday.

It is of course, a proud day in the life of Wealdstone, for we alone are the sole survivors in the Trophy from our Division 1 (South) of the Southern League, and in fact, there are only three of us Southern Leaguers left—the others being Dartford and Romford. It will be pleasant indeed to turn the tables on our Northern guests today, and by so doing, strike a blow for Southern non-league soccer!

We are also delighted to have as our official guests today His Worship the Mayor and Mayoress of Harrow, Alderman and Mrs. G. Colborne Hill, who is no stranger to us. Another V.I.P. with us this afternoon is Mr. Walter Winterbottom, general secretary of the Central Council of Physical Recreation, and the former England team manager, and an influential figure in the sporting world. We do appreciate their interest.

The League, and promotion, remains naturally our prime ambition, and our team did extremely well to return with a point from Hastings last Saturday, and a goal-less draw, apparently, was an honourable result. As you will see from the table, it kept us well up there, and the crunch will undoubtedly come over the Easter period, when we have a tough schedule of three matches.

As is customary, Sid Prosser has not announced his team for today, and is not expected to do so until an hour or so before the kick-off. Whether there will be any changes from the Hastings side is anybody's guess! I hear Mr. Prosser watched the Watford v Leyton Orient Midweek League last week, and doubtless he has next season on his mind already.

Sorry that we could not publicly announce that our last home league game, again Bexley United, had been postponed because of the state of the pitch. But the match referee called it off at 12.30 p.m., when it was still raining, and naturally it gave us little chance to publicise it.

We have already briefly reminded you all that next season is the Club's 75th anniversary, and events to mark this notable landmark are already in hand. I am, in fact, in touch with Leeds United regarding the possibility of
