Needless to say, this programme is, because of the Easter holiday, having to be printed on Thursday but we had every reason to be confident of at least a point from our visit to Chelmsford on Saturday. Naturally today's team will depend on that match. Incidentally, I don't think a tribute to Ray Bullen is out of place following his fine performance in place of John Morton against Dunstable. In fact, the impression grows that it is a pity that circumstances prevent Ray from taking up goalkeeping seriously! Certainly he is an excellent stand-by.

We are delighted to welcome Grantham to Lower Mead Stadium today, and a victory over them would be all the more sweet considering that they beat us 3—0 earlier in the season. They have achieved some fine results this season, and are always considered

to be a very difficult side to beat.

New manager Geoff Coleman is settling in very well and is impressed with Wealdstone's potential, and the Borough of Harrow generally. At the moment however, he is beginning to think that he has put a jinx on the squad! As he says, first goes John Morton with a broken hand, and late on Tuesday night came the news that Chris Kinnear has broken a bone in his foot and was unavailable last Saturday and today. Of all things, Chris was out walking on Hampstead Heath with his girl friend when he put his foot in a pothole. At least that's Chris's story!! On the brighter side, Ray Fulton's operation on his foot was successful and he is back to normal footwear.

General Secretary Ken Wiltshire has written to the 92 Football League clubs for their non-retained lists, as Mr. Coleman is very anxious to sign additional players to

bring his squad up to 15.

Utility player Jim Godfrey's contract has been terminated.

I have received the following letter from Mr. Bill Emerson, the instigator of the Club's Youth side: "Dear Colin: I cannot allow Phil Sugden's latest scurrilous criticisms of the Club to pass unchallenged. His salvo aimed at our complete lack of a youth policy is mystifying, in that we are founder-members of the Chiltern Premier Youth League; have staged youth matches at Lower Mead and have been actively engaged all season. His outburst against the Directorate is to be expected, but this latest broadside is a slur against the stirling efforts of Viv Evans, Les Macdonald, and Bill Green, who have all worked unselfishly and unceasingly all season on the youth project. I salute their efforts despite what Mr. Sugden says, and urge him to confine his adverse comments to specific individuals, not the club in general".

The Board have also directed me to make it clear that the recent decision to withdraw Boardroom and Lower Mead Social Club facilities from Mr. Sugden was a

unanimous one.

The annual general meeting of the Southern League takes place on June 5th when the whole position regarding the future composition of the three divisions will be ratified. As it stands now, it is virtually assured that only one Premier Division club will go down. But with reputed withdrawals by some First Division clubs, and lack of information regarding how many applications to join have been received, the whole matter is in a state of flux. The only official application for Southern League status that I have heard about is Aylesbury. The only certain thing is that, alas, many Southern League clubs are in desperate financial straits, and one has only to glance at the attendances to see why. By comparison our support is tremendous, but the only thing that will bring a smile to the face of treasurer Harry Benjamin is an average of 1,500. When we have achieved that magical figure, there will be a lot less midnight oil burned in the boardroom!

Anyway, to every single one of you, we say a heartfelt 'thank you' for your wonderful support during a season which has contained so many disappointments and we are only too happy that we close feeling convinced that the worst is over, and that there is every reason to be confident that brighter days are ahead next August. Have a happy summer, and let's all get together again in four months time.
