'Promising' signs from new boy Gibson in win

WEALDSTONE boss Gordon Bartlett has praised Watford youngster Billy Gibson after his "promising" debut against Horsham on Tuesday.

The Stones secured the winger on a month's loan as the 19-year-old attempts to gain first-team senior football and match fitness

Gibson made his first-team debut for Watford in August 2008 in the Carling Cup victory over Bristol Rovers but has not featured since.

He follows in the footsteps of John-Joe O'Toole and Theo Robinson, who both have had successful spells at the Ryman Premier side and went on to play league football.

Gibson played most of the 2-1 victory before being replaced by on-loan Colchester United midfielder Sam Corcoran.

Bartlett said: "Billy was decent going forward. It is not an experience any of us have witnessed before, going behind after 14 seconds, but Billy did well. He picked up the ball and had a go at people. He has a lot of pace and a few tricks up his sleeve to go with it. It was a promising debut.

Wealdstone had a shocking start to the match as Pat Harding gave Horsham the lead in the opening 30 seconds but goals from Ryan Ashe either side of half-time secured Stones' third win on the bounce.

Bartlett's men are now fifth in the Ryman Premier but are only four points off second place and have at least two games in hand on all of the
