FROM THE DUGOUT: GORDON BARTLETT

Numerous Highs & Lows

Good afternoon and I would like to welcome the two Danny's and their Concord team to our last home game of the season and I'm pleased to say we are still in with a shout of extending our campaign for another week. This is the perfect time to reflect on the last 9 months and the 62 games preceding today. Regardless of the result this afternoon, this has been an incredible season and one we can look back on with immense pride. Reaching the Semi Final of the FA Trophy must rank as the outstanding achievement but getting to the Middlesex Senior Final and being in contention for a play-off place going into the last week of the season is testament to the fantastic effort of the players.

Numerous highs and lows along the way, but things certainly didn't start out too well. Personally, the two most disappointing days must rank as the 4-2 home defeat to Wingate followed by the embarrassing FA Cup exit at the hands of Beaconsfield SYCOB. From those dismal days of the middle of September where criticism was rife towards both players and management, who could possibly have imagined what was to come. You'll probably be surprised to know that Hicksy is the only member of the FA Cup team who is no longer with us (only recently gone as well) and only Spendy and Jake have gone from the Wingate game, so we have certainly been rewarded for our faith in the squad.

It's interesting to note the gradual league progress we have made over the 4 quarters of the season:

Over the first ten games we only picked up 13 points

The next ten saw a slight improvement with 15 points

The ten in the middle of the Trophy run netted 19 points

And the recent eleven which sees us top of the form guide 24 points

We are particularly pleased with our

defensive record where we have only conceded 38 goals in 41 games, which has given us an excellent platform to build from and kept an amazing 26 clean sheets in all competitions, I've

mentioned my two low points but fortunately, I can think of many more highs. I remember challenging the players before the Barrow game to create one of their own a 'career highlights' by beating the full timers in the Trophy. It's incredible to think they not only achieved that, but surpassed that memorable occasion by beating Dartford in a replay and then to witness those fantastic scenes when we beat Cambridge away in the quarter finals. We were fortunate to share that emotion with the 600 fans that took over one end of the ground and sang their hearts from beginning to end. The feeling of elation at the final whistle, the tears of joy amongst so many and the celebrations in the changing room will certainly rank as one of my most satisfying of my career. It was amazing support for a 'tin pot' outfit and it has been a contributory factor in our success this season and I'm sure the lads we will to join me in thanking you for your outstanding support over this campaign.

On the subject of success, I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate both the Capital League side and the Ladies team on becoming league Champions. Well done to everyone involved.

I have got lots of people to thank for their

I'd like to start with Adam and Minnie Gloor for the outstanding programme and all the time and hard work they have both put in over the past few years. The quality of the programme has undoubtedly been the envy of most non leagues clubs. We have been lucky to have you and I hope you enjoy your well-earned rest!

Roy and Alan Couch, Fingers and Alison for their hard work behind the scenes regarding the administration and the general smooth running of this club.

I must mention Howard, Fingers, Pete, Barry, Andrew and the rest of the Board for their support, especially when they were under pressure to sack us!

Jez Albert and the supporters club for the financial help with the wages at the start of the season and the general help they have given us.

Our connection with Watford FC has continued to flourish and I must thank Sean Dyche, Ross Wilson and Nick Cox for their help particularly with the loan players at important times in the season.

I write these notes on Wednesday evening before a Q & A with Sean at the club tomorrow evening and it struck me the differences between Full time and Part time management. Sean and his coaching staff have their players all week, they can control the work load and will end up playing 49 games this season. We have no control over our lads outside work situations, we only see them for one training session and today we play our 63rd game of this campaign. Oh to be full time!

Probably the biggest thank you outside the players must go to our management team. I believe you are only as good as the people that surround you and in Gilly, Leo, and Micky I could not pick anyone better. You three have been brilliant! Jason with the GK's, John with the Reserves and I must mention Murph who has helped out both at training and with the reserves. Our success is down to everyone contributing and working as a team on and off the park with no big ego's. We win and lose together. The 'physio' room has been a busy place

over this long hard season and Gary, James and Chris have done an excellent job keeping the players fit and well.

Tony Waugh has been like a breath of fresh air at this club. Not only does he do a fantastic job with the kit, but nobody escapes his dry northern humour which contributes greatly to the banter and spirit we have around the dressing room.

Little things make a difference and the tea making and cakes for the management from Pauline W and James on the away trips and Pauline and Graham S at home games have been much appreciated.

