Opposition in focus

Roxonian FC was founded in the summer of 1933. The Club spent their first season in the Harrow and District League (playing their home games at a ground on Northolt Road), finishing runners-up in Division 1. They were accepted into the Spartan League, which coincided with the move to Earlsmead.

The early 1980s saw the Club's most successful spell so far. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won in 1980, the Middlesex Senior Cup three years later. Also in 1983 Harrow Borough reached the semi-finals of the FA Trophy, losing to the eventual winners, Telford United, over two legs.

A year later, the Club's Golden Jubilee was celebrated with a drawn match against Manchester United, Harrow's best FA Cup run so far, losing to Newport County (then of the old Football League Division 3) in the 2nd Round Proper and best of all, winning the Isthmian League Premier Division championship by a staggering 17 point margin.

Under astute manager Micky Tomkys, Harrow had enjoyed continuous success but his retirement in 1986 saw a gradual decline in the Club's fortunes. On three occasions a win in the final game of the season was required to enable the club to retain their treasured Isthmian Premier Division status.

1992/93, however, saw a dramatic improvement, with both the Middlesex Senior Cup and Middlesex Charity Cup returning to Earlsmead. The semi-final of the latter saw Chelsea defeated 4-1. A league placing of 8th was also their best for 6 seasons. This form continued over the next three seasons under the management team of Harry Manoe, with the Club finishing 9th in 1993-94, 10th 1994-95 and 9th again in 1996-97. A dip in the Club's fortunes saw his departure, to be

followed by a succession of managers. A disastrous run of form during the 1999/00 season saw the Club avoid relegation by just a single goal.

Despite an encouraging start to the season to the 2000/01 season, which saw Boro' reach the 1st Round Proper of the FA Challenge Cup for only the second time (losing 0-3 at Wycombe Wanderers), a poor run of performances after Christmas saw the Club finish 4th from bottom again with just 2 points to spare.

2001-02 saw the club commence a long-term plan, targeting youth development. As well as fielding a young side, which managed to retain Premier Division status once more, close partnerships were formed with local youth football clubs. The summer of 2004 saw the formation of an Allied Counties under 18's squad, designed to bridge the gap between youth and senior football.

Under the stewardship of manager David Howell Boro' continued their youth and community development and they now have links with a number of local youth football clubs and schools.

Season 2006/07 saw Boro' finish in a relegation position only for their Premier Division place to be saved by Lancaster City whose financial difficulties saw them being relegated instead.

Enforced cost cutting during the summer of 2008 saw the Club resigning its membership of the Allied Counties Youth League. This proved to be only a one season absence from youth team football as Boro' entered the expanded Ryman Youth League for the 2009-10 season.

Season 2009-10 saw Boro' finish in a very creditable 14th position in the Ryman Premier Division, At Reserve Team level Boro's Capital League side, under the stewardship of Stuart

Crawford, brought much success to the Club by winning the double of the Capital League: Western Division Title to go along with that of Capital League: President's Challenge Cup winners. Added to the fact that Boro' had cleared their longstanding debt with HM Revenue & Customs and the Club entered the 2010-11 season with new found optimism.

A final position of 5th at the end of that season was their highest placing for a considerable number of years and earned the Club a place in the end of season play-offs for promotion to the Conference South. Defeat at Tonbridge Angels in extra time in the Semi Finals saw an end for the timebeing of that dream but it was still a brilliant season for the Club. And Boro' were the highest goalscorers in the Ryman Premier Division with 77 goals scored. They also reached the 1st Round Proper of the FA Cup, losing out narrowly to the eventual League 2 Champions, Chesterfield, and giving the Boro' faithful much pleasure and entertainment on the way.

But during the summer Boro' received shock news that Manager David Howell had decided to resign his position, taking with him his Assistant, Ken Charlery, and the other members of his Management Team. This meant a hard summer for the Boro' Board and for new manager Dave Anderson who returned to the Club he had served previously as Reserve Team Manager and then Assistant Manager on three separate occasions.

The summer of 2013 saw Assistant Manager Jason Goodliffe depart to take up a similar position at Football League Division 1 side Stevenage with Mark Faulkner replacing him on the Management Team.

A disastrous run of form however saw Dave Anderson and Mark Faulkner leaving the Club towards the end of January 2015 with Steve Baker formerly of Chipstead FC taking over at the helm.

The 2016-17 season began on a high note for Boro' and a tremendous run in The FA Cup saw the side reach the 1st Round Proper of the competition and an away draw against League 1 side Northampton Town. A 6-0 reverse saw the end of that adventure for another season.

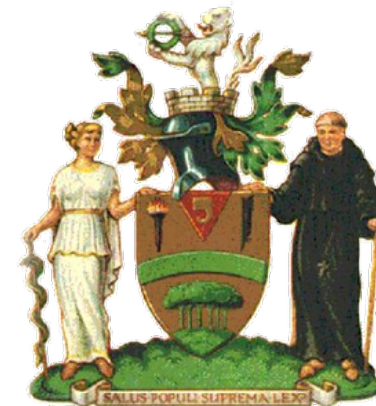
Unfortunately a run of poor results during late March and April saw the Club finish in a relegation position only for the plight of Worcester City to see Boro' relieved for a

second time in 11 years.

