Borough started Monday night's game in the worst possible fashion but recovered to go into the break level at 3-3, thanks to goals from Dean Fenton and a double from James Fraser.

Then second-half strikes from Dewayne Clarke and Charlie Wassmer handed Harrow their first league win of the season to move them up to fifth in the Ryman Premier Division table, after drawing the opening-day game against Canvey Island on Saturday 0-0.

"I am pleased with the result, especially considering we conceded a goal in the first ten seconds," Howell said.

"We were 3-2 up within the first 14 minutes and I couldn't wait to get them in at half time to re-group and sort our shape out.

"The first half was like when a boxer takes a whack early on in a fight, gets a bloody nose and then just keeps slugging it out, so I wanted to get my defence sorted out at half time.'

Harrow finished 14th last season and Howell is hoping for a better campaign this year, although he refuses to discuss the possibility of targeting promotion.

The manager said: "I am excited by the squad I have together this year. We had a pretty decent season last year and I think the squad we have this year is a stronger squad and if we can keep together, stay injury free and remain competitive then it should be a good season.

He added: "I am not talking promotion, play-offs or relegation. At the moment we are just going to let our football do the talking. My aim is to do our talking on the pitch."

On Saturday, Harrow travel to Horsham and Howell is expecting

another tough fixture.

He said: "We played them in the last game of the season and lost 1-0 and they seem to have had a decent start this time around.

"One thing you can be sure of with Horsham is that they will be a good passing side. But I am confident, as I am going into all of our games."