The players have been magnificent. After a difficult start, their attitude, desire and will to win has made them a pleasure to work with and all of them deserve something to show for this season. They have really bought into our idea of using the squad and I think this has been a major influence on the good form we have produced recently. In addition, the young loan players like Britt, Connor, Tommie, James have also fitted in extremely well and made valuable contributions during important times of the season. Once again, our average home gate has improved and the vocal support has been outstanding, but I just ask for one more big effort this afternoon to help us make it over the line. I am proud to be Manager of this 'unique peoples club', but I want to experience that winning feeling again and share the emotion with everyone associated with the Stones. After so many difficult years keeping this club alive, I think you deserve it!

That's it from me. Enjoy today's game and I hope to see many of you at tonight's presentation and let's hope we can extend this great season for another week.

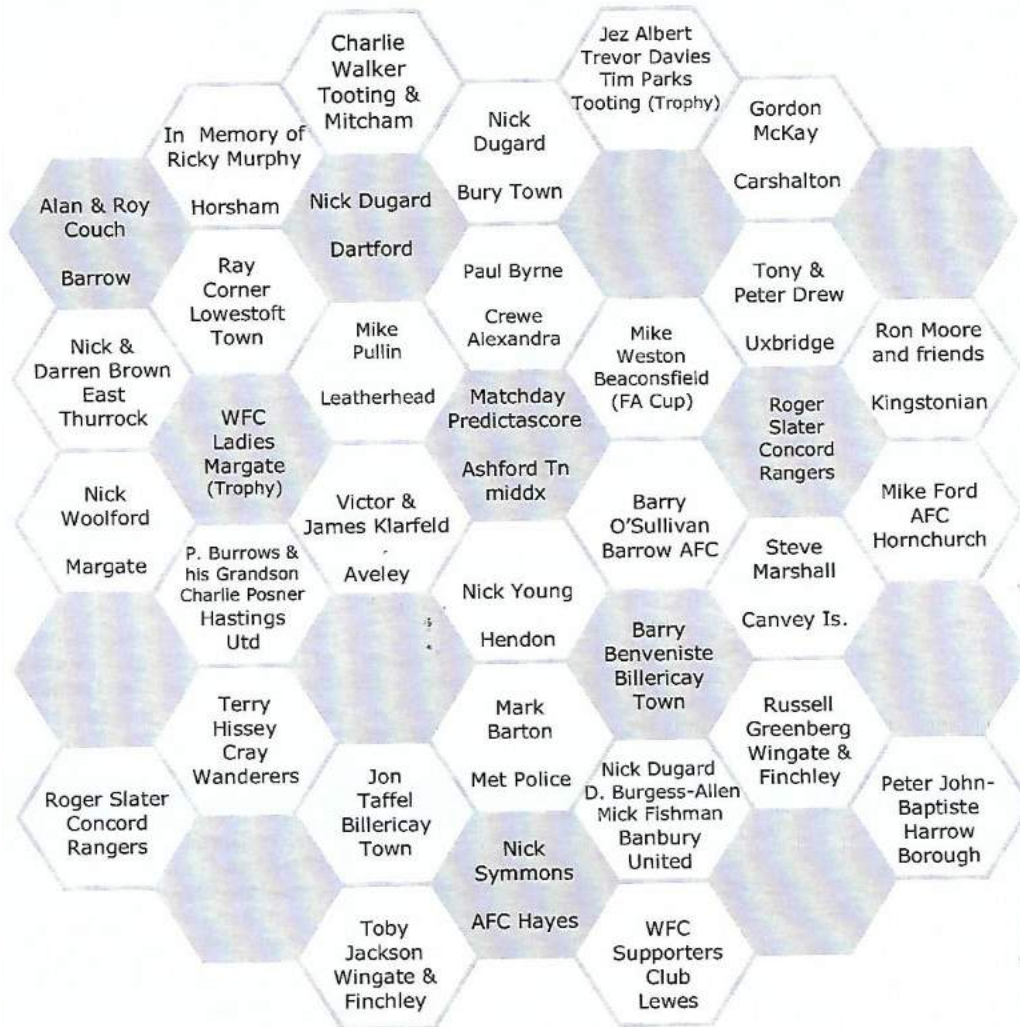

The Beach Boys

Concord Rangers originated from a team of boys headed by Steve Lant. They played friendly matches during 1966 on a pitch along the Canvey Island seafront close to the Concord Beach hence the name Concord Rangers and the nickname The Beach Boys.

1967 - Albert Lant, Steve's father and current Club President became the team manager and took the club into competitive football. The Club joined the Thundermite Boys Football League.

1973 - Concord joined the Vange and District League and during this period they won several league and cup honours.

