# Say a fond farewell to Northwood and goodbye to ground sharing

Today we welcome Leyton FC, who are having a wretched season, and for whom the season probably can't come to an end soon enough. To their players, supporters and officials, we hope you enjoy your brief stay and have a safe journey home.

Our time at Northwood has probably not been the most enjoyable for Wealdstone fans, though this season's cup exploits being a clear exception. Northwood have appeared, to myself at least, to be decent hosts. They have been going through the mill themselves during our time here, with Don Bruce bookmakers, their sponsors being bought out by a larger competitor. It is not only the end of our groundshare here, but the end of our groundsharing full stop. At the beginning of this season, if you had asked fans

whether they would like either relegation & own ground or the status quo, most would take demotion with the boost of a home base. Mind you, a win today and we have a chance to eat our cake!

My highlights of the season would have to be the 'Borough beating' on Boxing Day, coupled with our complete domination of the Welling Trophy game. Both those games showed how well we can play, and provides continuing reasons for optimism.

Our previous home game, versus Carshalton, was generally considered to be a poor performance, and one on which an improvement is essential against a more superior Hendon side, as well as against Leyton today. Although there was a clear penalty award not given after Peter Dean was pole-axed by their keeper, which would have transformed the game in our favour, Carshalton could have been out of sight before then. Even so, while there is time for the team to put matters right, I have faith that they can keep us

### WEALDSTONE'S RECORD v LEYTON P 84 W 46 D 11 L 27 F 179 A 143

As was the case when we met Carshalton Athletic a fortnight ago, the majority of our previous matches against Leyton were also in the Athenian League. We met 60 times between the 1928/29 and 1963/64 seasons, missing out only during the war years 1939-45 when the League was suspended.

In recent seasons we have met seven times for Isthmian League matches, Leyton winning the four matches played during the 2003/04 & 2004/05 seasons and Wealdstone winning both in the 2005/06 season and also at Leyton earlier this season.

The first ever match between our two clubs took place 88 years ago during the 1920/21 season. It was on September 18<sup>th</sup> 1920 when we visited Leyton for a Middlesex League (Premier Division) fixture, the game ending all square at 1-1, our goal coming from the penalty spot. In the return league match on March 12<sup>th</sup> 1921 we made home advantage count by running out 4-0 winners.

#### WEALDSTONE FC Ground Regulations

People are only allowed entry to Northwood Park on match days subject to the following rules and regulations. The club reserves the right to eject from the ground any person who is considered to have committed any of the following acts:

- Entering the ground by any means other than through the turnstiles or entrances.
- Entering the field of play before, during or after a game without prior authorisation.
- Being drunk, or under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- Carrying Items which may be considered a danger to others, including cans, bottles or drinking glasses containing alcoholic beverages.
- Throwing any article onto the field of play.
- Climbing floodlight pylons, fences, stands or any structure or building.
- Using obscene or offensive language like to cause offence to others.
- Using violence of any nature.

The consumption of alcoholic drinks is permitted **INSIDE** the social club bar and board room areas.

I'm am writing these notes on Monday evening after our away game at Hornchurch last Saturday and I'me just heard the Folkestone game against Staines tonight has been postponed. Just our luck - now Staines will have a fixture pile up before the play-offs and may play a weakened team down there next time.

Our youth set up and involvement at Stanmore College continues to thrive and I'd like to praise everyone involved under the coaching leadership of Steve Beeks. John Moran has has proved to be a major asset in the recruitment of the new students and he, along with his wife Alison, will have a huge influence on developing our Youth set up and links with schools and clubs within the Ruislip area.

Alan and Matt have done excellent jobs on the website and hospitality, which is even more amazing considering the journey they have to make each week in order to even turn up at games. It shows typical

commitment to the cause and I'd just like to say how much it's appreciated.

Thanks also go to, Don Cross and Micky Kane who, along with a large band of volunteers, have had a huge impact on ground proceedings down at Grosvenor Vale and of course, Attic with his superb photographs. Once again, despite the frustration, the supporters have been excellent this season and continue to travel through thick and thin. We really do appreciate it and hope we can reward you with Premier football again next season. I'd also like to thank PJ, Andy B and Gordon for their invaluable help on match days.

I must mention the Board, which includes some of the 'Ruislip Four' and I extend a big thank you on behalf of everyone, for sticking with it, putting your hands in your pockets and providing this club with our first home for many years. I sincerely hope this will now help generate the income, surroundings and atmosphere, to enable this club to continue its rise back up the non-league ladder. I'm sorry if I've missed

anyone out, but if I have ..... thanks anyway!

