We've Got Wimbledon Once More!

We safely survived the final qualifying hurdle in the F.A. Challenge Trophy against Boston on Wednesday, and go forward to the first round proper in which, of all things, we meet Wimbledon yet again! Wimbledon have home advantage, but as we have outplayed them three times this season, we should not be downhearted.

It was good to see George Duck getting his scoring touch back against Boston, and with four goals (including two penalties) he certainly went to town. Bill Byrne got our other two, and as we outplayed our Midland League visitors in the second half, fully justified our 6-1 victory. It was, by the way, the highest win since we turned professional. The score at half-time was 2-1 and in the absence again of the Harrow Observer, we feel it of interest to give our team, which was: Mackenzie, Presland, Watson, Burgess, McCormick, Kinnear, Fairclough, Dyson, Duck, Byrne, Henderson, with Brown as sub. We didn't shine in the first half, but came good in the second, and Mackenzie had an easy afternoon. Ray Fulton, incidentally, was not available.

As we expected, of course, a 2 p.m. kick-off in midweek was disastrous to the gate, and it must be apparent to everyone now that football clubs, whether large or small, are facing a grave crisis during the national emergency. Last Saturday's postponement possibly cost us around £200, and there is no immediate end in sight to the game's problems. We are hoping for a good gate for today's attractive match against Waterlooville and indeed, at every home match during the next few weeks, when we have a very interesting programme. What we need, of course, is a real bumper gate on Boxing Day (2.15) when we entertain Gravesend and Northfleet who are making a strong bid for promotion.

Indeed, the next few weeks will be vital for us, and by the end of this month, or at least early in January, we shall have a good indication of our future prospects.

We cordially welcome everyone from Waterlooville, and congratulate them on a splendid season so far. After topping the table for much of the time, they have now been displaced, but are still handily placed, and will provide stern opposition today. Last time we met them (in the Challenge Trophy last season) we won 1-0, so hope for a double today, and the two points which will be of tremendous importance.

At the time of writing, our team today was not selected but is not expected to show a lot of change. Jim Godfrey has been out of action with a burst blood vessel in his right ankle, and is unlikely to be fit for selection today.