1979 - Concord became the first winners of the Essex Sunday Junior Trophy managed by current Secretary Chris Cerie, with a 4 - 0 win over Bishops Park from Brentwood, the final being played at Tiptree FC.

Saturday football was introduced to the club when Concord joined the Mid Essex League and played their home games at Waterside Farm on Canvey Island.

1985 - Concord secured some land at Thames Road, Canvey Island, the club developed the clubhouse and ground with Jack Smith, current club treasurer being the mastermind behind the project, he organised the funds, labour and materials and worked many hours himself on the site. A special mention goes to the late Clive Smith (Jack's brother) without Clive's machinery and labour Concord's pitch would not exist also Martin Gill, Steve Barnes, Brian Godfrey, Lee and John Slater, Rob Fletcher (Electrics) all contributed.

1988-1989 Concord joined the Essex Intermediate League and was Divisional League and Cup Winners.

1991-1992 Concord joined the Essex Senior League and achieved the following.

1996-1997 Essex Senior League Cup winners defeating Ford Utd 1 - 0.

1997-1998 Essex Senior League Championship winners. Manager Lee Paterson

1999-2000 Harry Fisher

Memorial Trophy winners defeating Burnham Ramblers 3 - 2

2002-2003 Essex Senior League Runners-up
2003-2004 Essex Senior League Championship Winners - Manager - Ben Embery.

Danny Heale is the winner of the Don Douglas Trophy this season for the Leagues top scorer with a tally of 32 goals..

Founder Albert Lant retired after 25 years as Chairman in 1992 to become the Club President. Current Club Treasurer Jack Smith then held the Chairman position for two years, Grant Beglan who is the CEO at Aspect Contracts, Concord's main sponsors, then became Chairman and also held the position for two years.

Antony Smith is the current Chairman and is very hands-on in his approach, under Antony's guidance the Club has seen fantastic progress these past few seasons both on the playing side and also on the development of the ground.

2007-08 Concord Rangers 40th Anniversary season

Danny Scopes and Danny Cowley become joint managers and managed the team in this important year for the club and they had a magnificent year. Concord ended the season winners of the Essex Senior League, Gardon Brasted Memorial Trophy Winners and were Essex Senior League Cup Finalists.

Concord also reached the quarter finals of the FA Vase this season before losing 1-0 to Lowestoft Town who went on to reach the final which was played at Wembley Stadium.

Concord's Danny Heale won the Don Douglas Trophy for the second time as the leagues top marksman scoring a magnificent 46 goals and setting an Essex Senior League record.

Clun President Albert Lant won an outstanding achievement award from the Essex County Football Association for 40 years unbroken service to Concord Rangers.

2008-09 Having gained promotion from the Essex Senior League we would have been happy with a mid table position at the end of our first season in the Ryman League Division 1 North. The management team of Danny Scopes and Danny Cowley managed to get the best out of our players and achieved a play off position having finished 5th. We then went on to

beat East Thurrock United, who had finished in the second spot 1-0 in the play off Semi Final, Danny Heale scored a magnificent goal to put us through to the Final and play Waltham Abbey.

Concord was only 10 minutes away from playing in the Ryman Premier League this season having gone One up through Fabien Batchelor but Waltham

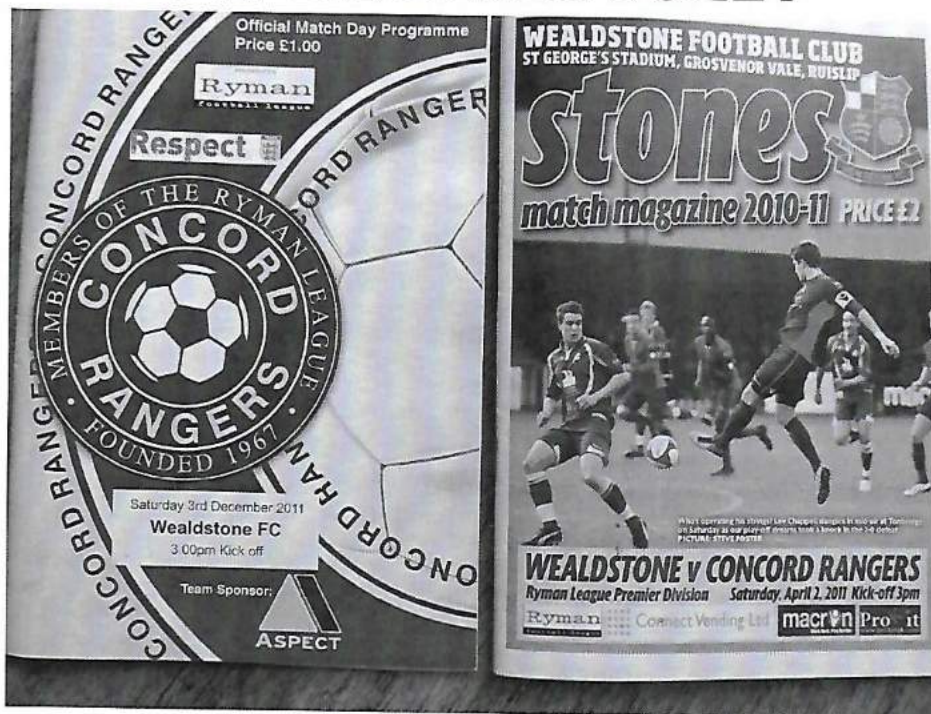
agreed terms to stay with Concord.