This season can only be described as probably my most frustrating ever. I went on record saying this was the best squad I'd had since I joined the club. Since then, due to some poor performances, I've had that quote thrown back in my face by a few people, but I stand firm by that statement. Not everyone has gone the distance, but thirteen players are still with us from the squad we signed in August; Chaps, Jomo, Carl, Chris, Ashie, James, Hughsie, Peter, Monty, Andre, Jon, Deano and Keita and I sincerely hope many of those will be here next season.

We've had high points in the league, such as Folkestone, Staines, Hornchurch, Harrow and Boreham Wood twice. With wins against Conference South sides, Welling and Bishops Stortford and the good runs in both the FA competitions, things were looking bright before Christmas and talk of the play-offs. Then bang! A succession of poor performances, confidence drained and we were on the slippery slope towards the bottom. Occasional bright spells recently saw us climb back up the table, but we have conceded so many poor goals it is bound to influence the mental strength of even the strongest characters. The last three games are prime examples, Maidstone two up with fifteen to go and we blew it! Then the nightmare against Carshalton, after pulling ourselves back into the game from two nil and down to ten men in the first 3 minutes and again after doing so well against Hornchurch last week.

That's all history and we must now focus on picking up as many points as possible in these last two games in order to give ourselves a chance. Life's easy when things are going well, but seem people get very negative and seem to think it's easier to quit when things are not running smoothly, rather than fight for what they want. I'm a fighter, I have never been relegated in 22 years and I firmly believe the players and

management team around me this afternoon, will not let it happen this year either!

I suppose that will have to do, as I'm only allowed two pages. It's been another difficult year and I cannot deny that I am looking forward to 4.50 next Saturday and a chance to recharge the batteries. I can assure you, there is an awful lot more I'd like to tell about circumstances and incidents throughout this season and give you a real insight into a manager's role, but I don't feel it's appropriate. All I will say, a psychiatrist certainly earns his money.

I'm sure those involved at today's visitors, Leyton will also echo some of these comments. It has been a difficult season for them as a club, but rest assured, they may be already relegated, but they will still fight for every ball today as they look to build towards next season.

Finally, the new ground seems to have sparked a lot of activity in the area of fundraising and a massive well done should go to Paul Rumens and Lori, who both worked tirelessly on a very successful Stuart Pearce Sportsman's Dinner in Northampton last weekend. Dave Albert has the Fans Sportsman's Dinner in the beginning of May and we have the Summer Youth Tournament at Ruislip being arranged by Mark Lloyd. Finally, we also have next weeks Supporters Walk to Hendon. Brilliant stuff by everyone involved! Together, we have nursed this club through difficult times, rising to the Premier on little finance, staying there against all the odds and now, at long last, we have a home, we have a heartbeat and this club is breathing new life!

Here's hoping for 51 points by the end of this afternoon, then safety and the start of a new era.

# Oldest club in London still standing, after all these years....

A trip to the Football Association's new offices in Soho Square London, will reveal that the first record of The Lilywhites existence is in the FA's manual of 1870, when the following entry is made: Founded: 1868 Members: 40 Ground: Opposite The Lion & Key Public House Distance from Station: under 2 miles Honorable Secretary: W. Comerford Colours: White with Blue

cap & White Stockings

Delving into local history, it is pretty certain that the Reverend Morgan Lloyd can be credited with a major hand in the club's foundation, as by acquiring land at the back of The Lion and Key Public House, he made it available for the local young men of the parish to create a pitch on the site, thus forming Leyton Football Club.

With the FA Cup not commencing to 1871 and with leagues not being organised until the late 1880s, Leyton's early years were spent playing friendlies. Rules in these days

allowed sides to compete with odd numbered sides with around ten players being accepted as the norm, the top sides of this era were mainly Old Boy clubs of the public schools as soccer had been played regularly in these schools for a number of years, and also teams of the army with The Royal Engineers being the pick of the bunch.

The club's first competitive match was played on the 14th. November 1874 whereupon they travelled to Southall to face them in the first round of the FA Cup. Alas, although drawing 0-0 on their travels, they lost the replay a fortnight later 5-0.

The next few seasons saw The Lilywhites fair little better in this competition, but in 1879 worse news was to arrive as their pitch was to have the Grange Park Congregational Church built on it (a church still remains on this site today) so, now homeless, the club took the decision to disband.

