The First Hurdle Cleared

It is with particular pleasure that we welcome the Directors, Players and Supporters of Premier Division Wimbledon to Lower Mead Stadium tonight to renew friendships made in our old Isthmian League days. Wimbledon are a very progressive outfit, commendably well organised, and are certainly a power in the Premier Division. Like Barnet, whom we beat in the first round, they too are a good footballing side, and this is the sort of opposition we like, so we should all see an excellent game.

We had an easy passage in the first round of the F.A. Challenge Trophy here on Saturday, and without being disrespectful, Hatfield Town were usually outclassed and we could have had more than the four goals scored by George Duck, John Henderson, Paul Fairclough, and an own goal. Good to see Henderson finding the target though, which crowned one of his best performances so far. We sympathise with the massed crowd behind the goal when their hero George missed that penalty! Even George has to miss one now and again, and as we were well in the lead at the time it was hardly a catastrophe.

Most people who saw the match will agree that Alan Saunders, the No. 7 for Hatfield, was easily their best player, and our manager Sid Prosser was quick to make an official approach with the result that Alan (an amateur) will play for us in mid-week games. This is really good news, for what danger Hatfield threatened usually came from Saunders.

Bill Byrne has now recovered from 'flu, and was having special training here on Sunday and yesterday afternoon with the result that he will be leading the attack tonight. Ray Fulton is now fit, but having been out of action for nearly a month will not be risked tonight. He will make his return in the next Mid Surrey Floodlight League game—almost certainly at midfield. Eric Burgess got another knock on Saturday, and if he is unfit, Jim Godfrey will step in. Otherwise tonight's team will be the same as on Saturday, except for Byrne taking Brown's place, Alick being 12th man

Don't forget that we are at home again on Saturday (3 p.m.) when our visitors will be Bath City in a League match. As the Somerset side are bottom of the table, we shall certainly look to strengthening our very sound position. Whichever way you look at it, out league standing is highly encouraging, to say the least.