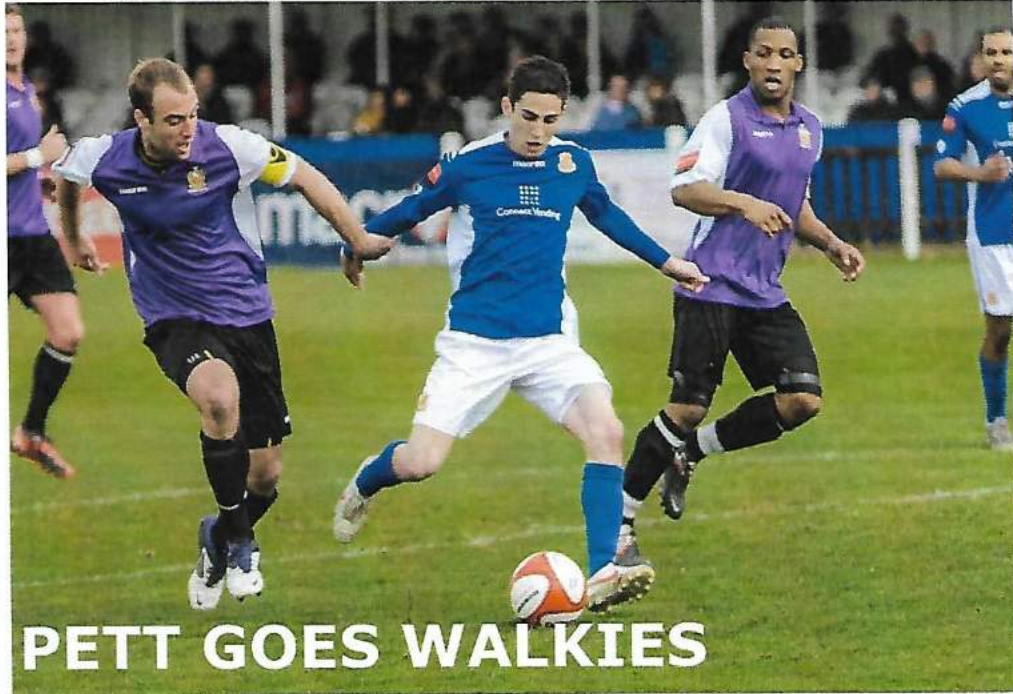
Richard Jolly was certainly in supersonic form that day scoring four of our six goals in a 6-1 win. (some things in life never change)

later, this time hitting a powerful effort from 20 yards which Jones did well to hold onto.