In 1889, with soccer growing in popularity, a few founder members decided to resurrect the club once again, but as football teams were now numerous in the area, many had the title of Leyton in their name. So, as a pitch had been found behind Matlock Parade (which still can be found between Bakers Ave and Boundary Road in Hoe Street) it was agreed to compete as The Matlock Swifts.

The team soon began to collect its first silverware with The Walthamstow Charity Cup (1892) and The Leyton and District Alliance Championship (1893 & 1894). However, they became fairly nomadic as they left Matlock Parade after just two seasons, playing at Lea Bridge Road (possibly The Hare & Hounds) in Churchfields 1891/92, 1892/93 and Leyton Recreation Ground (Abbots Park) 1893/94.

In 1894/95, The Lilywhites were elevated to The South Essex League, whereupon they moved yet again to The Army Sports Ground (County Ground); now with senior amateur status they changed their name back to Leyton F.C.

The club soon established

itself at this higher level, being crowned champions in 1895/96 and 1896/97, the latter season also saw The Essex Senior Cup placed in the trophy cabinet for the first time (a competition the club would win a further eight times to date). 1897/98 saw The Lilywhites move yet again as a ground was found at The William Cashford Farm Hainault Road.

They also moved up to The London League, but although finishing runners up in their second season, they swiftly returned to The South Essex League, where they were crowned 1898/99 champions.

The 1901/02, campaign saw the club up rooted once again moving to The Hare & Hounds where they remained until 1905/06. During this period they also won The London Senior Cup in 1903. The season 1904/05 saw Leyton take a significant step in their history as by being elected to The Southern League Division Two they turned professional. Finding their feet almost immediately, they gained

Promotion, as runners up to Division One in their second campaign, and as they were now to rub shoulders with the likes of Tottenham Hotspur, West ham United and Millwall in division one, Leyton Borough Council allowed them to move to Osborne Road (now known as Brisbane Road, home of

Leyton Orient).

Alas, although enjoying a few successful seasons at this level equivalent to today's Nationwide League Division Two, the financial burden proved too much, so when finishing bottom in 1911/12 and facing a division two fixture list with many welsh sides, the club decided to disband for a second time.

After the Great War, Leyton reformed for the 1919/20, season amateurs, competing in The Middlesex and South Essex Leagues, playing their games at The Hare and Hounds. After a couple of years, Leyton progressed again to The London League, returning 1922/23 to The Army Sports Ground. It was here that they most definitely began The Lilywhites strongest period, as they were crowned league champions three years running from 1924-26.

1926/27, Leyton gained national fame by lifting The F.A. Amateur Cup for the first time defeating Barking Town 3-1 at Millwall. A year later the club lifted the trophy once again this time over coming Cockfield 3-2 at Middlesborough. Alas, the following season 1928/29 (with the team now returned to Osborne Road), they failed at the last hurdle in a third consecutive attempt to lift the cup, as; they were beaten in the final by Ilford at Highbury 3-1. Although that year was somewhat disappointing, the newly entered Athenian League Championship was won (a league which Leyton competed in until 1981/82).

However documented, the most ardent of Leyton supporters would have to admit that the club rarely reached the heights of the 1920s, although they finished runners up in the Amateur cup in 1934, 1936 and 1952, with the last being played against Walthamstow Avenue at Wembley in front of 100,000 people.

Ground wise, the club had to suffer one last move, as the local borough council saw fit to allow Clapton Orient to have use of Osborne Road, with The Lilywhites eventually returning to The Hare & Hounds, where they still remain to this day.

Although quite a few trophies were obtained, Leyton's next Athenian Championship did not arrive until 1965 with the title being retained the following season. Alas, like other clubs of the day, Leyton became very close to closure due to financial difficulties, so in 1975 Leyton and the Jewish club Wingate amalgamated to form Leyton-Wingate FC.

The club, now with firm backing, began to reap the benefits on the field with The Athenian League title being gained in 1976/77 with the following year seeing The Lilywhites finishing second.

After winning the title again (without losing a game, a league record) in 1981/82, Leyton-Wingate was accepted into The Isthmian League for the 1982/83 season. The club soon found its feet at this new level as in 1984/85 they were crowned Division Two North Champions, this campaign also saw the club reach the First round of The F.A. Cup for the first time since 1955, the side going down 2-0 away to Swansea City at The Vetch Field.

