As most of you will know by now, John McCormick, our redoubtable skipper and centre-back, had the misfortune to break his nose 20 minutes after the start of the match at Trowbridge on Saturday, and so we won't be seeing popular John in action again this season. It was a particularly unfortunate accident with only two matches to go but happily, John will to be here on Saturday evening to receive the Championship Trophy from Mr. Bill Dellow, secretary of the Southern League, at the end of our final game against Trowbridge, kick-off 7.30 p.m.

After John went off to hospital on Saturday, Terry Dyson, who was substitute, came on and consequently, and as was to be expected, a reshuffled Wealdstone side failed to find the same rhythm as in recent games, but a 1-1 draw was a fair result. We had much more of the play, but Trowbridge deserved a point, although near the end we came near to clinching both points when Bill Byrne hit the foot of a post, while a Terry Dyson 'special' was tipped over the bar.

John McCormick went to hospital again on Sunday and is feeling fine, so much so that he told Eddie Presland that were we still needing points, he would happily turn out. But as we have won the title, it would be foolhardy to play him. And so we would like you to give a special welcome tonight to 17-years-old John Baker, from Kingsbury, who deputises for our skipper in the same position.

Yes, a special welcome for this reason. John Baker joined us in the close season, and ever since then, has not missed ONE single training session, or either home or away game, even though knowing he would never get a game. He played for Wealdstone in Gibraltar in December, and his form then at right back proved he had tremendous potential. That is the sort of team spirit we have in the dressing room, and it is a real pleasure to see John get his chance tonight. I know Eddie Presland has big plans for John and has thrown him into the deep end tonight to save making wholesale positional changes in the side, and also to run the rule over such a promising youngster.

There will be one other change, Paul Fairclough giving way to Terry Dyson in midfield.

We are delighted to greet the Bexley team and their Directors and Supporters and apart from toppling the champions on their own pitch, they will wish to avenge the 2-0 defeat we inflicted on them way back on August 25th last year. On that occasion, George Duck, and an own goal, gave us the points. Bexley have made rapid strides up the table since Christmas and now are in a very respectable sixth place, with 42 points from 36 games. They held promotion-chasing Minehead to a 2-2 draw on Saturday so are no mean opposition.

On Saturday, of course, we say farewell to the 1973/74 season by entertaining Trowbridge Town, kick-off 7.30 p.m. The Wiltshire side play far better than their league position suggests, and if last Saturday's match is repeated, it will certainly be entertaining. This is naturally a special occasion for us, and we do hope you, and all your friends, even if they aren't regulars, will come and give us a rousing send-off to the Premier Division.