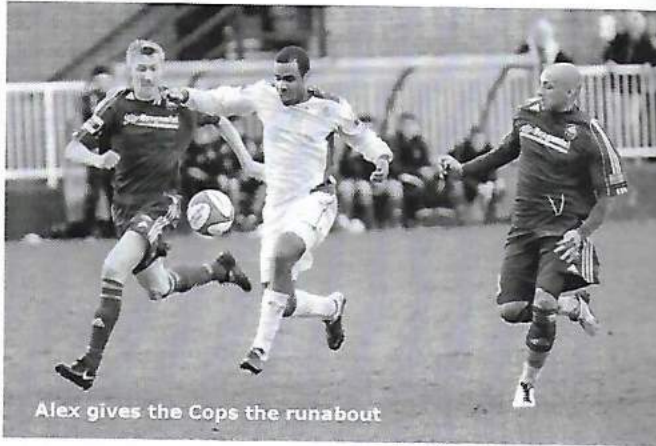

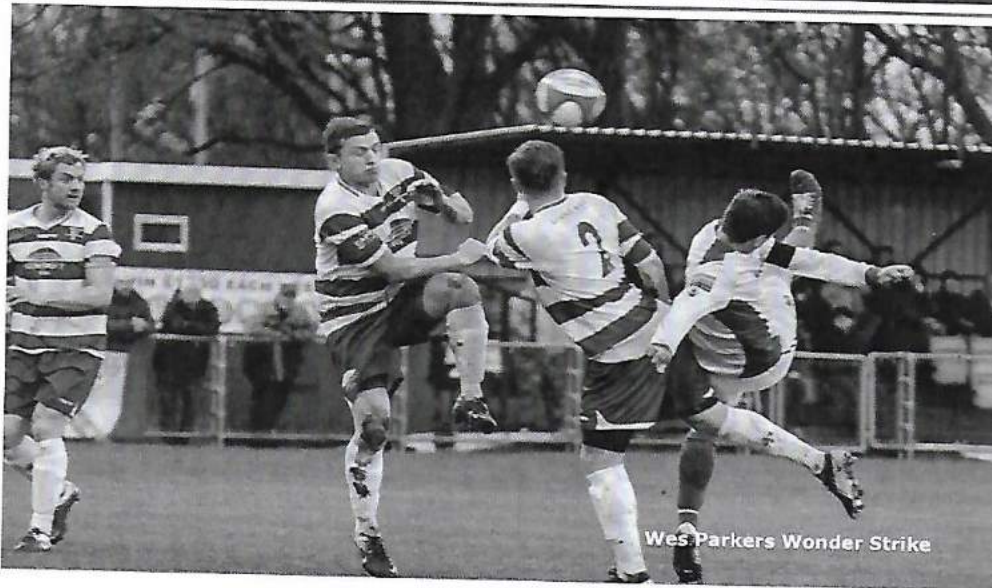

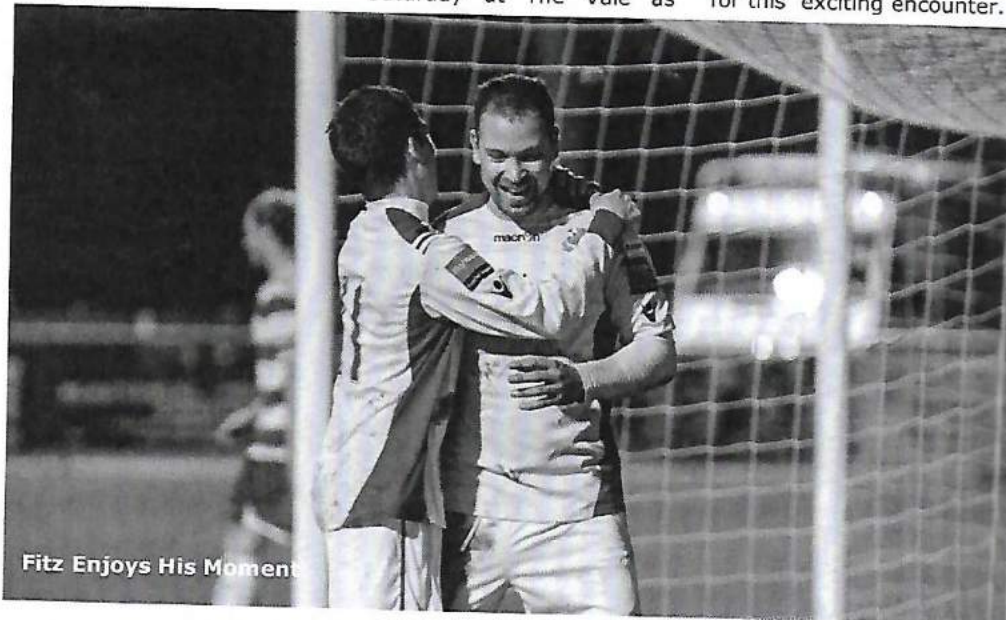

I really didn't have Ashlee as an Eastenders kind of guy but there you go.