The 2017-18 season started brightly enough and Boro' topped the league briefly but a period of struggle followed, lasting into early January. Following a series of internal meetings changes were made to the playing squad and this led to a significant improvement in performances and an eventual 12th position in the League Table.

The summer of 2018 also saw everyone at Harrow take great pride in the selection of our former goalkeeper Nick Pope to the England World Cup squad. When he made his England debut against Costa Rica he became the first ex-Harrow player to win a full international cap for England.

Then came the announcement all at The Rogers Family Stadium had feared for some little while – as part of the restructuring of The Non League Pyramid Boro' were to be transferred to the Southern Football League along with Hendon, Metropolitan Police, Staines Town and newly promoted Walton Casuals. The Club and its supporters decided to embrace this change in a very positive manner and an enjoyable season followed with Boro' finishing in 7th position.

Joined Boro' on loan in September from Slough Town. During a long career he has also played for Notts County, Millwall, Concord Rangers, Bowers United, Leyton, Yeading, Maidenhead United, Woking, Weston-Super-Mare, Havant & Waterlooville, Basingstoke Town & Hungerford.

STEVE BAKER: MANAGER

Joined Boro' in January from Ryman South side Chipstead for whom he had been 1st Team Manager since 2013. He replaced Dave Anderson in the hot seat at Earlsmead. During an illustrious playing career he carved out a big reputation with Hayes, Yeading, Hendon and Egham Town before becoming player coach with Chertsey Town. He had begun his coaching career working for franchise soccer schools in conjunction with Arsenal and Chelsea and continued to develop them as 1st Team Coach at St Albans City. After 2 years as manager at Egham Town he continued to hone his coaching skills with Beaconsfield Sycob and Wingate & Finchley before moving back into management with Walton & Hersham in 2013. His stay at Stompond Lane was short lived before he moved on to Chipstead.

Boro are cup kings

Harrow Borough 2
Wealdstone 0

THE fire and commitment that has been the hallmark of Borough's tremendous season saw them deservedly capture the Middlesex Senior Cup at Hillingdon Boro FC.

The 2-0 win on Easter Monday at Leas Stadium is Borough's first success in a major competition in the club's 50-year history (writes Ron Smithson).

And what makes it doubly satisfying for Boro is that the vanquished opponents were Wealdstone, currently enjoying their best season — but on Monday with no answer to the Isthmian side's width of attack and sheer tenacity.

Boro manager Mike Tomkys brought Derek Harris and Harry Manoe into the defence to fill the gaps left by Dave Howell and Clevere Forde, who did not play after the sad death of Micky Howell on Saturday. For their part Wealdstone were missing

Neil Cordice following Saturday's injury at Maidstone.

Fine block

The match, understandably never a classic, took a long while to get going, and it was Wealdstone who got off to a flier. Consecutive corners in the opening two minutes tested Boro's mettle, and only a fine block by Currell at the feet of 'Stones top scorer, Mark Graves, denied the Alliance title hopes an early lead.

But even in the early stages Borough's Derek Doyle was beginning to put his stamp on midfield, and one early cross only just missed Emmanued in the box. Both defences looked shaky and one back pass by Metz almost let in Graves after 18 minutes, but Currell was there to avert the danger.

However when Wealdstone made their first serious defensive blunder they were made to pay and pay in full. Wealdstone know probably more than anyone that one player you don't give half

chances to is George Duck. Yet Steve Perkins took a chance on a suicidal back pass when a Boro attack had seemingly broken down, and Duck was on it in a flash to send a magnificent chip over the committed Goddard and into the net.

'Stones came forward in search of the equaliser; and Metz was caught napping on the halfway line Alan Cordice broke away clear down the middle. But with only Currell to beat Cordice seemed to freeze, and the Boro 'keeper brought off a superb block to his right.

The miss was to prove virtually 'Stones last chance of the match as Borough assumed complete control. And in Steve Jones Boro have a player who not only can be a joy to watch, but wins matches as well.

Last autumn his career in soccer was in jeopardy following a bad knee injury, and even now the son of ex-Spurs star Cliff Jones is nothing like fully fit.

But even a half-fit Jones is a menace to any defence and on the half-hour he turned in a brilliant solo effort to put the game beyond Wealdstone's recall. When Byatt allowed Jones a second chance in the box, the flying winger rounded Goddard, waited for a gap to appear on the far side and unleashed a spectacular left-foot shot which rocketed inside the right-hand post.

Half-time arrived with Boro still two up, but if the expectations were of a Wealdstone blitz on Currell's goal in the second half, they were soon dispelled.

With Harry Manoe, stepping into Dave Howell's shoes at centre half, playing out of his skin and Derek Harris letting nobody down in his first senior game in two months, Wealdstone hardly had a look in.

