Barker in shape of his life ahead of battle of Britain

DARREN BARKER says he is in the best shape of his life ahead of Saturday's British middleweight title fight against Wayne Floock

The 27-year-old Barnet boxer puts his Commonwealth title on the line at the Brentwood Centre in Essex and is gunning for the vacant British belt. 'Dazzling' Darren has spent 14 weeks preparing for the contest since his last fight back in May when he stopped Darren McDermott in Watford.

Barker said: "It's been a long training camp and I can't wait to get in the ring on Saturday. I would say I'm in the best condition of my life. It's a combination of fitness and experience which has given me the total package now. I'm in the best shape of my life.

"Since I was a kid it's been a dream of mine [British title]. It's always been a goal of mine and it's one I definitely want to win. It's had great champions in the past and I want to be one of them."

Barker, unbeaten in 20 fights, was set to challenge previous champion Matthew Macklin but it fell through after the fighter, who defeated Elcock, went on to win the European belt.

The avid Chelsea fan said: "We were looking at a September fight and the Macklin fight had been sanctioned by the board. I was gutted when it fell through because he was the British champion and whoever won would have been seen as the out and out number one. I have one eye on the future and I don't blame him but hopefully we can get it on some time soon."

Barker admits 'Mad Dog' Elcock will be a dangerous proposition for him because the veteran fighter has nothing to lose as he looks to end his career with a notable scalp.

"I've got a lot of respect for him," Barker added. "He has

"I've got a lot of respect for him," Barker added. "He has fought for world titles and will be dangerous. He is 35 so he will give it his all. If he loses, it's the end of the road so it will be a tough fight because he has nothing to lose."

Barker, who has 13 knockouts to his name, has always insisted he is good enough to win a world title and believes a win on Saturday can thrust him into contention.

He said: "I don't want to lose focus on this fight but I've got one eye on my future. I definitely want world titles and I want to be taking on the champions after this. I know I can become a world champion and I've just got to be patient."