1986/87 saw the club promoted as runners up to the Premier Division, where they stayed until 19991/92, when they were relegated finishing bottom. Wingate, having originated from the Finchley area, also at the end of this season made the decision to return home, so for 1992/93 the club reverted once again to Leyton F.C.

More turmoil was to follow at the end of the 94/95 season, as some committee members and the playing staff departed to join Walthamstow Pennant, changing their name to Leyton Pennant (an amalgamation that has been successfully legally contested).

The club having no alternative, dropped into intermediate football playing in The Spartan and then the Essex Intermediate League. However, in season 99/00 the club returned to senior amateur football when they were admitted into The



Schweppes Essex Senior League and also signed a new ten-year lease on the ground.

Season 2001/02 saw Leyton win promotion to the Ryman League when they won The Foresters Essex Senior League and also lift the Gordon Brasted Memorial Trophy and reach the Final of the A.O.F. League Cup Final.

With the Championship and ground grading secure Leyton gained promotion to the Ryman League Division Two for season 2002/2003.

In their first season in Ryman League Division Two Leyton finished runners up to Cheshunt and were promoted to Division One for season 2003/2004. A successful season also saw them win the Associate Members Trophy against the league champions Cheshunt.

Newly promoted to the Ryman Isthmian League Division One North for season 2003/2004 Leyton took the division by storm, losing only eight league games during the campaign and finished runners up to Yeading with 96 points. Their second spot secured promotion once again for Leyton.

Three promotions in three seasons, and for the new season they would be playing their football in the Ryman (Isthmian) Premier Division. A successful F.A. Cup run also saw them reach the Fourth Qualifying round of the competition before finally succumbing to Histon, who progressed to the First Round Proper.

In an exciting finale to their first season in the top flight, season 2004/2005, they finished in fifth place earning themselves a semi-final play-off tie away to Billericay Town. A magnificent victory in that game saw them progress to the play-off final at Eastleigh and a chance of a place in the Conference South.

Alas it wasn't to be and in a game that could have so easily have gone either way it was Eastleigh who at the whistle gained promotion by the slender margin of two goals to one.

In an effort to ensure the success that had just eluded them the previous season, Leyton began to rebuild their side for season 2005/2006. With new management in place and an influx of new players the

scene was set for another challenge on the title and promotion to Conference South. Sadly the challenge never really materialised and after a poor start to the season Leyton failed to find the form that had given them so much success in recent seasons and finished the campaign in a lowly fifteenth position.

Season 2006/2007 proved

be another fruitless season for Leyton who after winning three and drawing one of their opening four league fixtures failed to maintain their good start and spent most of the season in a mid-table position. A rally in Decemdid ber briefly see them come within striking distance of a play-off spot, but it wasn't to last and the

remainder of the season was spent picking up a few points here and there to ensure they never got into relegation trouble. Unfortunately April proved to be a thoroughly miserable month with five straight defeats on the bounce, but by then they had enough points in the bag to guarantee Premier Division survival.

### Des Thomas - Defender

Des Joined us when we were in the Essex Senior League and has been an influential part of the team that has won successive promotions. A quick centre half who has contributed his fair share of goals over the seasons. Previous club was Stansted

Vas Soteriou - Defender We acquired Vas's services

from Enfield FC five seasons ago. Left back Vas is just as comfortable playing on the wing where his energetic style is a match for anyone. Previous clubs include Cheshunt and Enfield FC.

### Mark Sophocleous -Midfield

Always eager to show his talents and eye for goal..

As a result of this unfortunate defeat at Hornchurch on Saturday and with other teams below them picking up precious points, Wealdstone are now in deep trouble and teetering on the brink of relegation from the Ryman League's Premier Division. Wealdstone will now need to win both of their remaining two games against already relegated Leyton next Saturday and then a really tough call away to play off candidates Hendon the following Saturday, 26<sup>th</sup> May, to have any chance of ensuring survival. Stones now lie 5<sup>th</sup> from bottom and will be at least thankful that other relegation threatened sides dropped points, although any reliance on rivals Harrow Borough to gain a win over Maidstone United was of course always ludicrous. # Must try harder.... The verdict on a school boy performance

What can one say about this Wealdstone performance with a pre match billing of 'massive' and 'must win'? One can offer some valid reasons for such a heavy defeat, namely the sending off of centre half Aaron Goode after only three minutes play, that also resulted in a penalty kick, with Stones, incredibly, already one goal down, and the early loss through injury of the influential Ryan Ashe.

