Stones boss keen to avoid complacency

WEALDSTONE manager Gordon Bartlett is refusing to get carried away despite his side posting their fourth consecutive win after a 4-2 FA Cup victory at Boreham Wood on Saturday.

The Stones are in excellent form and booked a home tie against Blue Square South strugglers Lewes after their emphatic victory at Meadow Park. Wealdstone sit third in the Ryman Premier and can leapfrog second placed Canvey Island with a home win on Saturday.

Bartlett said: "We have set standards and we musn't get complacent. We are on a good run at the moment but we know there are 42 games in the league season and you cannot win the league at this stage.

"All we are looking for is a degree of consistency and at the moment we have got it. It would be nice to get points on the board in the league particularly if we go on a cup run, because we will fall behind in the amount of matches we play.

The Stones enjoyed a whirlwind start to the cup tie on Saturday as they stormed into a 2-0 lead inside the opening ten minutes. Kieron Forbes created the first goal for Ryan Ashe to slot underneath the goalkeeper and within minutes stand-in skipper Lee Chappell stroked the ball into the net.


The visitors added the third before half-time when Chappell struck a brilliant free-kick into the top left

Boreham Wood pulled one back after the restart but the buoyant Stones struck the fourth when Alan Massey converted Ashe's corner.

again I thought the work rate in the group was good. 'The nice thing is that we have a home draw in the next round which puts it in our own hands.'

Middlesex set for move to Radlett

The county side will act as tenants sharing costs and helping raise development funding at Cobden Hill.

Radlett and Middlesex all-rounder Gareth Berg, who enjoyed a tremendous end to the season, said: "It's great for the Radlett crowd and committee. They have worked very hard with the second team fixtures and it shows all the hard work over the years with the hospitality there has paid off. They have reaped the rewards.

"It's a lovely ground and I'm pleased they've shown they've got the goods. I have no doubt Radlett will be a success whether it hosts a first class or one-day match. They definitely have the capability to hold matches there and the right people on board.

Middlesex chief executive Vinny Codrington said: "The set-up at Radlett is excellent. It's a 'real' cricket club. As you drive in, everything about the place is cricket."