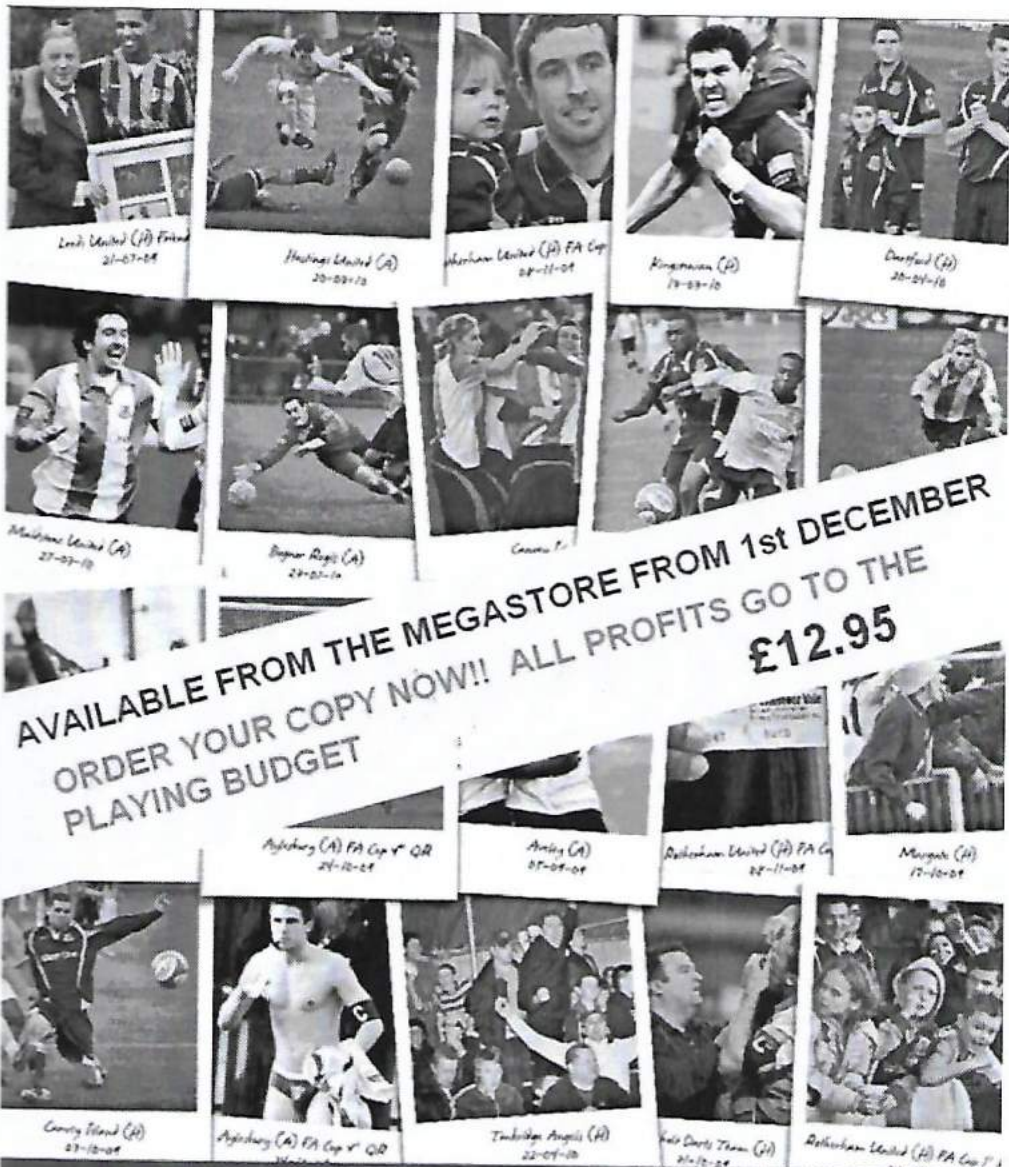

31 years ago: Stones fight against relegation from the Alliance Premier League

THE STONES were on the precipice, hovering over the APL's trap door with just one game remaining... but the two points from this Tuesday night beating of Barrow, making it three straight wins, had everyone believing that we could pull off a

Houdini-like escape.

Our proud club, which had turned professional just 10 years before, had enjoyed a decade of success since leaving the cosy amateur world behind.

After years of solid foundations in the Athenian league and Isthmian League, the Stones' committee had opted to join the pro ranks of the Southern League ... a bold leap in an uncertain

financial climate, but one which paid off as the club won the Southern League First Division in 1974 and then established itself in the Premier Division through the latter 1970s. We were then invited to be part of the 20-strong Alliance Premier League in 1979 - non-League's equivalent of the break-away Premier League.

So there we were. In non-League's elite. Today's Conference National.

More magic moments

**Wealdstone 2
Barrow 0**

ANOTHER moment of magic from teenage full-back Stuart Pearce continued the great Wealdstone revival at Lower Mead on Tuesday night.

His 43rd-minute goal came at an identical time, and from an identical position, to the one he scored at Kettering on Saturday. And Tuesday night's goal was just as precious.

It arrived after the Cumbrian visitors, enjoying an eight-game unbeaten run, had dominated the first half almost exclusively. Wealdstone needed a goal to settle their nerves but with passes going astray on the slippery turf it was Barrow who applied the pressure.