At worst this performance, particularly a torrid second half, could easily be described as an embarrassing defensive shambles, littered with school boy errors. Very few Stones players emerged from this woeful affair with any real credit, but pre match preparation, with the loss of Dean Cracknell and Ben Clarke arriving five minutes before kick off due to M1 traffic, was another negative factor on a day when very little went right for the home side.

Carshalton simply looked more up for the fight right from the first whistle and could have scored from their first attack seconds later that resulted in a corner and an excellent Karamoko

save. But the enigma that is the Stones keeper contrived an almighty blunder a minute later when an attempted clearance was blasted against a Robins forward's backside and the ball rebounded into a gaping net for 0-1 and the worst possible of starts. Stones hardly had time to think when, astonishingly they found themselves 0-2 down - this time from a penalty awarded after Aaron Goode brought down a player in a desperate attempt to clear following another defensive lapse. Goode was shown red and duly despatched from the field of play and the Robins scored from the spot kick.

Utter disbelief, then, as Stones were not only two goals down within 4 minutes of play but were also now a man short. Unsurprisingly a shell shocked home side lacking shape and balance then conceded possession for long periods to a Robin's side that just could not believe their luck. But Carshalton were playing some neat controlled football across the park and with their tails up tried to press home an even bigger advantage. To their credit Stones finally started to recover and began to get some moves going themselves-big Stephen Hughes turned and drove behind when reasonably well placed. But another blow to the luckless home side was not long in coming when Ryan Ashe had to come off following a nasty looking injury and Andre Delisser came on after only 25 minutes.

Strangely, Carshalton then appeared to ease off following a period of Stones midfield pressure and seemed content to play the ball square and even employ some time wasting tactics. The home fans sensed that opportunities would open up if Stones could just up the anti and attack with some vigour. And so it proved,

with Wealdstone's best spell of the half and of the entire match. **Peter Dean** was sent clear on the right and sprinted for goal and although his initial strike was half cleared he followed up to head in. The assistant referee appeared to rule out Dean's effort but following some confusion the goal was given and suddenly the game had a different complexion.

Stones suddenly sensed an equaliser that had seemed hugely unlikely and piled forward, Delisser doing well with some good forward runs. Then an incident involving Peter Dean was very possibly the turning point of the match with a few minutes of the half remaining. Dean again ran clear and challenged Robin's keeper Barnard for a high ball in the area and appeared to be bundled over for a clear spot kick but Referee John McGann waved away appeals from an incensed home team, management and fans. HT 1-2 but real hope for Stones.

A reasonably bright start to the second period from Wealdstone gave little indication of the shambles to come. In fact Stones could have equalised when Lee Chappell put in an excellent cross that Andre Delisser could just not connect to, despite a valiant sliding attempt at the far. A disappointing Ben Clarke then appeared to be felled in the area but appeals fell on deaf ears.

Bizarrely in the context of the match, in between the fourth and fifth goals Karamoko somehow managed to produce two genuine world class saves ,but sadly these mattered little as the Robins ran riot for the remainder of a half definitely best forgotten but may yet come back to haunt the Stones.

Skipper Chris O'Leary salvaged some much needed pride late on when he lashed home to bring the score line back to 2-5 and subs Graeme Montgomery and Dean Papali could have little effect on a match already lost.

On an afternoon when good news was difficult to find and spotting Parakeets in the cemetery trees offered viewing relief, the Stones faithful and, no doubt, the long suffering management team found some solace in hearing that 5 teams out the bottom 8 had also lost.

But if Stones produce another performance akin to this effort, then Leyton or no the grim relegation reaper will come calling.

### On This Day 11 YEARS AGO

Saturday April 19 1997:

Icis League Division Three: Wealdstone 2 Epsom & Ewell 1



THE STONES were on their way to the Isthmian Div 3 title but you wouldn't have guessed it if you one of the nervy 630 crowd at the White Lion ground. That congregation, swollen by lots of local schoolkids, saw a stuttering performance by Gordon Bartlett's side who had looked nailed-on for the championship only a few weeks before. But rivals Harlow and Northwood had both beaten us 2-0 at the White Lion in preceding weeks, and then the Stones were held 0-0 at Kingsbury in the league, and then 0-0 at Leatherhead in the Associate Members Trophy. So no goals in four games.

