STONES SHOP NEWS

So here we are back at the start of a new season and a big welcome to all for this afternoon's first ever match in the General Maotors Vauxhall Conference. How the Elmslie End are going to sing that I am not sure! With the World Cup, post mortems on Maradona's handiwork and hoologans running riot at European pre-season freindlies, it hardly seems that we have had a summer break, yet as usual we start a new season with hopes of success and with as good a chance as everyone else.

The 1985/86 season for me ended with a seat at Wembley Stadium for the F.A. Trophy Final between Altrincham and Runcorn courtesy of the Harrow Observer. I had obviously been one of the few to crack their tough competition to name the two teams at the previous year's final! Altrincham did enough to win the game that naturally lacked the excitement of the previous year's encounter and strangely the new season starts with the two managers having swopped clubs to try new challenges for the future. John Williams has taken three of his Runcorn side to Moss Lane, but at the time of writing

none have left Altrincham in the opposite direction.

A surprise move to Boston United is the departure of the highly-rated Kevin Blackwell. Despite letters of protest to the local paper, Manager Ray O'Brien considered Blackwell "stale" an so the fine keeper has rejoined his old club Barnet. Rumours linking ex-Manchester United and Arsenal keeper Jimmy Rimmer as Blackwell's successor have proven false so far. Meantime former Boston Manager Arthur Mann who spent last season at Telford has gone back to one of his former clubs, Ketterig Town, as a player. Boston ended up as last season's best supported Gola side despite their mediocre League position. Their 21 home League games were watched by 27,319 people, an avarage of 1,301, boosted by the season's top League gate in the country of 2,067 for Wealdstone's visit to York Street. Telford finished second in the attendance tables with an avarage of 1,109.

Souvenirs: Our end-of season sale and discount to Supporters Club members proved popular last season, so far the first three home games v Stafford, Dageham and Northwich, we shall be retaining bargain prices for "away" scarves (half Price), bottle-openers for 50p and mini-pennants

down to 75p. Additionally, windscreen-width car stickers are reduced to £1.25.

Reading Material: "Pyramid" magazine is no longer on sale at Club Shops, but can be ordered on a year's subscription for £7.20. Application forms are in the April edition which is available in the Club Shop. "Programme Monthly" which gave our Club Shop praise in their July issue is on sale at £1.00 for some 56 pages - an invaluable read for collectors. Sutton United's excellent "Guide to Non-League Football" sells at £1,50 and covers the Glola League and three feader Leagues. No details of this year's "Non-League Directory" are yet known, but orders will be requested in our match programme in the normal fashion. Orders are, however, being taken for a new book entitled "Defunct F.C." published in July and providing histories and statistics of five Non-League clubs that are no longer in existance. The 260 page volume sells at £7.25.

Kit Sponsorship: We have already made a flying start to this season's kit sponsorship scheme with Steve Tapley's entire kit sponsored by Prestige Travel and new signing Andy Wallace being fully sponsored by Mick Ferguson and Steve Last who were obviously impressed by that rocket shot that beat Charlton in last week's Friendly! Our grid will appear elsewhere in the programme and all donations for socks, shirts, shorts, boots or whole kits will be much appreciated. Please see me in the

Club Shop.

Lapel Badges: We ald stone F.C. was delighted to play hosts on Trophy Fianl day of the Association of Football Badge Collectors who came together for the morning meeting, a trip to Wembley and then an evening buffet in the Vice Presidents's louge. Current issues and collectors's

items from the past excahnged hands and a superb selection of badges was on show. For my own part I have been busy during the summer having produced new badges for Bath City, Whitney Town, Rainham Town and Buckingham Town. Further badges will follow during the coming months for Billericay Town, Fryston Colliery, Crusaders F.C. of Cheltenham and the Republic of Ireland Suporters Club (London branch). Our opponents today Stafford Rangers are in the undistinguished company of Runcom, Kettering Town, Nuneaton Borough and Welling United as the only GMVC clubs without a proper enamel badge, so perhaps they would like to follow the example of Sutton United, Enfield, Boston United and Bath City and put matters right!.

Lastly, I should like to congratulate David Free on winning the Gola League "Programme of the Year" award last season. Production of our match day programme which we all take for granted is a full-time task and only maintains its high standard due to David's hard work and the much needed flow of contributions which must be provided by supporters if readers are to be given a variety of reading material.

ON THE MOVE

DARTFORD completed only half of their scheduled ten Capital League fixtures last season and in accordance with the League's rules their results have been expunged from the competition. As a result Wealdstone's 8-1 triumph at Watling Street has now been re-classified as a 'Friendly'. This means our players who took part in this fixture will have one appearance deducted from their totals as appearances in 'friendlies' are not included in club records. The goal scorers will not be affected apart from transferring these eight goals from the Capital League to Friendlies in the amended scoring chart which appears elsewhere in this programme.

WEALDSTONE conceded ten goals in a match for the first time in the club's history when Brentford won 11-1 in a Capital League fixture at Lower Mead last April. Apart from Andy Williams in goal, who incidentially saved a late penalty, the Wealdstone side was made up entirely of members of the Supporters Club team, SFC Wealdstone. Brentford on the other hand included five of their first team.

THE CORDICE BROTHERS have almost identical records for Wealdstone. Alan has played in 281 league and cup matches and scored 97 goals. Neil has made two fewer appearances and scored four goals fewer.

Now starting his fifth season with Wealdstone, **MARK GRAVES** has been our leading marksman in each of the previous four. He has now scored 122 goals in all matches and has appeared in exactly 200 league and cup matches.

SHARED BATH

In an historic move, Bath City will be sharing their Twerton Park ground with the third division Bristol Rovers. This is the first time that a Football League club has opted to play its home games at a 'non-league' ground. Bath City Vice-Chairman, Mr. Frank Entwistle said: "I believe that this arrangement will work to the benefit of both clubs."

Bristol Rovers will pay an annual rent of £20,000 together with the gate bonus of 10% of income over an agreed level.

Rovers estimate that 3,000 supporters will regularly travel the twelve miles to Twerton Park. Approximately, their first home game will be against Bath City on August 12th in a friendly match.