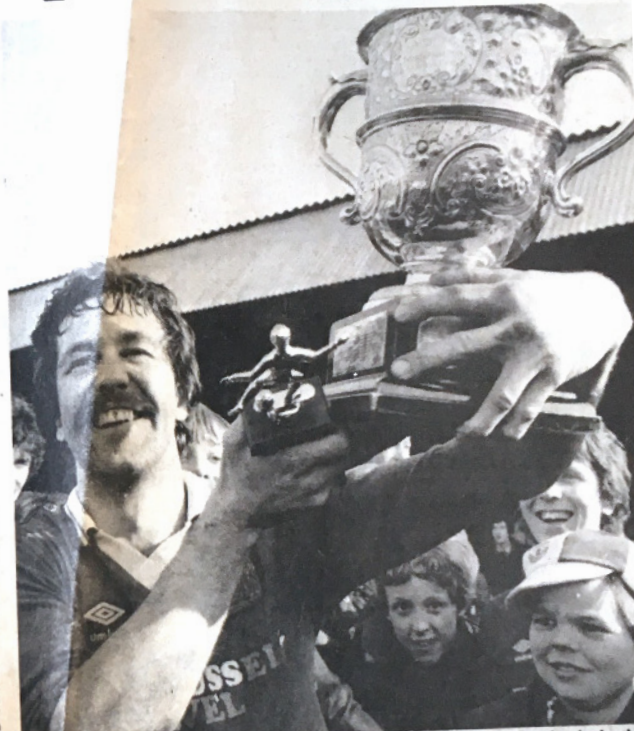
'Stones boss Allen Bataford made an early second-half substitution of Wainwright for Johnson but all to no avail.

All the best work came from Borough, and they could have had a third before the end via a blistering shot from another couple needed to curl it far post.

For Borough's players and supporters there can only be delight at a very special win. But as the players celebrated afterwards and turned one eye towards Wembley it is poignant to remember the words of Boro 'keeper Les Currell afterwards.

He said simply: "We were playing for David and Clevere today. We wanted to win it badly for them."

Silent prayers for Micky

THE minute's silence before the start of the Middlesex Senior Cup final was a sombre reminder of the tragic death of Micky Howell at Harrow Borough on Saturday.

To the credit of both sets of supporters, the silent prayer for the 23-year-old Hayes player was rigidly respected writes Paul Jacques.

Indeed, with the players standing heads bowed around the centre circle at Hillingdon Borough's Leas Stadium, it was an eerie curtain raiser to what should have been a party day for both Harrow Borough and Wealdstone.

The Boro players wore black arm bands to show their respect for the dead brother of their centre half David Howell. David, and cousin Clevere Forde, two of Boro's most outstanding players this season, were both too upset to play in the final.

The Middlesex County FA showed their compassion by deciding to have two extra winners' trophies made up for the missing pair.

It was arguable whether the game should have gone ahead under the circumstances, but Boro manager Mick Tomkys had no doubts.

"It was something that was discussed, but for me there was no question of calling it off," said Tomkys.

"In all my time in football I've never seen a player die. Some of my players were really down. I was as gutted as the rest of them, but it's my job to lift them up again."

Boro skipper Mick Garrin said the team all met for a chat at the club to raise spirits before leaving for Hillingdon Borough.

"David and Clevere both wanted us to go out and win it for them," said Garrin.

Tomkys was delighted by the way the players responded. "There was only one team in it and I was very disappointed with Wealdstone. They only know how to play one way, and when that doesn't work there's nothing else they can call on."

"Wealdstone managed only two chances, from Alan Cordice and a Stuart Pearce free kick."

1983 and our arch rivals win Middx Cup on a day of mixed emotions

Easter Monday 1983, Middlesex Senior Cup Final: Harrow Boro 2 Wealdstone 0 (played at Hillingdon Borough FC)

This was a rather surreal afternoon at the Leas Stadium, home of Hillingdon Borough. The party atmosphere generated by the Stones' fabulous 3-0 win at Conference title rivals Maidstone just two days earlier had dissipated when news came through that Hayes FC player Mickey Howell had died after suffering a head injury in their clash with Harrow Borough that same afternoon.

And in a horrific twist, Mickey Howell had been playing against his brother David, the Boro centre-back, and his cousin, Boro winger Clevere Forde.

Understandably, both David Howell and Forde elected not to play in the County Cup final on the Monday afternoon. And most neutrals at the Leas Stadium must have been

rooting for the players in mourning.

But Borough were worthy winners on the day - as the Harrow Observer reports (left) the Stones looked lacklustre in the face of a determined, supremely organised Boro side and nobody begrudged them the joy of lifting their first-ever Senior trophy in the club's then-50 years existence.

Stones were on their way to finishing third in the Gola-League (as the Conference National was then called), the club's highest-ever placing in its history. To be honest, losing this County Cup Final, and the one against Hayes the previous season didn't seem that important at the time. We beat Enfield in 1985 but the 35-year wait to lift the Middlesex Senior Cup since then has become a bit of a source of amusement among our local rivals. Perhaps this year...?