And it got worse against mid-table Epsom when, after former Epsom player Stuart Miller (recently signed by us) had missed a string of first half chances, the visitors took the lead after Darren Bonfield had spilled a shot on goal. The rebound was easily tucked away. Dominic Sterling, marauding from midfield, came close to equalising but the turning point came when Miller was replaced by Bryan Hammatt. His enthusiasm immediately put Epsom on the back foot and it was

Hammatt who was shoved over, trying to reach a cross, that earned a penalty with 20 minutes to go. We had seen our previous two spot-kicks saved but Steve Bircham coolly converted this time.

The pressure was all on Epsom now and another late substitute, Lee Walker grabbed the decisive goal in the last 10 minutes as the crowd bayed for a winner. Mark (Bert) Weedon intercepted a through ball and played a great ball out to Simon Garner on the left, in front of the Grassy Knoll. He bore down on goal, cut inside and his fierce blast was only half saved by the Epsom keeper – and Walker jubilantly hooked in the loose ball. The win put us back on track for the title, eventually clinched on that glorious afternoon at Northwood a couple of weeks later.

### ON THIS DAY 39 YEARS AGO

Saturday April 19th 1969 Isthmian League: Bromley 0 Wealdstone 4

There will be precious few current Stones supporters who were alive and kicking during this relatively successful campaign in the old amateur days of the Isthmian League. I didn't see my first Wealdstone match for another four months. But for those of that vintage some of the names in the Wealdstone line up will trip off the tongue and bring back great memories. Goalkeeper Andy Williams was probably as good a custodian as the club has fielded and ranks up there with the likes of Danny

Wiltshire, Ray Goddard and Bob Iles. Tony McGuiness was a towering centre half, Denis Montague a skilful and 'competitive' midfielder, Bernie Bremer and John Hutchinson quick and tricky wingers, and forwards Dave Swain and Keith Searle top notch goalscorers somewhere near the peak of their powers. This barrel load of experience was augmented by the youth and promise of Micky Barnard, Dave Bullock, Terry Smith and 17 year old schoolboy John Ritchie.

# ON THIS DAY 22 YEARS AGO

Saturday April 19th 1986 GM Vauxhall Conference: Wycombe Wanderers 1 Wealdstone 0

I remember this game clearly, though more for circumstantial reasons than the actual hour and a half (which was actually pretty dreary). In those days I was padding out my journalistic earnings with a bit of radio commentary for LBC, and had instigated a Non-League Match of the Day' slot at the start of the season which seemed a perfect vehicle for me to watch Wealdstone and get paid for it. Funnily enough the Stones were often featured in the 'Match of the Day' feature...though not that strange for the time as we were vying with Enfield and Barnet to be the dominant force in the semi-pro game.

Having won the double the previous season we started 1985-86 like a train and were in the top three right up until Spring—when suddenly the wheels came off for no apparent reason (though Alan Cordice's injury in October was a grievous blow). This trip to Loakes Park, Wycombe's old home pre-Adams Park, was typical of the time. Having persuaded the London Broadcasting Corporation's hierarchy that a game taking place in Buckinghamshire was, indeed, the capital's crunch match of the day, I was made to eat my words with a desperately

dull 90 minutes. Not much to tell the listeners.

The Wanderers were fighting relegation, with us in a mid-table comfort zone, and our attacks looked laboured with the one-paced Mark Graves and Andy Graham desperately crying out for a Cordice to unlock the home defence. We were pretty solid ourselves—not much got past Messrs Bowgett, Byatt, McCargo and Wainwright—and just as it seemed 0-0 was odds-on, a young Mark West (I believe) popped up on the wrong side of Steve Tapley to crack the only goal past Bob Iles.

Wycombe ended up third from bottom and were relegated on goal difference—despite finishing level on 36 points with Nuneaton, Maidstone and Dagenham who all survived—with Northwich only a further point ahead. The last day of that season must have been interesting! We finished 10th and the slow decline had begun.

The Bromley game was the culmination of 3 away fixtures on the spin. The previous two had resulted in a 3-1 win at Clapton and a 1-1 draw at the dangerous St Albans, then managed by Syd Prosser. This defeat of Bromley was not unexpected as our Kent friends were in those days a somewhat struggling side. Two goals from John Hutchinson and one each from John Ritchie and Denis Montague settled the issue. This was a very good Wealdstone side that finished in fifth position in the league, ten points behind champions Enfield.

It could be argued that they might have been a greater threat to our old Southbury

Road mates had Hugh Lindsay not suffered a fairly lengthy injury and Charlie Townsend not decided in early March 1969 to leave and try his luck with at Hitchin Town, at that time managed by ex-Stones coach Vince Burgess. No team deprived of talent of that magnitude could have remained unscathed.
