Constant craving move from Boro

UNSETTLED striker Jonathan Constant has told manager David Howell he wants out of Harrow Borough Football Club.

The 20-year-old, who scored Harrow's consolation goal in the 3-1 visit from Canvey Island on Saturday, met with the Boro boss earlier this week to say he no longer wanted to be a part of the Ryman Premier

"I had a meeting with him last night [Monday] and he wants to leave. He said he didn't want to play anymore," said Howell. The product of Boro's youth policy shot

to prominence with a hat-trick as a substitute against Folkestone Invicta during the 2005/6 season, but his promising career was put on hold after a traffic accident.

"I found him at 15 or 16 and he had all the clubs courting him, but he broke his leg and that set him back. But he is back on track and is frustrated it's not happening quickly enough," said Howell.

Constant has scored four goals in the last four games and witnessed the likes of Robin Shroot – who moved to Birmingham City – make the transition to professional football.

Howell said: "He has seen Shroot and the others leave and all sign professional contracts and feels he should be doing the

"He is a complicated lad and doesn't look at the reasons he hasn't. He looks through rose-tinted glasses." Where Constant will end up, however,

the Boro boss was unable to say.
"I have no idea. I know where he thinks

he should go, but where he is going to, I have no idea. But if he doesn't realise the opportunity he has here then he's no good to have around.

No clubs have come in for Constant and Howell has not ruled him out of playing in Saturday's clash against Boreham Wood.

"I have his registration and if he wants to go anywhere they will have to contact me. But I never say never and he could have a change of heart, which he has done

"But at the moment he doesn't want to

play for Harrow Borough Football Club."

Constant is not the only player that looks to be heading for the exit. Howell has confirmed he intends to release Ebenezer Massade and Tommy Higgins as he trims the squad to one ready for what could be a relegation dog fight.

He said: "It has got to the point where I

am looking for players that are committed and realise the seriousness of the situation they are in and want to face that and help us. If not, it's a waste of their time and my time and everyone else's time.