Ian Cranstone came to the rescue with crucial saves from Jackson and Moore, and the goalkeeper stuck out a leg in the 36th minute to divert another Moore effort to safety.

It came as a complete surprise when Pearce opened the scoring from 22 yards. Alan Cordice was tripped on the right of the penalty area and the full-back stood in transfixed delight as his bending free kick beat goalkeeper Thomas all the way to his top left-hand corner.

"He does it all the time in training. Now he's started doing it in matches," said a happy Allen Batsford after the game.

That 43rd minute altered the entire complexion of the match. Wealdstone looked a different side after the break and after Neil Cordice, Paul Bowgett and the marauding Pearce had all seen efforts brilliantly dealt with by Thomas it was no surprise when the Stones made it 2-0 after 67 minutes.

The quicksilver Alan Cordice raced onto Bowgett's pass on the right of the box but was felled by a rash challenge from Barrow's Steve Brooks.

Barrow protested vigo-

rously — Knowles was booked — but Jimmy Sweetzer made no mistake with the penalty kick.

It wasn't Brooks' day. Five minutes from time he thumped a header against his own post from Pearce's corner and was bawled out by goalkeeper Thomas.

Along with the cream of the Southern and Northern Premier League clubs: Yeovil, Altrincham, Scarborough, Boston United, Bath City, Telford, Barnet

The problem was, that having reaching non-League's pinnacle, the only way was **DOWN**. The Stones had never been relegated before in all its 81-year history. But in only the second season of Alliance Premier League football that fact was staring us in the face.

Most pundits would have had us down as relegation fodder the previous season. Along with clubs like AP Leamington and Redditch we were the undoubted minnows of the APL, and it was only a mid-season rally under newly-appointed boss Ken Payne that saw us to safety in 15th place.

ROLLERCOASTER

But the 1980-81 season was a rollercoaster. I saw it all first hand, covering the club as a sports reporter for the Harrow Observer, as we veered from opening-day joy (a 4-0 home win over Telford) to FA Cup grief (defeat in a replay to Harlow Town in the final qualifying round, with the winners drawn to play Charlton at home) and finally the axe for Ken Payne, one of football's nice guys.

Payne had been promoted from reserve team manager when the previous incumbent, Alan Fogarty, was sacked. His only previous management experience was with Whitwell in the Herts County League... chairman Fred Deanus might as well have made me the manager. In fact, a few tactical suggestions I made over the phone to the under-pressure Payne, after Press de-briefings, were carried out almost to the letter!

So it was merciful relief when Ken Payne was relieved of his duties, soon after the Harlow

defeat, and in stepped Allen Batsford. Chalk and cheese! Batsford was a renowned tactician and man manager, having worked miracles with a small squad at Wimbledon - steering them to successive Southern League title and promotion to the Football League - after doing a similar job at FA Cup giant-killers Walton & Hersham.

It was a real coup for Deanus. Batsford brought with him his assistant, Brian Hall, and the pair quickly set about making the Stones more robust.

Alas, Batsford's major failing (which he readily admitted in later years) was keeping faith with goalkeeper Ian Cranstone, a brave and excellent shotstopper but prone to making cardinal errors. Particularly in the air, and rushing off his goalline when he had less hope than Cinderella of making it to the ball.

DECENT

The rest of the team were actually pretty decent. Batsford had

brought in defender Dennis Byatt from Northampton, and tenacious midfielder Jimmy Sweetzer from Millwall to add to people like Stuart Pearce (young but needing no introduction), Colin Hardman (ex Barnet), Fred Barwick (excellent ex-Spurs midfielder), the solid Steve Perkins (ex Chelsea), the superb Robin Wainwright, Paul Bowgett and Nigel Johnson, and the Cordice brothers Alan and Neil (again no introduction).

So how did we get in such a state? I believe a lack of confidence, and a natural goalscorer, was key. And once Batsford had found a way of instilling that confidence, that self-belief, the goals started arriving from all over the park.

Thus it was that a Stones team written-off for relegation by the end of March found themselves, by the time of this Barrow game, in the middle of a rich seam of form. We had ended months of unlucky draws and defeats by

walloping Boston 3-0 at home, followed by a sensational 1-0 win at Championship-chasing Kettering (thanks to a cracking Stu Pearce freekick)... and then, as Martin Allen's cutting shows, a 50% bigger than usual Lower Mead crowd turned up to see Barrow beaten comprehensively.

