Bartlett: This is the best group I've had

"A BRIDGE too far" was how Gordon Bartlett described Wealdstone's failed push to make it to the play-offs before hailing his squad as the "best" he has ever worked with.

The Ryman Premier side were in contention to book their play-off place with two weeks of the season remaining, until they lost 3-1 to runaway champions

Greg Ngoyi's tenth goal in just 15 appearances, against Hastings United on Saturday, sealed a 1-0 victory for Bartlett's young side, which finished just five points outside the play-offs in seventh.

Bartlett said: "We aimed for a top-half finish, which

we achieved comfortably in the end.

"I just wanted to finish as high as we can, but it was a bridge too far in the end. To have that opportunity with two games to go is testament to how well they have

done.
"The spirit in the camp is tremendous. I have said it before that this is the best group I have worked with at the club and hope to keep them together next season.

To that end, the Stones have launched a scheme called 100:400, aimed at raising £40,000 towards the playing budget by getting 100 fans to invest £400, with cash prizes on offer.

Bartlett said after just a matter of weeks the club was nearing the target it hopes to reach by the club's presen-


tation evening, on Saturday, May 9.

Story of our season'

DAVID HOWELL's hopes of a top-ten Ryman Premier finish were ended with a 1-0 defeat at Horsham, which the Harrow Borough boss said typified the season.

"If we had won there we would have

done it, but we didn't, and that is the story of our season," he said, adding that the 12 drawn games had more to do with the 14th place attained by Boro in a season that at one point had them facing the prospect of relegation.

Howell said: "There was a good half of the drawn games we should have won and that would take us near the play-offs. I am sure other managers will be saying the same thing, but we were one of the favourites to be relegated. The point being we have progressed, but really should have finished in the top ten."
Horsham's Darren Budd ended Howell's

ambition for his side this season with a

59th minute strike on Saturday. However, Howell says the club should be in a stronger position next season, with improved finances, than at the start of the last term.

He said: "I am hoping I will be able to get players in early, whereas before I didn't know what the budget was and that should make a difference.

Despite the improved finances, Howell admitted the club was still not in the market to chase the big names.

"When players get turned down by one or two clubs we can make them an offer. We are not going to go straight in there for them," he said.

'We are looking to give any young players the opportunity, particularly local players, to have a trial in the summer and look to see if they have got what it takes to be a non-league footballer and maybe one day a professional footballer.
