Now Let's Win Promotion

After our two gruelling cup battles in the last fortnight, it is perhaps with relief that we now turn to the most important task in hand, namely winning promotion to the Premier Division of the Southern League. Cup successes are always wonderful, and undoubtedly engender a lot of enthusiasm, but the fact remains that we must get out of Division 1 (South) before we can take the next step forward. And make no mistake about it, there is a lot to do yet, and games in hand are not necessarily a good thing. We are fortunate in that our squad's morale is so high, and we do not anticipate any reaction to Saturday's defeat at South Shields, for we all looked on the Challenge Trophy as a bonus, and certainly not our prime aim.

It has now been officially announced that the season will end on May 4th, and the anticipated additional extension we would have liked has not materialised. And so we have 17 league games to cram into some eight weeks! Without the benefit of evening matches until the nights get much lighter, it is a daunting prospect, and underlines the fact that Saturday's defeat could have been a real blessing. It now becomes fairly obvious that next month, at any rate, we shall be playing on Saturday and Sunday, and our squad of 14 are going to have a hectic time.

Since our last programme you will all know that manager Syd Prosser has resigned, and will join Chelmsford City as manager-coach on April 1.st, the day after his contract with us ends. Syd has done a magnificent job at Lower Mead Stadium, and we wish him well in his new appointment. We have already nationally advertised for a manager, and all being well will be making an appointment within the near future. Let me put the minds of our Supporters at rest immediately by saying the news has been taken with aplomb by our squad who, being the professionals they are, know and expect managerial changes frequently occur. Anyone in doubt should have seen the magnificent spirit they showed at South Shields where, believe me, they did us all really proud.

We accord a sincere welcome to the Directors, Players and Supporters of Bideford today, and we never have an easy game against them. We drew 0–0 at Bideford earlier in the season, but must make sure of both points today. A point worth remembering is that two clubs from each division will be promoted, and we are only two points behind Waterlooville, currently second, with five games in hand. A margin of two points is virtually nothing and so we have every right to be optimistic Don't forget, by the way, that next week's match at Poole Town (this will be the one to win!) is on SUNDAY, March 17th, kick-off at 3 p.m.

We are extremely sorry to record the passing of Mrs. Grace Wiltshire, mother of our general secretary, Ken Wiltshire, at the age of 86. Mrs. Wiltshire was a member of the Club, and was responsible for the players' after-match meals when she was well into her seventies, and also ran the old bar on the ground. She was a magnificent worker for the Club, and our sympathy goes out to Ken and his relatives in their sad loss. The cremation service was at Ruislip on Thursday.

DAVID LEE. Regular first team goalkeeper, now in his first season with the Club. Aged just 18, he has had trials with Bristol City and Aston Villa.

TREVOR ANTHONY. A utility player and one without which no team can be complete. Mainly at home in the wing-half spot, he is a very mobile defender.

MIKE HILLSON. A home-bread player and a regular first-teamer for several seasons at full-back. Former Bristol City and Arsenal trialist.

DEREK MAY. He has been a rgular first team player for many seasons and one of only two players (in addition to the present Manager) in the side to hold three Western League Championship awards whilst with the Club, spanning ten years. A strong defensive half-back, he has made nearly 600 appearances for the Club in the first team.

JOHN MOCK. A strong and tenacious midfield player, he gained a regular first team place this season upon his return to the Club from Western Leaguers Barnstaple Town.

STEVE SNELL. Formerly an amateur with Torquay United, he is a young, powerfully built striker and takes a lot of "stick", since he likes to be among the goals as well as make them for others.

STEVE MORRIS. Midfield player, formerly with Cheltenham Town in Division 1 (N). He has had Football League experience with both Bristol City and Exeter City.

GRAHAM MOXHAM. Formerly with Salisbury this player has immaculate ball control and is a fast and effective left winger. He was formerly with A.F.C. Bournemouth.

JEFF SNELL. Younger brother of Steve, he plays in the back four.