Take into account two Easter Lower Mead friendlies - a 7-0 win over a Millwall XI and a 2-2 draw with Wycombe Wanderers - you can see why the Stones went into the last game of the season (against fellow relegation candidates AP Leamington) on a real high, unbeaten in five games and racking up 15 goals while conceding just two. We knew that another win, and maybe just a point, would guar-

antee survival on the final Saturday, again at Lower Mead, against Leamington....

WHAT HAPPENED NEXT?

Well, younger readers, you can imagine the pain of us oldies. This one in particular. There I was, sitting in the Press Box with a stack full of orders from the midland newspapers (in those days there were three evening papers wanting copy on all the Midland non-League teams) and radio stations and I joyfully spent an hour or more updating the readers/listeners on the unfolding events.

All was going to plan. Robin Wainwright gave us the lead against struggling Leamington, who simply **HAD** to win to stay up but rarely looked like crossing the halfway line against the revitalised Stones.

And it looked like 'game over' when Alan Cordice was felled in the box after an hour and the ref blew for a penalty... up stepped Jimmy Sweetzer, the new boy from Millwall, who had comfortably scored from the spot against Barrow.

We waited for the Elmslie End net to billow, and the fans to erupt in response. But Sweetzer inexplicably placed his shot a yard wide of the right hand post.

Leamington had been handed a lifeline and suddenly we were on the ropes. A spell of pressure

with 15 minutes to go saw a sharp move and Cranstone was beaten. 1-1 We were still safe as long as we didn't concede again... and of course, with the clock ticking down, a high diagonal ball was pumped in the general direction of their their ex-Yeovil striker Doug Hickton. There was no real danger with two defenders covering, but the erratic Cranstone decided to rush headlong from his area and was beaten to the touch by Hickton, and (as if in slow motion) the ball arced on into the Cinema End net to a ghastly hush.

Their players celebrated wildly. The 800 or so home crowd saw nothing, heard nothing save the blood pumping in their ears. This was unbelievable.

From relief to relegation in the space of a few horrible

minutes. This was truly the Stones lowest point. And yet....

Three weeks earlier I had roamed the Lower Mead terraces during a home match against Scarborough (a 2-2 draw), wearing my reporter's hat, to carry out an opinion poll on whether it would be a good thing if the Stones went down or managed to survive.

A huge majority believed that relegation would be a very bad thing. Only one club would be promoted back up the following season.

But surely, went the counter-argument, staying up by the skin of your teeth could only mean another season of struggle to follow. Perhaps it would be better to re-group in the Southern League?

Only Kevin Bright (dear, late and lamented Kevin, who died a few years ago) was the real dissenting voice. 'I reckon we'll go down', he stated, 'but come back, under Allen Batsford, a real force to be reckoned with. And we'll be back in the APL before long.'

Well, he was right. So right. No-one would have believed how right, as within four years we would be crowned the first true Champions of non-League; the first winners of the double.

Of course, the Stones have been relegated on more than one occasion since. But because of 1981 it holds no fears... we know we can bounce back, and will bounce back forever more.

Where you live (just general area): I've lived in Ruislip for 50 years.

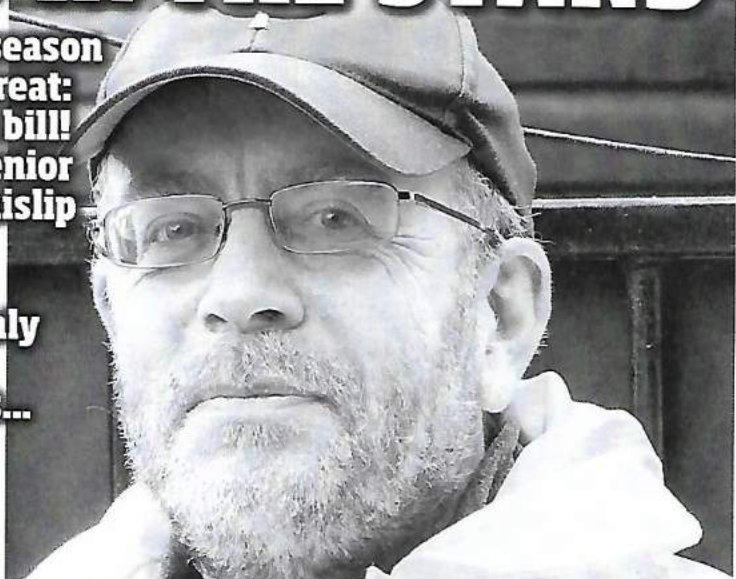
Where you work (and occupation): I work in the Colindale telephone exchange as a receiving officer with BT.
