## Stones blown off track by Billericay

WEALDSTONE's Ryman Premier promotion hopes were derailed after a 2-1 home defeat to Billericay on Tuesday

The Stones led 1-0 at half-time but they came unstuck after the break in dreadful weather conditions Grosvenor Vale.

Manager Gordon Bartlett said: "We gave away two very poor goals and it was extremely disappointing.

"They were difficult conditions to get it down and play the ball about. But we came out second and wanted to build on our display on Saturday when we were excellent in the second half.

"It was frustrating. The conditions were horrendous with gale force winds. We were 1-0 up and the wind was in our favour but we didn't score enough

Wealdstone made the most of the wet and windy surface early on and opened the scoring through Kieron Forbes. The former Watford youngster ran onto a loose ball and rifled a shot past goalkeeper Tony Tucker.

The home side survived a scare later in the half when Carl Martin was forced to head off the goalline.

But the Stones were guilty of several big misses which were to prove costly. Danny Spendlove fired wide when well placed and Ryan Ashe was also off target after a fine run from Forbes.

The visitors sensed the match was changing and they equalised when Jamie Dormer planted a shot past Sean

The winning goal sparked protests by the home side amid claims Dave Wareham was offside. The Stones tried to salvage a late equaliser but they were unable to find another goal.

HARROW BOROUGH face a crucial game in their hopes of Ryman League survival when they host Hendon on Saturday.

Boro earned a valuable 2-2 draw at highflying Sutton United on the weekend but all eves are turning towards the relegation sixpointer at Earlsmead this weekend. Hendon and Boro sit side by side in the table – but manager David Howell has played

down the significance of the contest.

Howell said: "Like I've been saying all along, it's only three points. I'm not trying to understate it but if we lose we could stay up. We could win and still go down.'

Boro will go into the clash without a number of key players after they were injured at Sutton. Skipper Wayne Walters has a hamstring problem and Dorian Smith has a calf strain. They could also be without defender Simon Dahl who is suffering from flu.

Boro rescued a point at Sutton after an 87th minute equaliser from Daniel McGonigle. The attacker headed home to give the visitors a deserved draw.

Boro took the lead after a cross-shot by Dewayne Clarke. But they were stunned by two quick goals from United which gave them the half-time advantage.

Howell was pleased with his side's display and felt they were well worthy of the draw. He said: "The bottom line is a point,

despite scoring so late, was the least we deserved from the game. They're a very strong side but we created plenty of chances. If anything, I think we could have taken the three points.

"We started very well but they had a lot of chances later on in the first half. Andray Baptiste made some unbelievable saves but also misjudged their first goal.

"It was one of those days for him after he turned up at the wrong ground. He only got here at 2.35pm."
