On the Crest of a Wave

Since last writing these notes, we have had two splendid wins, scoring six goals in the process and conceding one, and we go into this F.A. Cup encounter with an unbeaten Southern League record of three wins. Including the pre-season pratice games, we have won seven out of eight matches, and the way we trounced Bletchley 4—1 on Tuesday in the League Cup return leg was a revelation. Nine goals in the last three matches, and only two against can't be bad and morale is sky-high. It is not misplaced, either, judging from the skill shown on Tuesday and if we can reproduce the same form today, you are in for a treat.

The Cup, of course, is a great leveller, which is why the F.A. Cup has such enormous magnetism and motivates most players just that little bit extra. We are delighted to entertain for the first time Marlow Town today, and we hope they enjoy our hospitality—off the field, needless to say . . . Marlow had a grand time last season, winning promotion to Division I of the Athenian League. Last Saturday they opened their League programme with a fine 2-0 win at Herne Bay, but on Monday were held to a goalless draw at home by Edmonton. On paper, we should already be looking to our visit to Chesham Utd. in the next round in a fortnight's time, but the saga of Boreham Wood is still too seared in the memory to make rash forecasts!

Manager Sid Prosser was not selecting his team until shortly before the kick-off, and with a pool of 16 to choose from, if I have guessed wrongly on the team page, apologies. John McCormick and Bill Byrne missed Tuesday's match through injury (Bill fell downstairs and strained his shoulder. his shoulder — that's his story anyway . . .) but we are hopeful they will be fit. As befits a top scorer, George Duck has taken a lot of stick lately, and although not missing a match, has a sore knee, which we trust has cleared up. Incidentally, George is certainly proving a deadly penalty

We have no mid-week match next week, and next Saturday are away yet again in the League to Canterbury City, who have also made an excellent start. One thing that has delighted us is the wonderful support we have had at away matches, resulting in Bletchley's biggest gate so far on Tuesday. So we hope for another big contingent in Kent next week.

The next home game at Lower Mead Stadium should be a humdinger. We entertain Barnet in the London Challenge Cup, 7.30 p.m., on Monday week, September 10th. Having beaten them 3-1 a few weeks ago, this one is for real, for the winners go to White Hart Lane to meet 'Spurs.
